Most Reverend and dear Bishop Buddy:-

I am sorry that I have to bother Your Excellency with this type of letter, but I was informed yesterday by a roofing contractor that the entire roof on the rectory will have to be replaced.

I knew it was in rather bad shape since there are many spots from which the gravel has been blown off by the wind, but I did not think it was that bad. According to Mr. J.E. Billado, a roofing contractor from Brawley, and a Catholic, the original work was poorly done, and due to improper sealing, moisture has gathered between the gravel and tar paper during the years causing same to rot in many places.

The only remedy is to replace the whole roof, that is, to remove all the gravel, then replace the tar paper, cover surface with liquid tar, put on new gravel, and seal.

The cost for this procedure comes to \$ 500.00. This, of course, is a great deal of money—especially for little St. Patrick's. I would like to offer a suggestion as a possible solution. Would Your Excellency be so kind as to excuse us from paying the interest on the debt for this quarter and the next? If so, we could easily take care of the above expense. As I say, this is only a suggestion, and not a presumption on my part.

Dear Monsignor Booth:-

About a year ago I obtained a Deed from you for a lot that we are selling to the Miguel Luna family. The documents for this transaction had already been drawn up before my arrival here last February (1963). Naturally, I took it for granted that everything was in order since the papers had been notarized and the signatures of the Luna family affixed.

The other day the Tax Assessor came out to check up on the property, and he told me that instead of Lot 17 in block 44, the Lunas are buying Lot 16—which is also owned by the Church. I do not know who to blame for this misunderstanding, but the Lunas were under the impression that they were buying Lot 17. I have made every effort possible to try and persuade them to purchase Lot 16, but to no avail. They claim they have made many improvements on the house and property, and for that reason want to remain.

Since the title of Lot 16 is already recorded in their name, it will have to be changed again to that of the Diocese of San Diego, and then the Deed to Lot 17 will have to be recorded in the name of the Luna family. I would appreciate it very much, Monsignor, if you would send me the deed in question.

If His Excellency, Bishop Furey, will agree, I would like to have the necessary permission to dispose of Lot 16 also. This lot has two houses—which are actually shacks—without foundations, and which may be condemned within a year's time—according to the local city inspector.

Thank you for your letter of October 6, 1964. Please be advised that it is a State Law and a Diocesan obligation that all parishes carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance.

Thus it would be impossible to exclude your parish from our master policy. The charges for compensation insurance are based upon the payroll report submitted by each parish. I have checked our files and find that you submitted the following report for your parish:

Maintenance	\$300.00	12.44	
Fence Construction	90.00	5.60	
Volunteer Workers	(25.00)	25.00	\$43.04

The volunteer worker charge is a charge authorized by the Chancery for all people who do parish work and are not compensated such as Ushers, Acolytes, Parish Society Workers, etc. It is a standard fee.

Public Liability insurance protects the legal liability of the Parish (and the Diocese) and is entirely different from and does not substitute for Workmen's Compensation Insurance.

Thank you for your letter concerning the meeting to discuss the support of the Missionary Sisters.

Since I will be unable to attend because I have my High School Classes of Religion on Mondays, without the aid of the Sisters, I would like to give you a general idea of our program both here in Calipatria and also in Niland.

We have CCD classes for the elementary school children on Saturday mornings from 9:00 to 11:00 in both places. One Sister comes to Calipatria once a week for the two hours. No Sister goes to Niland, so I have a lay person in charge.

The average weekly income of St. Patrick's is around \$ 135.00; of Niland, \$ 40.00. The monthly assessment for tithing of St. Patrick's is one hundred dollars (I wish it were only half, since we are in dire need of a new church); Niland is exempt.

Dear Monsignor Eagen:-

I am sorry that Niland was deliquent as far as the Seminary collection was concerned. Actually, I was under the impression that it was exempt since it is now only a mission attached to this Parish. However, I did give out some envelopes, but since the income was so small—about \$ 7.00—I included same with the Calipatria collection.

I might mention that Niland is a small town. In fact, it is much smaller than Westmorland—a mission of St. Margaret Mary's in Brawley, and not much larger than Heber, a mission of El Centro. Prior to my taking care of Niland last September, the Chancery Office was sending \$ 80.00 a month for the support of the priest, and the Extension Society was sending \$ 150.00 every quarter to help with parish expenses.

