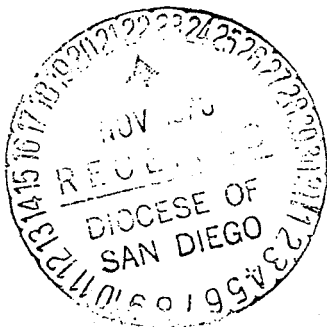
**Dear Bishop Maher:**

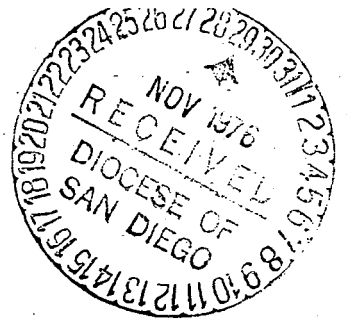

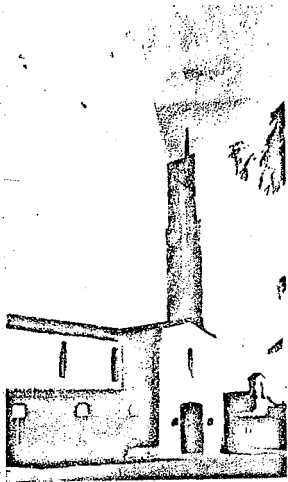
I appreciate very much a copy of your letter of November 30 in which you express your views in favor of the continued ringing of the carillon bells at St. Brigid's Church.

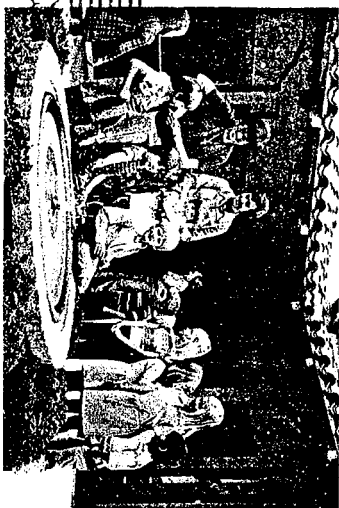

A Requiem Mass was celebrated Friday for the Very Rev. Msgr. Donald Doxie, pastor of St. Brigid's Catholic Church in Pacific Beach, who died Tuesday.

Doxie, 54, served as pastor of the church for eight years. Previously, he served as secretary to the bishop and as vice chancellor of the Roman Catholic Diocese of San Diego.

A native of Los Angeles, Doxie was a San Diego resident for 48 years. He attended La Jolla Elementary and La Jolla Junior High School and was graduated from St. Augustine

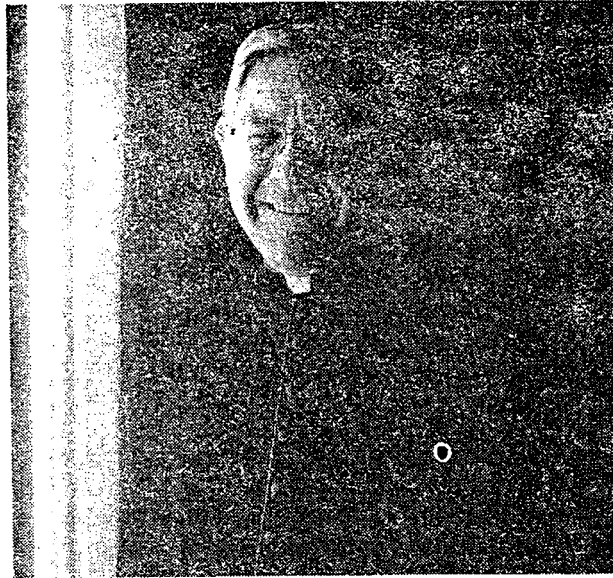
High School in 1941.

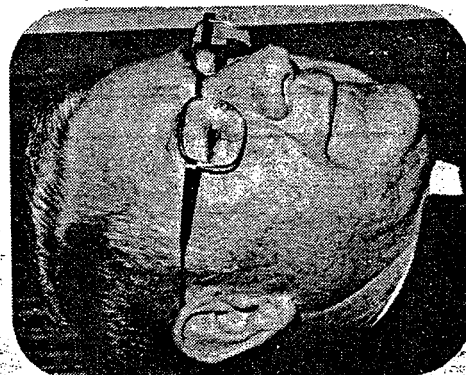
## Msgr. Doxie, 54, dies

Msgr. Donald Doxie, pastor of St. Brigid parish, Pacific Beach, was found dead in his room at the rectory Tuesday, Nov. 16. He was 54. He was born, raised and ordained a priest in California.

