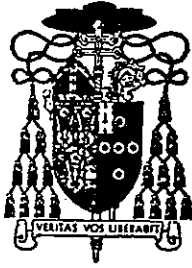
My dear Monsignor McGucken:







"I . . . firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment wherewith every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who—far worse still—admit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

is, has been, and ever will be in the succession of the Episcopate from the Apostles; not in such a way that what seems best and most fitting according to the refinement of each age may be held, but that the absolute and unchangeable truth preached from the beginning by the Apostles may never in any different wise be believed, never in any different wise be understood.

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.



Dear Father Booth:

Please let me know by return mail if you could do an important chore for us during your Christmas holidays.

While in Fatima last April we ordered from the Reverend Director of the Retreat House a replica statue of the Pilgrim Virgin to be made of wood and precisely like the statue that you saw here on the two visits of the Pilgrim Virgin. We are anxious to get this statue.

One letter after another, written both by Father Daniels and myself, to the Secretary or the Reverend Father in charge of these matters fails to bring any answer. It would seem that they just don't answer mail. You know the type.

Could you go to Fatima by airplane from Rome, get this statue and bring it back with you to Rome for the Holy Father's blessing? You could then determine what would be the cost to send it by air or by boat to St. Joseph's Cathedral in San Diego where it will be enshrined on a special altar to be built for that purpose. We did not pay for the statue. The Reverend Director at the time informed me that he had an order from our Father O'Duignan at Lake Arrowhead for a marble statue of Our Lady of Fatima. We will be quite content with a wooden statue. My recollection is that this particular statue is not more than approximately 42" in height. We do not wish any cornea. You can get an appropriate rosary in Rome and have it blessed by the Holy Father. If this letter goes by air, we should have your answer back in a week in time to send you a check for your expenses. Please investigate what the trip by plane would cost you; also let us know whether or not you have any objections to travel by airplane.

Your letter of December 13, 1949 arrived this morning -- quick service. Many thanks. Inclosed, herewith, please find our check for \$300.00 -- \$195.10 of which covers your travel expenses from Rome to Fatima and return. The balance you may apply for hotel service. You will also find inclosed another check for \$100.00 which should more than cover the cost of the statue. As indicated in my first letter, we prefer a simple wooden statue -- an exact replica of the Pilgrim Virgin that was brought here. The Director of the Retreat House there, who persistently refuses to answer any type of mail, will probably not be much help.

If you cannot procure the statue in Fatima, you will surely be able to get it in Lisbon. In such event, take it to the Cardinal Archbishop's Palace and ask his Secretary to petition the Cardinal Archbishop to bless the statue for us.

Then take it with you to Rome FOR the Holy Father's blessing and also you may have the opportunity to touch it to the tombs of the Saints and Martyrs. We do not wish any crown on the statue. It will probably be prohibitive to send it by airmail, so you can arrange to ship it from Rome by boat with the proper insurance on it. It might be possible for you to make a deal through the Pan American Airways who are disposed to be cooperative toward the Church on account of the Holy Year and you might get them to frank it through for the advertising value.

It is also possible that you might find some good fervent Catholic in Rome leaving for the States who could get this statue through the Customs Office in New York. Under the new law, \$400.00 worth of merchandise can be brought in duty free. Formerly it was \$100.00.

If you ship the statue direct from Rome, address it to St. Joseph's Cathedral, San Diego as a donation from me to the Cathedral. In a word, we want to get the statue here without any further delay. So don't return from Lisbon with just promises -- bring a statue with you. I know you will expedite this matter judiciously. If you should succeed in getting the statue we want in Fatima, please place it at the little Shrine where the Blessed Virgin appeared to the children. If the Director of the Retreat House should be available, advise him to cancel the order sent by mail and indicate to him that his failure to answer mail caused us the expense of sending a personal representative to Fatima. He probably won't understand even after you have explained it to him in two languages.

This is to report to date on the Fatima Commission. The Statue was purchased in Fatima, placed on the spot where the Blessed Mother appeared and blessed. Then it was taken to Lisbon where the Cardinal Patriarch blessed it. As soon as I arrived back in Rome I arranged for an audience with the Pope for his blessing, but because of the numerous pilgrims in Rome, the earliest date I could obtain was January 18th, next Wednesday.

Possibly by this time Pan American has contacted you in re: either free transportation or half-price transportation. I discussed the matter with Miss Carlos, their San Diego Sales representative in Rome for the opening of the Holy Year, and she immediately wrote to the San Diego office trying to make the necessary arrangements. I am now awaiting their decision which should be here by the time the Pope's blessing is obtained. This and other means failing, I will ship it by boat and have firm hopes of having it in your hands by the end of Feb., at the very latest.

I wish to thank you most sincerely for your kindness to me in this commission and also for your very thoughtful Christmas remembrance. My continued prayers are for your welfare.

Today, Saturday, I received word from Pan-America here in Rome, that all negotiations for free transportation of the Statue have been completed. They are to take it Monday, hence it should arrive in San Diego only a few days after this letter.