Incidentally, Monsignor, there is a small group of "Chicanos" in Niland that is "demanding" a resident Spanish-Speaking priest. In fact, in the near future a list of names on a petition may be received by the Bishop to this effect. The man—a Mr. Sadorra—who is going around with this petition is rarely seen in Church, but he is doing something for "La Causa"!

Most Reverend and dear Bishop Maher:-

Since Your Excellency has already been advised by the Diocesan Building Committee concerning the construction of a new church here in Calipatria, I wish to state that the need for such is most urgent.

In my letter to the Committee, I mentioned that the present structure was built in 1914, and that it is a small narrow building—with no side aisles. Should we ever have a severe earthquake or a flash fire, the results would be most disastrous.

The Mexican-Americans of this Community have appealed to me many times concerning a new church. Many of them are under the impression that the Church is not doing enough for them. As Your Excellency is fully aware, in these modern times, some of the minority groups have become quite aggressive.

During the past eight years we have been able to save about \$40,000.00—from donations, fiestas and savings. Moreover, we have reduced the Parish Debt from \$22,500.00 to the present \$2,800.00. With at least some help from the outside, I cannot foresee any future problems.

May I respectfully request that Your Excellency appeal to the Catholic Church Extension Society in our behalf. We will be most appreciative for this favor. I would love to give the people of this Parish the "Good News".



The other day during our deanery meeting in El Centro, one of the diocesan priests was talking about the Stewardship '72 program, and he mentioned the fact that some four hundred thousand dollars could not be accounted for. I had never heard of this, but he seemed to have all the data concerning this matter.

This may be somewhat presumptuous on my part, but if this is true, would there be any possibility of obtaining some of this money for the new Church we are trying to build here in Calipatria? We cannot do much of anything without help from the outside.

His Excellency, Bishop Maher, was gracious enough to write to the Extension Society on our behalf asking for \$ 45,000.00. However, I was informed by Father Cusack—and rather emphatically so—that such a large amount was out of the question. Actually, he said that there might be a slight chance of a ten thousand dollar grant.

With the amount we have been able to save up during the past eight years, plus an additional fifty thousand dollars, we could begin construction as soon as possible. What a wonderful impression this would make on the people of this Parish and upon the entire Imperial Valley.

Your Excellency,

When Father Koener came to the Calipatria parish, about ten years ago, this parish had an outstanding debt of over \$22,000. Due to his management, with the help of several lay people of the Parish, this debt has been liquidated.

During these years a building fund was also created and with a lot of hard work and soliciting this fund has been swelled to about \$70,000. People of all faiths have dondated to this fund, farmers, merchants, laborers, teachers and other people, of numerous walks of life. Now the time has come when these people who represent not only a majority of the parishoners, but a large majority of the community in which there are five Non-Catholic churches; are beginning to wender when they are going to see something happen as a result of their donations and efforts.

The present church, built in the 1920's, one of the oldest churches in Imperial Valley, is a frame structure of about 150 capacity. Besides being inadequate for the needs of this parish it has been termed a "fire trap" by engineers, who, if called on to inspect the structure, would have no other recourse than to condemn it. Inspections have been by-passed intentionally because of this knowledge.

Bishop Buddy was one of the first to realize that our parish was in need of a new church. Later Bishop Fury made similar observations. We believe that your Excellency realizes also the serious need for action to put the present fund to work-to answer the questions of people who are wanting "to see something happen".

It is our intention to ask Father Koerner to say a special mass that all the prayers of the community who are concerned with the expediting of matters concerning our

new church be answered. We ask also for your prayers concerning this matter.

## 50th anniversary

## Koerner looks back on life in a parish

By Chuck Harvey

CALIPATRIA — The Rev. Robert S. Koerner celebrated his 50th anniversary in the Catholic priesthood Thursday with a celebration here.

A bishop, fellow priests and parishioners came to St. Pátrick's Church where Koerner has served as priest for 23 years. The event gave Koerner a chance to reflect on his Calipatria parish.

Since 1963, Koerner has conducted Masses, marriages, baptisms, funerals and other duties as priest in Calipatria. "It is a nice little town," said Koerner. "I would rather be a priest here than in a large town like Los Angeles."

The city itself has changed little since his arrival. In 1963 the

population stood at about 2,000. Today there are about 2,600 residents.

In the meantime, St. Patrick's Church has grown considerably. When Koerner arrived from Billings, Mont., church members met in what is now used as a parish hall.

The building, which still stands near the present day chapel, held 150 to 200 people. "It is long and has two rows of pews," Koerner said.

People in the back rows had a difficult time seeing and hearing Mass, he recalled.