A former secretary to Bishop Francis Buddy and vice chancellor of the diocese, Msgr. Doxie was born in Los Angeles in 1922. He attended La Jolla Elementary and Junior High schools and spent his last three years of high school at St. Augustine's.

FROM THERE he went to the

Diocesan St. Francis Minor Seminary, as it then was, and completed his studies for the priesthood at Immaculate Heart Seminary, then on the USD campus, between 1948 and 1952.

Ordained by Bishop Buddy in St. Joseph Cathedral in 1952, the priest first served at St. Margaret parish, Chino; St. George, Ontario; St. Charles Borromeo, San Diego; Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Lakeside, and Our Lady of the Rosary, San Diego.

He was also, for a period, assistant director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. After he became secretary to the bishop Msgr. Doxie also served in the Chaplain's Corps of the U.S. Navy, returning in 1961 to the Chancery office.

IN 1968 he was appointed pastor of St. Brigid parish and in 1969 he was invested as an honorary prelate with the rank of monsignor. In 1974 he was appointed episcopal vicar for the La Jolla deanery.

In addition to his parish responsibilities, Msgr. Doxie served as consultant to the bishop, defensor vinculi of the diocesan Tribunal and clergy moderator of Stewardship.

A Vigil Mass will be celebrated at St. Brigid church today (Thursday) Nov. 18 and the Mass of Christian Burial will be at 10:30 a.m. Friday, Nov. 19 at the same church, with Bishop Leo T. Maher as principal concelebrant.

# Last respects paid to Msgr. Doxie at St. Brigid's Mass

His bishops, his fellow priests, knights and ladies of the Holy Sepulchre, Sisters, his Lutheran pastor friend and hundreds of parishioners packed the church of St. Brigid, San Diego, Nov. 19, to say farewell for the last time to Msgr. Donald Doxie, pastor.

Bishop Leo T. Maher, principal concelebrant of the funeral Mass, called him "one who served with perfection of purpose."

LUTHERAN Pastor Quentin P. Garman, neighbor to St. Brigid's church, with his community of Christ Lutheran Church, was among the principal mourners. The community made a memorial gift to St. Brigid's in honor of Msgr. Doxie.