It should be entered into the U.S. import tax free, since Miss Bertha Carlos, of Pan-America, had the kindness and foresight to declare it when she recently returned from Rome. The Statue is well packed and should arrive unharmed. To be sure that it will not be damaged while being unpacked, I'm sending some detailed instructions and information in this regard to Father Daniels.

The Statue was priced at \$155 but through the aid of Our Lady we were able to purchase it for \$100. The original that you ordered would've cost \$450. Actually the only difference in the two statues is in the name of the artist. That would have cost \$300 extra. Everyone in Fatima stated that ours was even better than the more expensive one, and those who have seen it in Rome think it is more exact and beautiful than any they have seen before. The expenses of packing, import and export tax, excess weight transportation, etc. came to about \$50 more than expected, but I would like to offer that extra as my donation to the furthering of devotion to Our Lady of Fatima.

Dear Father Booth:

We will indeed be grateful to have the benefit of your priestly ministrations for what looks like a possible three months. Before coming to a final decision, however, will you kindly check the possible cost of a trip by boat or plane to the United States and from New York to San Diego? You understand, of course, that with our limited resources we must watch the overhead.

Please read over the inclosed petition and note the difficulties that confront us in regard to the tenure of the Franciscan Fathers in Banning and Beaumont. The fact is that the majority of Franciscan priests are not trained for parish work. Last summer a committee of some fourteen parishioners, representing the rank and file of the Precious Blood Parish in Banning, made a trip to San Diego to petition that a diocesan priest replace the Franciscan Father who, although a good priest, "was too old to do anything". This group pointed out that the diocesan priests had built churches and schools all around them but their parish had made no progress within the last fifty years -- all of which is only too true.

Another angle that is of importance. The late Archbishop Cantwell obtained a Beneplacitum for the Franciscan Fathers to enjoy at Banning, Beaumont and other parishes because of their willingness at that time to accept the Indian Missions in this Diocese. Over a year ago, the Franciscan Fathers gave up the Indian Missions on the plea that their Fathers were needed in China.

During the thirteen years since this Diocese was erected, to my own personal knowledge, the Santa Barbara Province of the Franciscan Fathers has used this Diocese as a dumping ground for their moral, mental and physical problems. It became necessary for me some time ago to demand the withdrawal of one misfit after another. To be specific, in a more recent case, they sent a man whose health had broken in China -- Father Emmanuel -- and who had never had a parish in the United States before to take charge of the Precious Blood Parish in Banning. He has not only failed but he has caused a decided rift in the parish there as the people are all on edge through lack of experience, imprudence and sudden change of judgement regarding the purchase of property for the proposed school. The fact is that the parish has to be directed from this Chancery because the incumbent there is incompetent. Several weeks ago we requested the Provincial to remove him and to replace him with an experienced, competent pastor. The Very Reverend Provincial Augustine Hobrecht called here yesterday and requested more time because he had no priest available to send to Banning. In the meantime, religion suffers. Note copies of inclosed letters from two Franciscans who had parishes in this Diocese.

After studying the matter, will you kindly advise me regarding a Canonist in Rome who through experience and other qualities would be the best to represent me in petitioning the Congregation to set aside the Beneplacitum and restore the two parishes of Banning and Beaumont to the Diocese for the good of religion.

About two years ago the mission across the tracks for Mexicans in Beaumont was wrecked by an earthquake. Since that time we have been begging and pleading with the pastor in charge to assemble somekind of an outline for the rebuilding of the Mexican Mission; but we can't even get a response to our letters. I asked for the removal of the sick priest the Franciscans had sent to Beaumont and now it becomes necessary to request the removal of his successor. It is the same old story. The Franciscans simply do not have men trained for this work.

My first thought was if these matters could be presented to the present Franciscan General he might consider giving up the two parishes of Beaumont and Banning. They still have two other parishes -- one in San Diego and one in Fort Yuma. Both have been poorly staffed and have been spiritually dead for the past thirteen years to my personal knowledge. In Old Town, San Diego, we have tried to get the Franciscan Fathers to build a parochial school. During World War II they purchased a vast amount of land adjoining their property but got it tied up by lease for government property. If they had built a school when requested, it would have been paid for now. If you think it wise to request the San Diego parish, that could be included in our petition. It is indeed most regrettable that these parishes were given to the Franciscans because they are absolutely needed for our own Diocesan priests in view of the fact that the intense heat of Imperial Valley and the Coachella Valley requires a change after two or three years for the priests who serve in these difficult climes.

You surely get the picture and you can be a great help to us in collaborating with one of the leading Canonists in Rome to adjust this difficulty. If, after due consideration, the Very Reverend General declines to release the parishes under consideration, then you and the Canonist retained could complete a petition to the Congregation that handles these matters. It is possible that you will require more details before whipping the case into final shape for presentation.

Your Excellency:

With regards to possible transportation and costs from Rome to San Diego: reservations on ships are unavailable at the present time; by air the cost would be well around five hundred dollars (\$500), a sum out of proportion to the length of time of the vacation. However, as mentioned before free transportation is a possibility.

I have asked for free transportation on the AVA Air Line, many of whose officials are friends of mine. I have the promise of a ticket from Rome to Bermuda. Once in Bermuda, the remainder of the trip would cost about one hundred and eighty dollars (\$180). The official through whom I am working, although he hasn't as of this date actually given me the ticket, told me that I had his assurance of being able to reach Bermuda. He will try, but cannot make any promise of such a return offer, e.g. San Diego to Rome.

