

**CERTIFICATION OF AWARENESS OF CHILD ABUSE REPORTING LAW**  
(P.C. 11166)

**Definitions:** The following are reportable conditions:

- Physical abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Child exploitation, child pornography and child prostitution
- Neglect
- Extreme corporal punishment resulting in injury
- Willful cruelty or unjustifiable punishment

**Who Reports:** The following individuals are legally mandated reporters:

Child care custodians ("...certified pupil personnel employee of any public or private school; and administrators and employees of public or private youth centers, youth recreation programs, and youth organizations who have been trained in the duties imposed by this article...")

- Health practitioners
- Commercial film or photographic print processors in specified instances
- Child Protective Agencies

**When to Report:** A telephone report must be made immediately when the reporter observes a child in his/her professional capacity or within the scope of his/her employment and has knowledge of, or has reasonable suspicion that the child has been abused. A written report, on a standard form, must be sent within 36 hours after the telephone report has been made.

**To Whom Do You Report:** In San Diego County, reports should be called in to the Child Protective Services Hotline. In San Diego county, call (619) 560-2191. In Imperial Valley, call (800) 344-6000. Commercial film or photographic processors report only to law enforcement.

**Individual Responsibility:** Any individual who is named in the reporting law must report abuse. If the individual confers with a superior and a decision is made that the superior file the report, one report is sufficient. However if the superior disagrees, the individual with the original suspicion must report.

**Anonymous Reporting:** Mandated reporters are required to give their names. Non-mandated reporters may report anonymously. Child protective agencies are required to keep the mandated reporter's name confidential, unless a court orders the information disclosed.

**Immunity:** Any legally mandated reporter has immunity when making a report. In the event a civil suit is filed against the reporter, reimbursement for fees incurred in the suit will occur up to \$50,000. No individual can be dismissed, disciplined or harassed for making a report of suspected child abuse.

**Liability:** Legally mandated reporters can be criminally liable for failing to report suspected abuse. The penalty for this misdemeanor is up to six months in county jail, a fine of not more than \$1,000 or both. Mandated reporters can also be civilly liable for failure to report.

**Notification Regarding Abuse:** You are not legally required to notify the parents that you are making a report; however, it is often beneficial to let the parents know you are reporting for benefit of a future relationship.

I have clarified any information listed above which I do not understand, and am now aware of my reporting responsibilities, and am willing to comply. I have also requested an explanation of reporting policies within this agency and understand them as well.

## POLICY ON SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMS

Every parish and Catholic school in the Diocese of San Diego must implement a safe environment program to ensure that its children and young people who worship, study or participate in its activities can do so in the safest and most secure setting possible.

- I. A safe environment program begins with screening all adults who work with children and young people on a regular basis. Following screening, they must acknowledge in writing that they understand and will abide by the *Diocesan Code of Ethical Standards for Church Ministers*.
- II. A safe environment program requires the ongoing training of parents, educators, church ministers, volunteers and others regularly involved with minors as to the issue of child abuse, including sexual abuse. This training should include:

- A. Definition: What constitutes child abuse?
- B. Prevention: What action, policies and procedures prevent child abuse?
- C. Identification: How does one identify instances of child abuse? What signs should one look for in a child who may be abused? In a person who may be abusing a child?
- D. Response: What action should one take when one believes that child abuse may be occurring?
- E. Reporting: What are the laws and policies regarding the reporting of child abuse?

- III. A safe environment program includes the ongoing training of children and young people with age appropriate education pertaining to their personal safety and with direction as to when they should seek assistance from a trusted adult.

Every parish and Catholic school should designate a safe environment coordinator or couple to ensure implementation of its program.



## POLICY ON SEXUAL ABUSE BY CHURCH MINISTERS

### Diocese of San Diego

The Diocese of San Diego recognizes that sexual abuse by Church ministers constitutes one of the most serious breaches of trust in human relationships. It can have devastating consequences above all for victims and their families, but also for the Church ministers involved and for the Church community at large. Therefore, to prevent abuse and to maintain a safe environment for children, to deal appropriately with allegations and cases of abuse, and to respond compassionately to victims of abuse, the Diocese of San Diego sets forth this policy.

The Diocese of San Diego is committed to prevent sexual abuse and to maintain a safe environment for children and young people by:

1. publishing standards of conduct for Church ministers who have regular contact with children and young people;
2. screening applicants for ordained and lay Church ministry which involves regular contact with minors;
3. promoting "safe environment" programs in collaboration with parents, educators and community leaders.

The Diocese of San Diego is committed to deal appropriately with allegations and cases of sexual abuse by:

1. announcing procedures for reporting complaints of sexual abuse;
2. responding promptly to all allegations of sexual abuse;
3. offering immediate pastoral care to persons who claim to have been sexually abused as minors;
4. complying with the requirements of civil law in reporting allegations of sexual abuse to public authorities and cooperating with their investigation;
5. engaging a review board to assist in addressing allegations of sexual abuse;
6. temporarily relieving alleged offenders of their ministry, when there is the probability of sexual abuse, in accord with Church law;
7. following procedures that reflect a commitment to transparency and openness, within the confines of respect for the rights and the reputation of the individuals involved;
8. permanently removing offenders from ministry, when it is admitted or established that a criminal offense of sexual abuse has occurred, in accord with Church law;
9. taking steps to restore the good name of persons cleared of false allegations.

The Diocese of San Diego is committed, above all, to reach out with pastoral concern and care to victims of sexual abuse and their families, and to promote healing and reconciliation with them.