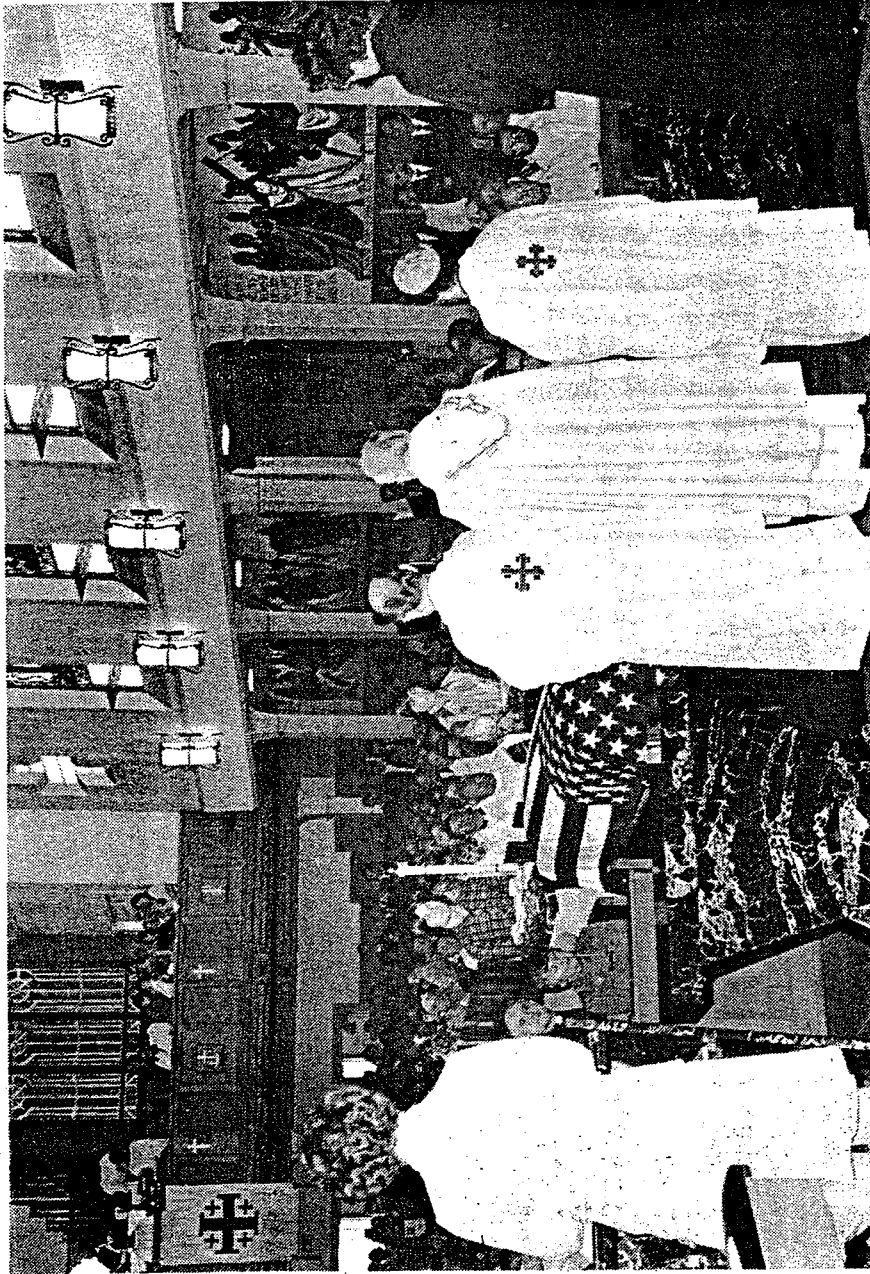


He is survived by his brother, Ralph J. Mazela of San Diego.

This is to inform you that Monsignor Donald F. Doxie, Pastor of Saint Brigid Church, Pacific Beach, was found dead in the parish rectory earlier today.

Monsignor Doxie was born in Los Angeles in 1922, attended La Jolla Elementary and Junior High Schools, and graduated from Saint Augustine High School, San Diego, in 1941. He studied philosophy at Saint Francis Minor Seminary, Old Town and El Cajon, completed his theological studies at Immaculate Heart Seminary, El Cajon, and was ordained to the priesthood in Saint Joseph Cathedral on February 2, 1952.

Prior to his appointment as Secretary to the Bishop in 1955, Monsignor Doxie had served as Assistant Pastor at various churches throughout the diocese and as Assistant Director of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith. In 1957, he was commissioned as a Chaplain in the U. S. Navy, and returned to the diocese in 1961, as Secretary to the Bishop and Vice Chancellor. Named Pastor of Saint Brigid Church in 1968, he had been a Diocesan Consultor since 1963, and Episcopal Vicar since 1974.

He is survived by his brother, Ralph J. Mazela of San Diego.

A Vigil Mass will be held at Saint Brigid Church, 4735 Cass Street, San Diego, on Thursday evening, November 18, 1976, at 7:30 p.m. The Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated at Saint Brigid Church on Friday morning, November 19, 1976, at 10:30 a.m. Interment will follow at Holy Cross Cemetery.

Dear Monsignor Doxie:

In accordance with the Decrees "Ecclesiae Sanctae" and "Christus Dominus", I am happy to appoint you as an Episcopal Vicar for the San Diego Cathedral, La Jolla, and Oceanside Deaneries of the Diocese of San Diego. This appointment will be effective for a term of three years, commencing on January 7, 1974.

The purpose of this appointment is to afford you full collaboration and responsibility in the governing of the Diocese. As a collaborator with the Bishop, you will represent my mind and will in the territory over which you have jurisdiction.

As an Episcopal Vicar, you will possess the same authority and jurisdiction as the Chancellor of the Diocese with respect to the following:

1. To watch over and provide for the spiritual life of the clergy under your care, including the specification of the place where they will make their annual retreats; to grant permission for a clergyman to be absent from the Diocese for a notable period of time; and to grant the faculties of the Diocese to priests and religious within your territorial jurisdiction.

2. In regard to religious residing within your territorial jurisdiction, you will have authority over those matters which are of an administrative nature and those which are of a judicial nature, but concern only the internal sacramental forum.
3. You will be able to grant the following matrimonial dispensations: Banns, Mixed Religion, Disparity of Worship, Crime, Affinity, Consanguinity, and the like. You will not be authorized to grant a dispensation from Canonical Form. This power is limited to the Bishop and the Vicar General.
4. In addition, you will have the responsibility within your territorial jurisdiction to act as a central spokesman for the Diocese and to act as an arbitrator in the settlement of local disputes.