If Your Excellency deems it more advisable for me to remain in Europe during the summer, may I have permission to travel to some of the various holy spots and countries, if the occasion and funds present themselves. His Excellency, the Most Reverend Bishop Martin O'Connor advises us to seek that permission before the holidays begin because of the present conditions in Europe.

Dear Father Booth:

With reference to your esteemed inquiry of May 21, 1950, while there would be advantages to annexing your valuable help during three months of the summer, the expenditure of approximately one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars for the round trip is out of proportion to the time allotted and also out of proportion to our limited income. In a word, I just don't have that kind of money. If you can negotiate a round trip by way of Bermuda, that might not be too far off the line.

If, as you suggest, the funds are available, you have my cordial permission to visit shrines in Europe. However, my thinking is that, in view of the strenuous year just completed and also contemplating another strenuous year ahead of you, the best plan of all would be a berth in some villa outside of Rome where you could really relax and possibly do some collateral reading. You may find a villa or a parish that might welcome an assistant, especially if you could supply them with Mass intentions (which we would send) and if you could offer them, over and above, fifty dollars per month board and room, with the Italian exchange, that would be quite a bit of money coming in.

Or is it possible, at the present time, for you to get a private room and meals at some hotel in Tivoli or Frascati?

At any rate, look over the situation and let me know what you find.





The school year will come to a close at the end of June. If Your Excellency has any special plans for the four months of vacation, I will be most happy to comply.

At present, my chances for round-trip gratis air transportation are not completely clear. There may be a possibility, as last year, and again, there may be none. I am now working on the project.

A point I would like to have Your Excellency's kind advice on, is a commission as a reserve chaplain in the Army Air Corps. I have become somewhat well acquainted with the officials at the American Embassy Military Attaché offices in Rome and have been offered a reserve commission in the Air Corps. As I understand it, this reserve commission would not make me subject to call while being in a foreign country. Would it please Your Excellency if I would inquire further into the matter?

If it be your will that I remain in Europe during the summer and fall, until the opening of school, I will be pleased to remain here at the Casa in Rome. However, Your Excellency, I would have to ask a tremendous favor of you. My financial condition has become somewhat depleted, and knowing that our diocese is not a rich diocese I would not ask for any extra support from it. But the expenses of this summer and the coming year necessitate my asking for a loan. My mother and relatives have been supplying me with funds for the past two years, but it has become a burden on them which I do not feel is fair on my part. I would rather go in debt on an out and out loan, and pay the interest and principal to the diocese upon my return. If Your Excellency and the diocese would be willing to extend the loan, I would like to ask for one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Reverend and dear Father Booth:

On receipt of your letter dated May 12, 1951, I got in touch with the Pan American Airways to get the lowest figure on a round trip passage for you from Rome to San Diego and return.

Investigation shows that if you leave Rome before June 30 and return after September 1, you can take advantage of the winter rates. The normal summer rates run, including tax, \$1163.30. The winter rates which you could use amount to \$924.14 from Rome to San Diego. Of this amount \$232.90 represents the cost of air coach service from New York to San Diego and the tax is \$34.90, making a total of \$924.14.

Now please advise me if this plan would be agreeable because we are very short of priests here in the Diocese at the present time. Please also inform me what it would cost in money to keep you in Rome. My thinking is that the more practical plan, even for a Diocese hard-pressed financially, would be to invite you home for the four months of the summer vacation. If you are willing to work and I know you are, you could come near assembling sufficient funds.

Although the matter of a loan should go through the Consultors, please find herewith in response to your request a check for \$1,000.00 to gether with a note which we ask you to sign and return to this Chancery.

You will also find my personal check for \$10.00. Please try to find an oleographic or sepia picture of St. Mary Goretti, which we need for Goretti Hall at the seminary. Kindly mail it to me in a tube.

Regarding your last point, I must advise you against accepting a commission as a reserve chaplain in the Army Air Corps. Considering that this Diocese is already vast military camp and that practically all of our pastors are Auxiliary Chaplains, we need every single priest available. Moreover, we have done well by the Army and Navy in already releasing several priests for chaplains. If there should be a total mobilization, we will lose many of our key priests, who have served as chaplains before. So, you understand, we will do our very best, as is.

"I . . . firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment wherewith every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who—far worse still—admit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.

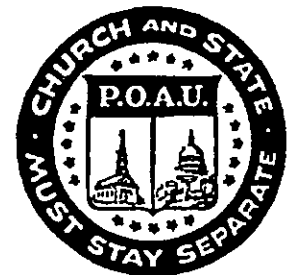

The "single and only purpose" for Americans United for Separation of Church and State "is to assure the maintenance of the American principle of separation of Church and State upon which the Federal Constitution guarantees liberty to all the people and all churches of this Republic."

That was the purpose of Americans United set forth in its Manifesto. It is still the purpose now. The dream of the leaders who founded Americans United in 1947 has found fulfillment in a nation-wide organization speaking with authority in the defense of religious freedom.

