uta Bryant would not have been amused. Nick Kelley, 16, was explaining why he wanted to be with an older man, an adult. "He had so much to offer, and what really bothered me was the fact that someone was actually concerned about the fact that I had been in his car, and that someone somewhere would not like it." The event was the first ever semi-public Zathenng in North America of men who are involved in relationships with male youngsters, of the boys themselves, as well as of assorted other "professionals" in some way connected with the issue of man-boy love. 150 people turned up for the invitation-only conference, held at Boston's Community Church December 2, 1978, for a day-long senses of appalar lifectives associated and applications.

The overwhelming turnout exceeded the expectation of conference organizer Tom Reeves, who had only expected several dotten people. Reeves, a political science professor at Roybury College, is spokesperson of the BostoryBoste Committee, formed last year after the Indictments of two dotten men in the so-called Revre cases. The men were charged with separate violations of the law for illegal sexual acts with (mostly teenage) minors.

Ehe mage of views expressed by the panellists and conferces were, by and large, generally supportive of man-boy relationships. Different people from different backgrounds and careers appeared to agree that the legal problems faced by the men arrested in such cases were appalling, and that the punishment was worse than the offme. (In Massachusetts, one could be committed for life as a sexually dangerous arrests).

The audience heard one of the Revero defendants, Ed Mede, describe The audience heard one of the Revere defendants. Ed Mede, describe himself as a "hormosexual Buddhist" stoically facing a possible life sentence for trixual acts with a teenager. The teenager had embraced Mede at an earlier Boston/Boise meeting, but later turned states witness, as a result, Mede's supporters have argued, of pressure from the police. If Mede was philosophical about his fate, so was Keiley, who inted to

explain the opposition to his relationship with an adult. If guess the

explain the opposition to his relationship with an adult. "I guess the problem is that parents want very much to protect their children, and I really don't think that protection is necessary." That brought laughter from the audience. Kelley continued. "It's not—kids basically know what they're doing, they know what they want and they are not that easily marpulated as people would like us to think they are."

McDougail said he "was never seduced by any man," Instead, "It was kind of fun to go to the Combat Zone and make a few dollars by sitting in a move theater and getting your cock suckert, it's ready a good way to make a few bucks."

McDougall was one of many speakers to lash out at the Judeo-Clinstian featition of treating sex outside procreation as bad. Feilow Fag Rag water Chaille Shorely, who had burned a bible at a recent gay pride mily, argued that gay people are "engaged in sex for pleasure, not proceeding." Sex is fun, he said, and "doesn't lead to diseases, not even stan cancer."

Bedis volced their snoosement of love between man and boy. Canon Canion Jones, paster of Christ Church Cathedral, Hariford, Connecticut, described a Roman Catholic priest who was a fittend of his, and who was a beautiful person because he was loved by a man as a boy. The expressed concern for men who are arrested for child-molesting: They become marked men so often for the rest of their lives, and that I think is a temple improvision of society. Almost to a man they are feachers and boy scoul leaders and boys' dubs leaders!" he shouled, pounding the podium with both hands.