In connection with the exercise of authority and jurisdiction, it is essential that there be efficient and accurate record keeping. It will, therefore, be necessary for you to keep a record of all dispensations and faculties granted, as well as copies of any official public statements. These should be forwarded, on a quarterly basis, to the Diocesan Office, marked to the attention of the Chancellor, who bears the primary responsibility for keeping all official Diocesan records and archives.

Enclosed you will find a copy of an article published in the Jurist Magazine, which describes the office and function of Episcopal Vicars. Your continued cooperation and participation in the Apostolic Ministry are greatly appreciated.

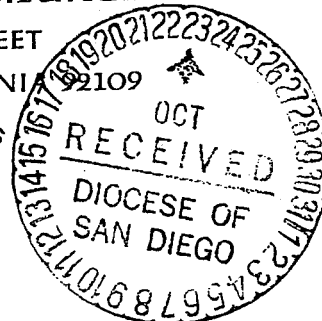



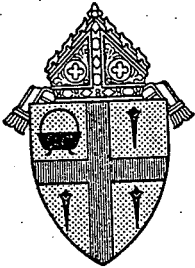

"I . . . firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment wherewith every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who—far worse still—admit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

is, has been, and ever will be in the succession of the Episcopate from the Apostles; not in such a way that what seems best and most fitting according to the refinement of each age may be held, but that the absolute and unchangeable truth preached from the beginning by the Apostles may never in any different wise be believed, never in any different wise be understood.

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.

### St. Brigid's Church Gets New Pastor

The Very Rev. Msgr. Donald F. Doxie, for nine years vice chancellor and secretary of the San Diego Roman Catholic Diocese, will become pastor of St. Brigid's Church in Pacific Beach Thursday.

The appointment was announced yesterday by the Most Rev. Francis J. Furey, bishop of the San Diego Diocese.

Msgr. Doxie, 45, replaces the Very Rev. Msgr. J. A. C. van Weggel, who is retiring for health reasons. No replacement for Msgr. Doxie has been yet named. St. Brigid's is a parish of some 1,000 families.

#### Product of Area

Msgr. Doxie was secretary and vice chancellor from 1955 to 1957 and since 1961. He was a Navy chaplain from April 1957 to July 1961.

Msgr. Doxie is a product of La Jolla and San Diego schools. He attended La Jolla Grammar School, La Jolla Junior High School and graduated in 1941 from St. Augustine Catholic High School.

He entered St. Francis Seminary in 1941, then located in Old Town. He enlisted in the Navy in October, 1942 and served until December, 1945.

#### Parish in China

Msgr. Doxie entered Immaculate Heart Seminary, in 1946 and was ordained a priest in 1952 by the Most Rev. Charles F. Buddy, the late bishop of the diocese.

Before assuming his chancery post in 1955, he served at St. Margaret Mary parish in China, St. George's in Ontario and St. Charles Borromeo in San Diego.

He was also briefly assistant director of the diocesan office of the Propagation of the Faith.

He will remain a member of the Bishop's Board of Consultants.

## S.D. Union 7-17-68 Monsignor Doxie Gets Pastorate

The Very Rev. Msgr. Donald F. Doxie, secretary to the bishop of the Catholic Diocese of San Diego and vice chancellor of the diocese, has been named pastor of St. Brigid's Church in Pacific Beach.

It will be Monsignor Doxie's first parish and he will be spiritual leader to more than 1,000 families. He succeeds The Right Rev. Msgr. J. A. C. Van Weggel, who has retired.

Monsignor Doxie's appointment as pastor of St. Brigid's will be effective tomorrow. He will retain the title of vice-chancellor of the diocese, but a new secretary to the bishop will be named.

Monsignor Doxie, 45, a lifelong resident of this area, was graduated from St. Augustine High School in 1941 and from Immaculate Heart Seminary.

He was ordained in 1952 by the Most Rev. Charles F. Buddy, then bishop of the diocese.

During World War II, he served three years as a Navy

enlisted man. From 1957 to 1960, Doxie was a Navy chaplain, serving at Camp Pendleton, at Corpus Christi, Tex. and at Barber's Point, Hawaii.

He became secretary to the late Bishop Buddy in 1955. He returned as secretary to the bishop and vice chancellor of the diocese in 1961, following completion of his tour of duty as a chaplain.