The purpose of Americans United is simple but the assaults it combats upon the principle of church-state separation are complex and multitudinous. It also has many friends sympathetic to its mission, but asleep

to the immediate peril.

The founders of our nation knew from personal suffering the penalties of political and clerical tyranny. They wrote protection into the Constitution and with the First Amendment prohibited any "establishment of religion." Thomas Jefferson originated the concept of a wall separating Church and State. Each was to be free in its purpose. There was to be no interlocking of managements.

Democracy was at its best in these United States for more than a century. Churches were free to win converts. Church revenues were the voluntary contributions of the faithful. There were no subsidies either direct for clergy salaries or church schools, or indirect for other church institutions or programs.

But the separation arrangement

in the United States did not suit one church long accustomed to official patronage. This church, too, was flourishing in membership and wealth to an extent unknown in the countries where it had won a preferred position in the state and inflicted disabilities upon other faiths. Yet it could not be content to be on a free and equal basis with others.

A Massive Attack

The Roman Catholic Church in 1948 made its program for America crystal clear. Four cardinals, five archbishops and five bishops signed a document declaring the church-state separation principle as the Supreme Court had enunciated it, a mere "shibboleth of doctrinaire secularism." This was the first shot in a war to win tax funds for churches, hospitals, parochial schools and

time to secure full tax support for a church.

Americans United accepted the challenge. It has thrown back one attack after another by this church and is just as quick to oppose more recent sorties by other churches. No general program directly aiding church schools has yet passed Congress.

Americans United is an educational organization, sounding the alarm before study groups at the grass-roots level in the hundred and more chartered chapters and local committees, in colleges and seminaries, in public forums. It has a team of speakers ready to go on invitation into churches and schools, before fraternal, civic and professional groups and other audiences.

Americans United is a fountain of factual material on church-state sep-

aration. It publishes CHURCH AND STATE, a monthly 16-page Review with a printing of 175,000. It produces a spate of timely pamphlets on various church-state problems, some of which have gone well beyond the million mark in distribution. The organization has copious files bulging with data relating to the separation of church and state. Its research facilities in the critical church-state area are justly famed.

A Time For Action

Americans United is also an action group, trying to maintain the separation wall on local, state and national levels. It sends representatives into the courts and before legislative committees. Its experts are frequent witnesses on Capitol Hill before Congressional committees. It is the major obstacle to demands for billions of dollars of public funds for parochial schools.

Americans United is quick to battle in the courts if political leaders bow to clerical pressure. It normally has a score or more cases in litigation. It initiates some of these in behalf of taxpayers. It enters others as a friend of the court.

Americans United is recognized as frequently speaking for the great majority of Protestants on church-state issues, but it has no formal authority to speak for any Protestant group. The unique relationship enables it to be the quick-moving, hard-hitting agency Protestantism has so long lacked. Most Protestant groups are represented in its Executive Committee and its Advisory Council. Several denominations support it directly with annual appropriations. They are glad for Americans United role, decisive and forthright in a way their own role cannot and perhaps should not be. Americans United

also speaks for millions of persons who have no formal religious faith but are devoted to the separation of church and state.

Where Americans United? The national headquarters are at 1633 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington 6, D. C., with regional offices in New York, Chicago and Los Angeles. There are 100 chapters and many committees throughout the nation.

Who Americans United? Members are enrolled through chartered chapters, through the headquarters office in Washington, D. C. and the regional offices. Anyone who believes in the American tradition in church and state and seeks to perpetuate it is invited to join. Glenn L. Archer, attorney, educator and Christian layman, has served as executive director since the founding of the organization. C. Stanley Lowell, a Protestant minister, is associate director and editor of CHURCH AND STATE. John J. Adams, an attorney, is an associate director and a member of the Americans United

legal staff. Gaston D. Cogdell, a Protestant minister, is director of organization.

The founders of Americans United included men who have served as the three top elected officials of the three largest Protestant denominations—Baptist, Methodist, Presbyterian—Dr. Louie D. Newton, Bishop of G. Bromley Oxnam, Dr. John A. Mackay. Dr. Newton continues his leadership as national president. Other founders were Dr. J. M. Dawson, executive director of the Baptist Joint Committee on Public Affairs, Dr. Clyde W. Taylor, Secretary of Public Affairs for the National Association of Evangelicals, Dr. Frank H. The Captive Climate

communities and small towns furnish the best ideal "climate" for captive schools. There is a strong cultural or religious bias; public officials are prone to think of such things in terms of furnishing a solid voting bloc; they pretend to be unaware that rights of a small minority are being violated.

Chicago, Illinois, for example, was settled by German Catholics around 1840. Tontitown, Missouri, is a community five miles from Springfield founded by Italian immigrants several years ago and remains a close-knit Italian Catholic community. In communities such as these the drift of a school from strictly public to church control may be hardly noticeable; it is only when new industry brings new workers or the cultural balance is upset in some way, that a captive school situation comes into attention of the general public.

A better idea of how these schools work, is the case of Fort Recovery, Ohio. The case attracted public attention when it was argued in April 1965. Americans United furnished counsel and a substantial portion of the cost of litigation of the case.