Mass was said twice each Sunday in the old chapel, Koerner said

The present St. Patrick's chapel is larger and better designed for viewing. Built about 11 years ago, the building has six sections of seats that sweep around the pulpit.

It gives everyone a good view during mass, Koerner said. Mass

is now said three times on Sunday and once each morning on weekdays.

The chapel will hold about 300 people and the Sunday Mass programs have been well attended, Koerner said. "I'm satisfied with it."

Snowbirds help boost attendance during winter months, Koerner added.

Most of the snowbirds are now gone, but attendance remained good last Sunday. A Coronation ceremony, held during the second Sunday Mass, attracted a large turnout.

The yearly ceremony is in honor, of the blessed mother, referred to by the church as "the queen of May."

Koerner, wearing a white vestment with a large blue cross printed on the front, spoke to the parishioners in both English and Spanish. The first Sunday Mass is said in English, the second is

## Bishop Robert H. Brom issues Pastoral Letter to People at St. Patrick, Calipatria

In the letter, Bishop Robert H. Brom personally apologizes to the victims and their families and offers to reach out to them with pastoral concern and care and to promote healing and reconciliation with them.

Fr. Robert Koerner, a priest of the Oblates of Mary Immaculate (OMI), died in 1999.

## A Pastoral Letter to the People of God in the Parish of St. Patrick, Calipatria

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

During my pastoral visit to St. Patrick's on October 20, 2002, I was for the first time informed that one of your former pastors had sexually abused children of families in the parish. Since then, I have been investigating this matter. You can be sure that I am resolved to address this and all cases of sexual abuse of minors by priests with "transparency and openness, within the confines of respect for the privacy and reputation of the individuals involved."

My investigation has revealed that Father Robert S. Koerner, OMI, sexually abused children throughout the years of his pastorate at St. Patrick's, from 1963 to 1990. I have met with a number of victims, but I am concerned that there may be others who were abused by Father Koerner when they were children. I therefore invite victims or their families, who have not already done so, to contact me so I might personally respond. I may be reached at 858-490-8310 or Post Office Box 85728, San Diego, CA 92186-5728.

I apologize to Father Koerner's victims and their families for the harm done to them. I wish to reach out to them with pastoral concern and care and to promote healing and reconciliation with them.

Once again, I want everyone to know that to my knowledge we have no priests who have sexually abused minors in active ministry in the Diocese of San Diego. Whenever I have been informed of sexual abuse by Church ministers, I have acted promptly to keep children and young people from risk.

Finally, please join me in prayerful support of the many good priests who are loving and selfless servants and of whom we can all be proud.

## 50th anniversary

## Koerner looks back on life in a parish

CALIPATRIA — The Rev. Robert S. Koerner celebrated his 50th anniversary in the Catholic priesthood Thursday with a celebration here.

A bishop, fellow priests and parishioners came to St. Patrick's Church where Koerner has served as priest for 23 years. The event gave Koerner a chance to reflect on his Calipatria parish.

Since 1963, Koerner has conducted Masses, marriages, baptisms, funerals and other duties as priest in Calipatria. "It is a nice little town," said Koerner. "I would rather be a priest here than in a large town like Los Angeles."

The city itself has changed little since his arrival. In 1963 the

population stood at about 2,000. Today there are about 2,600 residents.

In the meantime, St. Patrick's Church has grown considerably. When Koerner arrived from Billings, Mont., church members met in what is now used as a parish hall.


The building, which still stands near the present day chapel, held 150 to 200 people. "It is long and has two rows of pews," Koerner said

People in the back rows had a difficult time seeing and hearing Mass, he recalled.

Mass was said twice each Sunday in the old chapel, Koerner said.

The present St. Patrick's chapel is larger and better designed for viewing. Built about 11 years ago, the building has six sections of seats that sweep around the pulpit.

It gives everyone a good view during mass, Koerner said. Mass

is now said three times on Sunday and once each morning on week-days.

The chapel will hold about 300 people and the Sunday Mass programs have been well attended, Koerner said. "I'm satisfied with it."

Snowbirds help boost attendance during winter months, Koerner added

Most of the snowbirds are now gone, but attendance remained good last Sunday. A Coronation ceremony, held during the second Sunday Mass, attracted a large turnout.

The yearly ceremony is in honor, of the blessed mother, referred to by the church as "the queen of May."

Koerner, wearing a white vestment with a large blue cross printed on the front, spoke to the parishioners in both English and Spanish. The first Sunday Mass is said in English, the second is