Monsignor Doxie was made a papal chamberlain and elevated to the position of Very Reverend Monsignor in 1962. He has been assistant pastor of St. Joseph's Cathedral and of St. Charles Borromeo and Our Lady of the Rosary Churches.

As pastor of St. Brigid's, Monsignor Doxie will be assisted by the Rev. John Wheeler and the Rev. James Timmons.

Monsignor Doxie called his appointment to the parish "a great honor and a great responsibility."

The monsignor is the son of Mrs. Catherine Doxie, who lives at 440 San Antonio St.

Again may I say that the kindness and consideration Your Excellency, has shown me in this difficulty has been the one bright ray of hope that has kept me going.



Yesterday I received a letter from Colonel Nohrden, U. S. Marine Corps, whom you may recall was one of the Honor Guards for you in the first Field Mass. Colonel Nohrden is now on duty with Headquarters, Fleet Marine Force, Pacific, in Hawaii. He informs me that Father Doxie is not happy with his lot as the Assistant Chaplain at the Naval Air Station, Barber's Point. Dear Chaplain Doxie:

Occasionally young Catholic chaplains write us as you have, namely, not enough Catholics here to warrant my presence. If aboard ship or at a shore establishment we had a stable population, your argument might be valid. However, the Catholic population of any command fluctuates with changes of duty. Chaplain allowances are not and cannot be geared to these fluctuations.

In time you may learn that chaplain allowances are not arbitrarily established, as you seem to infer. They are the result of official planning and on-site study, with final approval of the Chief of Chaplains.

The green pastures across the hill are pleasant to behold. For many years you sought admission to our pastures. You did well at two previous assignments. But it would appear that you have made no effort to make your present one a more fruitful area. Our Lord reminds us to seek the salvation of one, not one hundred and one. Have you sought your one in this assignment?

I do not believe your Bishop specified that you must always have 3,000 or more Catholics to serve in order to be an effective Catholic chaplain. In fact, he might have admonished you as you left his diocese for the United States Navy in the words of St. Francis DeSales, "One soul is a big enough parish for any priest."

Reverend and dear Father Doxie:

Be assured that every kindly consideration has been given to your request to be released from the Navy. To make a diligent analysis of the situation in toto, the opportunity came to consult top officials here and in Washington.

Positis ponendis, my thinking is that the Secretary of the Navy is definitely opposed to accepting your resignation at this time. If it were a question of grave salutis causa and you were recalled to the States, it would be necessary to supply your place by a P.M., which could not help the cause. But, thanks be to God, there is no question of ill health. (By the way, Father Jake DeMoor leaves today for serious major surgery in St. Louis. He has cancer of the throat, which the doctors indicate is hopeless).

Writing as one less wise, let me submit two suggestions:

If you wish to be of help to this Chancery, it would be of great advantage if you could spend the free time at your disposal in a review of canon law as related to a Chancery Office.

If you wish books on these particular subjects, please command me. If you have a great amount of free time, it would not be out of place to take a course at the University of Hawaii in some graduate study. You know, of course, that some priests become very learned by employing free time in higher studies.

My thoughts enfold your dear mother, especially because you write that she has not been well. You should complete plans so that she can return to her many devoted friends in La Jolla and thus enjoy a more normal life.

While we have contacted every possibility in an effort to obtain your release, my conviction at this time is that you should remain in the service and fulfill the obligations of your pledge of office.

This was my first reaction when you wrote your wishes and now it becomes my final bit of counsel to you.

Dear Bishop Buddy:

We were distressed to learn that Father Doxie has expressed a desire to resign from the Chaplain Corps, United States Navy. He is one of our young Catholic priests who shows great promise and has the zeal to be of outstanding service to our Navy and Marine Corps.

Father Doxie has probably forgotten that he is obligated to serve until June 1961 and the Secretary of the Navy does not look with favor on a resignation which seeks to annul an oath of service. Perhaps the pressure of the tensions with which he is burdened has caused him to overlook this fact. If it were possible to accept his resignation, it would be six months before it would be effective because it is contingent upon the reporting of a relief. At the present time we do not even have a priest who can replace him.

We cannot prevent his submitting an official request for the acceptance of his resignation. Yet I know it could not be approved at this time. Perhaps such a reply may be the tonic he needs to clear the horizon. I regret the tenor of this letter and humbly request your understanding of the Navy's attitude.



You can not know what joy Your Excellency's kind note of September 9, 1959, has brought to me.