School offered more individual attention for the pupils.
At 11 o'clock each morning an hour of "released time" for Mass or religious instruction was scheduled in each of the three schools attended by the Catholic pupils, witnesses said. Testimony also showed that there was no "released time" for the students at the Protestant "public" school.

Schoolground Becomes Battleground

It is regrettable that a schoolground for our children must be turned into a battleground to win their rights as clearly set forth in the Constitution and laws of this country. It happens either because there is an honest difference of interpretation as to what the law provides or because there are those who will not willingly accept laws with which they do not agree. But if this country is to be governed by law instead of by the whims of men, captive schools must be set free. This is not always easy, especially in towns where the arrangement has existed for several years — even decades. Townspeople often resist change, even when it is to their benefit. Politicians with a solid "in" are loath to disturb the status quo. The religious (nuns, brothers, and priests) are reluctant to surrender their opportunities for indoctrination of the ready-made audience. The church will not give up its power or its source of income without a struggle.

An illustration of this reluctance to change may be seen in Tontitown, Arkansas, where objection has been raised over the present situation. Even the public school board is reluctant to overturn the local establishment. The superintendent of schools has said, however, that any Protestant who prefers not to attend the Catholic-orientated public school could be taken from Tontitown to the Springdale schools.
To overcome this massive resistance to legal conformity it may be necessary to resort to the courts. An outsider, of course, has no standing

(basis for complaint) in a local court. Even a local citizen must show substantial interest as a taxpayer or as the parent of a child in the school. But who will be so bold as to leave himself vulnerable in his business (for he is dependent upon the Catholic majority for patronage), his family (for they may be ostracized), and his pocket-book (for the legal process is costly)?

Captive Schools Can Be Set Free

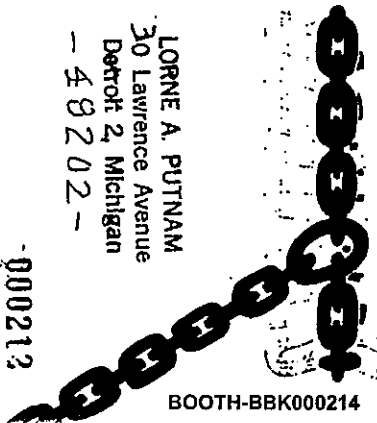
Captive schools can be set free, however. Americans United has been instrumental in liberating by court action scores of these illicit schools in Missouri and New Mexico. It has caused others in different states to be freed through complicated negotiations with leaders of both sides. The mere threat of action by this organization a few years ago eliminated captive schools in Sterling, Colorado and Bremond, Texas.

In a country where it has been ruled unconstitutional to require the reading of even a few verses of the Bible or the recitation of a brief prescribed prayer in the public schools there can be no question about the unconstitutionality of public schools being "permeated with Christian (sectarian) piety." The "free public schools" in captive situations must be made really free and restored to the public.

The Guaranteed Rights of Thousands
Are Violated Every Day
by Church Control in . . .

In a free country with the finest free schools in the world the average citizen is puzzled when he first hears the term "captive school," and astounded when he learns what it means. It is a term which may never have been broadcast on the radio, never used on television, and practically never spoken in private conversation. It has been heard in a few courtrooms and mentioned in print by half a handful of publications.

A captive school is a public school, totally supported by taxes levied for the public school system, but controlled by the local Roman Catholic diocese. Its faculty usually is made up of teaching sisters of Roman Catholic orders. The term "captive school" was coined as a descriptive label depicting the school as one which began as any other public school began but was "captured" by a religious order. Several hundred presently operate in 22 states.

A typical captive school is staffed by nuns or brothers or priests wearing the distinctive garb of their order. Religious symbols and images decorate the schoolroom walls. Students are taught the Baltimore (official Roman Catholic) Catechism, and Mass is held immediately before or immediately after school hours or during a "released time" period within the school day. Sometimes these captive schools observe the letter of the law by taking their children to a neighboring church for religious instruction, but not always.

Let's you forget, we are not describing a parochial school. This is the description of a typical

captive school—a public school supported with taxes paid by Protestants, Jews, agnostics, and atheists as well as by Catholics.

Captive schools are found mostly in the central states. Probably 50, in round figures, could be found in Kansas. Another 30 openly operate in Indiana, and about 15 each exist in Kentucky and Illinois. Approximately 20 are scattered throughout Texas, with 20 more in Ohio.

If you live in or near Fort Recovery, Ohio; Hays, Kansas; Tell City, Indiana; Marion County, Kentucky; or Teutopolis, Illinois, you have available first-hand information about captive schools and how they operate. There are many others, and each one exists in violation of the Federal Constitution and the distinctively American principle of church-state separation. Most of them function in violation of state constitutions or statutes as well. Ralph B. Kennard, professor emeritus of the American University in Washington, D. C., declares that such schools "represent centers of nullification in otherwise law-abiding communities."

Frequently a captive school is listed by the state as a public school and by the local Catholic parish as a Catholic school. For instance, St. Joseph's school in Jasper, Indiana is listed as a Catholic parochial school in the official Catholic directory. But the Indiana school directory lists the same school as the "Tenth Street Elementary School." As such it receives the same public financial support as any other public school.

Public School in Catholic Building

In Mt. Angel, Oregon the public school is housed in a Catholic school building. The building bears the inscription, "Saint Mary's School," and beneath that, "District 91." The Oregon school directory for 1962-63 lists the school simply as "District School No. 91." According to the townspeople the first three grades are taught exclusively by nuns. This small town (about

1,300) is in Marion County, the same county as the state capital, Salem.

In allowing these captive situations to exist the constitutions of both states as well as the Federal Constitution have been either ignored or glossed over. Such blatant disregard for the laws of the land provide a natural situation where instruction in good citizenship and regard for the law may become almost a mockery. Teaching by example overshadows teaching by precept.

Public School

On the face of the situation the existence of captive schools seems incredible. It is only fair to state, however, that probably no such school came into existence as a result of any dark conspiracy. Public schools are "captured" (and often willingly "surrendered") because peculiar circumstances may cause the arrangement to seem expedient. Money almost always is involved.

Take the case of two captive schools in Antonito, Colorado, for example. During the Depression days of the early 1930's the public schools in this small town near the New Mexico state line faced the threat of closing. The city fathers were unable to raise enough tax funds to continue their schools in operation. When the Benedictine sisters volunteered to staff the schools for the county for a fraction of the previous cost the townspeople saw a way to keep their schools open. It seemed to be the only logical solution. Besides, most of the residents of this small town were Catholic anyway.

"Crisis Passed, Nothing Changed"

The years passed and times got better. The crisis passed. But nothing changed within the framework of the school system. On August 23, 1962 the Antonio Ledger-News printed a list of the public school system's new teachers for the coming year. The list included Sister Bernice, "superintendent of Antonio schools; Sister Arsenia, high school principal; Sister Huberta, librarian and office secretary; Sister Alice Marie,

science and mathematics teacher; Sister P in charge of National Defense Education Act requisitions and teaching of Spanish." The 36 of the 37 teachers in the Antonio schools were Catholic, and 26 of the 37 sisters of the Order of St. Benedict.

More than a quarter of a century had since a financial crisis capitulated the public into the hands of a religious order. Nothing changed. Nothing, that is, except teacher salaries. The wage scale for teachers had with the economy of the area, and that year nuns received between \$80,000 and \$100,000—state or Federal—could be collected. A nun's salary because it was turned over Mother House 80 miles away. A situation came into being as an accident of history been preserved as a private depository of funds.

The captive school situation in Kalida, emerged much later and under almost the same financial circumstances. In this case a parochial school was "captured" by the school board, but the only thing the board received was the bills.

In 1950 St. Michael's School made application to the state for funds with which to operate buses. The request was denied, but in 1951 Putnam County School Board leased the building from St. Michael's for a reported \$10,000 annually. The school, having come under the direction and control of the county school board, functioned exactly as it had been. The same were kept, the same curricula were taught, the same religious symbols remained on the walls, the same garbed nuns were retained on the staff. Nothing was changed except the size of the board's budget. The county paid the nuns standard salaries and in 1959 gave \$300 a year. Total salaries for the 18 nuns year amounted to more than \$30,000.

Msgr. James T. Booth, who has served the Diocese of San Diego at the Chancery for nearly two decades, has resigned as chancellor.

In accepting his resignation, Bishop Francis J. Furey said the monsignor plans to devote all of his time to his parochial work and to preparations for the bicentennial celebration of San Diego in 1969.

Old Mission San Diego de Alcalá, of which Msgr. Booth has been pastor since February 1954, will be a "focal point" of the observance, Bishop Furey said.

The Bishop named Father I. Brent Eagen to succeed Msgr. Booth. Father Eagen has been director of school relations and public information at the Collège for Men, University of San Diego.

Msgr. Booth was graduated from Rome's Lateran University with a doctorate in Canon Law, magna cum laude, in June 1952. He previously had served for one year in the Chancery Office as secretary of the matrimonial tribunal.

On his return to the diocese, studies in another field and a successful examination in The Therapeutic Values of Religion in Psychiatry led to his appointment as chaplain at the State Hospital, Patton.

Recalled to the Chancery, he was named vice chancellor in June 1953 and chancellor in February 1954.

Educated in the public schools of his native Needles, Msgr. Booth studied for the priesthood at Holy Cross College, Canon City, Colorado, and the junior and major seminaries of Los Angeles. He was ordained in 1946.

A native of San Bernardino, Father Eagen was graduated from St. Bernardine's High School in 1947. He attended Loyola University of Los Angeles prior to studies for the priesthood at St. Francis and Immaculate Heart seminaries. He was ordained for the Diocese of San Diego in May 1956.

For the next three years he filled the dual role of assistant pastor at Holy Rosary Church in San Bernardino and teacher of English and religion at Aquinas High School in that city. Meanwhile, he studied for, and in June 1959 received his master's degree in English.

For the next five years Father Eagen taught English and American Literature at USD's College for Men, theology and medical ethics at Mercy College of Nursing, and religion at Our Lady of Peace Academy. He also conducted teacher training courses for the Parish High School of Religion and is the author of *Released Time: A Necessary Adjunct to Secondary Education*.