I have tried to show my superiors here on the local scene that the presence of two priests at this station is a waste of manpower. Unfortunately they continue to feel that they do not wish to loose one allowed position for a chaplain in this area. This, of course, prevents me from making any report to Washington, on the matter. All problems of this type must go through the chain of command.

Over and beyond these considerations, I have had a continuing growing feeling that I have contributed far more to the service of the Church while working in the Diocese than here in the Navy. In short it is my conviction that whatever work Your Excellency assigns me, will provide me with the opportunity to do more for the Church than any position I would be ordered to in the military.

I am faced with one difficulty, in that, due to being on duty in Hawaii, this is classed as overseas duty. The Navy normally would not move me from here for at least two years. Accordingly for me to resign and thus be returned to the mainland, my own request will not be sufficient. In addition to this if I alone request resignation they usually drag out the red tape for months.

May I once again impose on your kindness to ask that Your Excellency write directly to Monsignor George Rosso, Navy Department, informing him that you concur with my action of resigning, that you have a post for me to fulfill and wish my very early return and release from service. This will provide the Navy with the necessary information as to whether or not my Bishop is aware of my request and if he approves of the action.



Your Excellency:

I am very sorry to have missed the commencement exercises of the College for Men. Fortunately I was able to follow all the details in the SOUTHERN CROSS, and in the local Catholic paper here in Honolulu. I felt most proud and indeed a little sad that I could not be there to take part in a most significant and momentous event in the history of the Diocese of San Diego.

I find that being away from the Diocese and the Chancery has proven quite a cross for me. I miss the days filled with work. The everyday necessity of accomplishing the tasks assigned by Your Excellency. The constant help and guidance I received in working so closely with you.

Mother and I arrived in Honolulu on June 13, and have been trying to get settled since then. The weather has been exceedingly warm. I am a little afraid it is too much for Mother and it may be necessary to return her to San Diego.

I have always tried to face every problem to the fullest and carry it to the very end. I do not like the idea of changing from one job to another; but after over two years in the Navy, I do not seem to have accomplished very much. Certainly I am not doing for the Church anything that would compare with the work and results achieved in assisting Your Excellency.

Despite my personal feelings in these matters I am still a Catholic Priest, and as such subject to the wish of my Bishop. I feel that it is my obligation to make these facts known to you and to ask Your Excellency's advise and direction.

My talents, what few there are, and desire to work are not being used to any extent whatsoever. The present station I am on has another Priest and myself. There is not enough work for one Priest let alone two. As a result days pass without work and I can not let this go very long. I have mentioned this to my superiors here in Hawaii but they seem to feel that they could not afford the loss of one chaplain in this area, as this might leave the idea that they were not kept busy themselves.

Unfortunately the senior Priest assigned to the station previously, who was a religious, felt he did not get sufficient time off and therefore needed help, which he received. Consequently I have fallen heir to this job which has too much time wasting envolved.

Knowing that Your Excellency, has definite need of Priests in the Diocese. I can not continue this idle time wasting without at least informing you of the matter. With the knowledge that Your Excellency has sacrificed himself in not obtaining another Secretary to assist you, save for the services of Monsignor Byrne, in the office. That Your Excellency goes about the Dioces without the assistance of a Priest and conducts cermonies frequently without a priest secretary simply that the people may be served. I can not help but feel that I could do much more for the cause of the Church at home rather than in the service. But I of myself feel that I cannot make this decision and must ask the help of my spiritual Father.

When I undertook to join the Navy I felt from all the information received that there was a genuine need for Priests in the service. This assignment has convinced me that the Diocese is in far greater need for Priests than the service.

I am embarrassed to have to write such a letter, yet my sense of obligation to the Diocese and Your Excellency demands that I lay my plight before Your Excellency.

I know that this letter will reach Your Excellency while you are on Your Ad Limina visit. Please do not trouble yourself until Your Excellency has returned from Rome, in answering my difficulty.





Reverend and dear Bishop Buddy:

You will recall that the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego, a corporation sole, or its successor, is the owner of a \$20,000 life insurance policy on the life of Reverend Donald Francis Doxie.

Since Father Doxie is presently a Chaplain in the United States Navy and as a result of recent legislation is unable to get life insurance as formerly offered by the U. S. 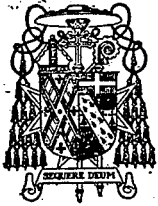





"I . . . . firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment where-with every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who—far worse still—admit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.