The new chancellor is a member of the Board of Directors for the Community Welfare Council of San Diego County, the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the San Diego Opera Guild and the La Jolla Museum of Art. He recently was named executive board member of the Kearny-Vista Planning Association.

Father Eagen is chaplain of the University of San Diego Auxiliary; Phi Kappa Theta, a national Catholic fraternity, and was national chaplain of the National Association of Catholic Alumni Clubs. He is also a chaplain of the Christian Family Movement in San Diego.

He became the first state-appointed chaplain at the California State Hospital, Patton, where he served until being named vice chancellor of the San Diego Diocese in June, 1953.

He has served as assistant pastor at St. Joseph's Cathedral, St. Vincent's, and Our Lady of Angels and as pastor of Blessed Sacrament, Descanso. He has been administrator of St. John's.

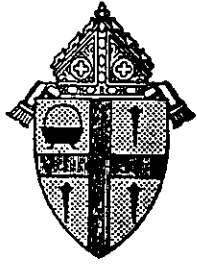
The fire reportedly started over one of the boat's motors and raced out of control through the wooden hull of the marlineer which was built a little more than a year ago and valued at more than \$200,000.



Married Priest: At Peace With God, Himself

For most men, getting married is
simply a matter of finding the right
woman. But for Father James Booth it
was not that easy.

"I went through a lot of agony," he
recalling his decision to marry
25 years as a Roman Catholic
priest. "Terrible agony."

As the curate at St. James' Epis-
copal, Father Booth says he
knew he had the right thing and
would make the same decision if he
had to do all over again.

While active of Needles, Father Booth
first started thinking about
being a priest when he was in
high grade. BOOTH-BBK000253
His dad was a railroad man and

had to work every day," he said with
a smile. "But I only saw the priest at
our church on Sunday. So I thought
well, that's the job for me if you only
have to work one day a week. That
was the method God used to attract
me to the priesthood.

"From then on I wanted to be a
priest and nothing else. By the time I
was in high school everybody knew
Jim was going to be a priest. I had
that drive all through my life."

After he was graduated from high
school, Father Booth spent eight
years in training before he was or-
dained in 1946. Three years later he
was sent to Rome where he earned
his doctorate degree in church law.
When he returned to the United

States Father Booth quickly advanced
in the hierarchy of the San Diego Dio-
cese. He was named chancellor in
1954 and became monsignor two
years later.

Then, in the mid to late 1960s,
something began to happen which
would drastically affect his life.

"I had quite a college following,"
he said, "and those were the days
when revolts were taking place on
campuses. Students wanted to change
things and I think I got caught up in
that spirit.

"I also wanted to be somewhat of a
pioneer or an advocate for a married
clergy. I wanted to be married secre-
tly, stay on the job and then when I

was discovered he able to say, 'see, I'm just as good a priest having been married as I was before.'"

Unfortunately, while away on his honeymoon a snoopy secretary discovered his marriage license in the bottom drawer of his desk.

"When I got back the whole staff was waiting for me," he said. "They all wanted to know why I had gotten married."

Father Booth had no choice but to resign. His mother, an active member of the Needles Catholic Church, took the news very hard.

"When I got married she quit going to church because she was so upset," he said. "She felt I had disgraced her."

Father Booth and his wife, Deborah, spent a year traveling before he had to start looking for another job. He worked for a cemetery as a grave salesman, tried selling real estate and ended up selling appliances for a large department store. But he was not happy.

"The question kept coming up," he said, "what do you really want to do? And I had to say, I want to be a priest."

"I literally sat on top of a mountain and prayed about it. Then it came to me, why not look for a church that accepts married priests."

Father Booth investigated the possibility of joining the Episcopal Church and was invited to Fresno for an interview by Bishop Victor M. Rivara of the Episcopal Diocese of San Joaquin.

"They put me through a trial period of about a year and a half before they formally accepted me," Father Booth explained. "I had to pass an examination on doctrine and practices of the church and complete a four-month probation period as a deacon."

Last August Father Booth was formally accepted as a validly ordained Episcopal priest. His mother, after adjusting to the shock of his marriage, was pleased at his decision to re-enter the priesthood.

"When I wrote to her and told her I was going back into the Lord's work she wrote back and said it was the happiest day in her life. She attended the reception at St. James and really enjoyed it."

"Celibacy is not necessary to make a good priest," he continued. "But having been married, I can now see where there are advantages both ways."

"Celibate priests are freer in their dealings with people and in coming and going. But they don't have the warmth and understanding that comes from being married."

"I'm blessed with a very good wife. I get a lot of feedback from her on things that I couldn't get before. When you're a Roman priest people won't tell you if something you do is terrible. But my wife is very frank."

Father Booth says he still loves the Roman Catholic Church but says he would not return to the church even if it did accept married priests.

"I've committed myself totally to the Episcopal Church," he said, smiling like a man completely at peace with God and himself.

Ex-Pastor Seeks Job

The former pastor of Mission San Diego de Alcalá is seeking employment in the San Diego area.

James T. Booth, a former monsignor in the Roman Catholic Church who was ordained 25 years ago, resigned from the priesthood to marry a 19-year-old San Diego State College co-ed Feb. 7.

The marriage and resignation were disclosed Sunday by the apostolic ministry in San Diego.

Bride Met at Mass

Booth's wife, Deborah, said her husband is seeking work possibly as a teacher. "We don't have any prospects," she said.

Booth, 49, a native of Needles, met his bride after Mass the day at the mission where Booth has been the pastor since 1954.

The marriage in the mission was performed by the Rev. Fred Bradley, a Protestant minister and friend of the couple. Mrs. Booth said her close friends were Protestant. Booth also is a Catholic.

Ordained by Bishop

Booth was ordained by the Bishop Charles Francis McCarthy at St. Joseph's Cathedral here. He studied for the priesthood at Holy Cross College at Canon City, Colo. and at St. John's Major Seminary in Amarillo.

In 1952, he received his doctorate, magna cum laude, from the Lateran University in Rome after a three-year course in canon law. Booth was appointed vice rector of the mission in 1954.

San Diego, Calif. (AP) — The 19-year-old bride of James K. Booth, 49, says the long-time pastor of California's oldest Roman Catholic mission is looking for work after resigning from the priesthood. "We don't have any prospects," said the bride, Deborah, a student at San Diego State College. She also is Roman Catholic.

A family friend, the Rev. Fred Bradley, a Protestant, married them Feb. 7 in the Mission San Diego de Alcalá.

Ex-Priest, Wife Plan Home Here

Deborah Booth, 19, bride of former priest James T. Booth, 49, said here yesterday the couple plans to live in San Diego and her husband is seeking work, possibly as a teacher.

Booth, who was ordained 25 years ago, resigned from the priesthood to marry. The marriage, which took place Feb. 7, was confirmed Sunday by the apostolic ministry of San Diego.

FRIEND OFFICIATES

His wife, a student at San Diego State, also is a Roman Catholic. The couple met after Mass one day at Mission San Diego del Alcala, where Booth had been parish priest since 1954.

The marriage took place in

the mission and was performed by the Rev. Fred Bradley, a family friend. Bradley is a Protestant. Mrs. Booth said only a few close friends were present.

Former Monsignor Booth, a native of Needles, was ordained here on April 7, 1946, by the late Bishop Charles Francis Buddy. The ordination took place in St. Joseph's Cathedral.

He studied for the priesthood at Holy Cross College, Canon City, Colo., and at St. John's Major Seminary in Camarillo. In 1952, he received his doctorate, magna cum laude, from the Lateran University of Rome after reading a three-year course in canon law.

He became the first state-appointed chaplain at the California State Hospital, Patton, where he served until being named vice chancellor of the San Diego Diocese in June, 1953.

He has served as assistant pastor at St. Joseph's Cathedral, St. Vincent's, and Our Lady of Angels and as pastor of Blessed Sacrament, Descanso. He has been administrator of St. John's.

FORMER CHANCELLOR

Named chancellor of the San Diego Diocese in March, 1954, Booth resigned from that post in early 1968 to devote more time to his parish.

Mission San Diego de Alcala, where Booth last served, is the oldest mission in California, founded by the Franciscan fathers in 1769.

Two weeks ago Prince Don Juan of Spain paid a formal visit to the mission, where he was greeted by Booth.

The Rev. Msgr. I. Brent Eagen, who succeeded Booth as diocese chancellor, will serve as administrator of the Mission San Diego de Alcala parish until a new pastor is appointed.

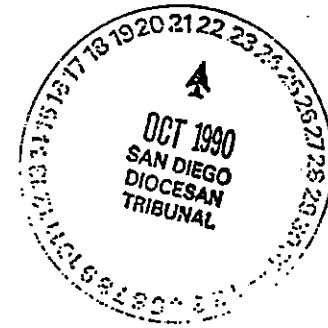

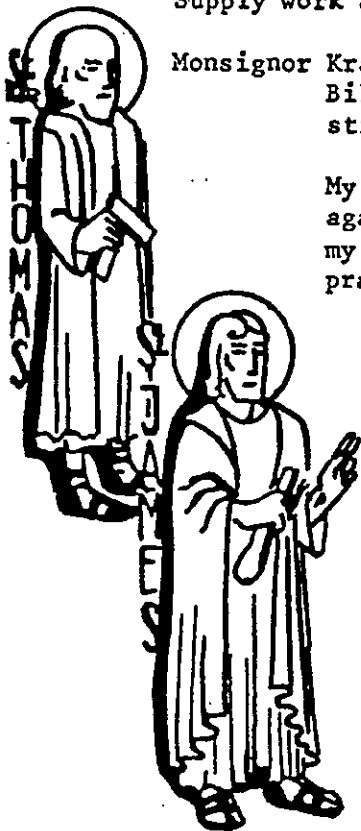
Monsignor Kraft and Monsignor I.B. Eagan can give ample background on me. Bill Kraft and I have kept in contact over the years and are still very good friends.

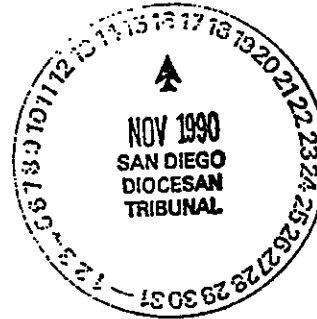