## CHILD ABUSE REPORTING

120 All diocesan and parish personnel, identified as "child care custodians" by law (cf. PC11166) must be made aware of the California Child Abuse Reporting Law PC 11166 and shall sign a Certification of Awareness verifying that he or she has knowledge of the provisions of the law and will comply with its provisions.

### [Certification of Awareness]

Certification of Awareness forms shall be provided to employees and volunteers by immediate supervisors (e.g., Pastor, DCM, Coordinator, etc.). Current personnel identified as "child care custodians" must complete this form immediately. New personnel shall complete this form at initiation of service. A copy of the Certification of Awareness form should be given to the personnel member who has signed it.

Signed forms are to be kept on file by the immediate supervisor for all personnel during the term of service and for one year thereafter.

121 Child abuse reporting shall be handled in the following manner:

1. All educational ministry volunteers who suspect that the physical or mental health or welfare of a child or youth may be adversely affected by abuse or neglect shall report it to the DCM, who shall then call the Child Protective Services.

2. A DCM or Coordinator of Youth Ministry who suspects that the physical or mental health or welfare of a child or youth may be adversely affected by abuse or neglect shall report it directly to Child Protective Services.

3. The Pastor should be promptly informed that a report is being filed; to the extent possible, before it is filed.

## A SUMMARY OF YOUR RIGHTS UNDER THE FAIR CREDIT REPORTING ACT

The federal Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA) is designed to promote accuracy, fairness, and privacy of information in the files of every "consumer reporting agency" (CRA). Most CRAs are credit bureaus that gather and sell information about you – such as if you pay your bills on time or filed bankruptcy – to credits, employers, landlords, and other businesses. You can find the complete text of the FCRA, 15 U.S.C. §§ 1681-1681u, at the Federal Trade Commission's web site (<http://www.ftc.gov>). The FCRA gives you specific rights, as outlined below. You may have additional rights under state law. You may contact a state or local consumer protection agency or a state attorney general to learn those rights.

- **You must be told if information in your file has been used against you.**

Anyone who uses information from a CRA to take action against you – such as denying an application for credit, insurance, or employment – must tell you, and give you the name, address, and phone number of the CRA that provided the consumer report.

- **You can find out what is in your file.** At your request, a CRA must give you the information in your file, and a list of everyone who has requested it recently. There is no charge for the report if a person has taken action against you because of information supplied by the CRA, if you request the report within 60 days of receiving notice of the action. You also are entitled to one free report every twelve months upon request if you certify that (1) you are unemployed and plan to seek employment within 60 days, (2) you are on welfare, or (3) your report is inaccurate due to fraud. Otherwise, a CRA may charge you up to eight dollars.

- **You can dispute inaccurate information with the CRA.** If you tell a CRA that your file contains inaccurate information, the CRA must investigate the items (usually within 30 days) by presenting to its information source all relevant evidence you submit, unless your dispute is frivolous. The source must review your evidence and report its findings to the CRA. (The source also must advise national CRAs -- to which it has provided the data -- of any error.) The CRA must give you a written report of the investigation, and a copy of your report if the investigation results in any change. If the CRA's investigation does not resolve the dispute, you may add a brief statement to your file. The CRA must normally include a summary of your statement in future reports. If an item is deleted or a dispute statement is filed, you may ask that anyone who has recently received your report be notified of the change.

- **Inaccurate information must be corrected or deleted.** A CRA must remove or correct inaccurate or unverified information from its files, usually within 30 days after you dispute it. However, the CRA is not required to remove accurate data from your file unless it is outdated (as described below) or cannot be verified. If your dispute results in any change to your report, the CRA cannot reinsert into your file a disputed item unless the information source verifies its accuracy and completeness. In addition, the CRA must give you a written notice telling you it has reinserted the item. The notice must include the name, address and phone number of the information source.

- **You can dispute inaccurate items with the source of the information.** If you tell anyone -- such as a creditor who reports to a CRA -- that you dispute an item, they may not then report the information to a CRA without including a notice of your dispute. In addition,

once you've notified the source of the error in writing, it may not continue to report the information if it is, in fact, an error.

- **Outdated information may not be reported.** In most cases, a CRA may not report negative information that is more than seven years old; ten years for bankruptcies.

- **Access to your file is limited.** A CRA may provide information about you

only to people with a need recognized by the FCRA - - usually to consider an application with a creditor, insurer, employer, landlord, or other business.

- **Your consent is required for reports that are provided to employers, or reports that contain medical information.** A CRA may not give out information about you to your employer, or prospective employer, without your written consent. A CRA may not report medical information about you to creditors, insurers, or employers without your permission.

- **You may choose to exclude your name from CRA lists for unsolicited credit and insurance offers.** Creditors and insurers may use file information as the basis for sending you unsolicited offers of credit or insurance. Such offers must include a toll-free phone number for you to call if you want your name and address removed from future lists. If you call, you must be kept off the lists for two years. If you request, complete, and return the CRA form provided for this purpose, you must be taken off the list indefinitely.

- **You may seek damages from violators.** If a CRA, a user or (in some cases) a provider of CRA data, violates the FCRA, you may sue them in state or federal court.

The FCRA gives several different federal agencies authority to enforce the FCRA:

#### California Notice:

You have the right under Section 1786.22 of the California Civil Code to contact ChoicePoint during normal business hours to obtain your file for your review. You may obtain such information as follows:

1. In person at ChoicePoint's office at the address listed above. You will need to furnish proper identification prior to receiving your file. You may have someone accompany you and should inform such person that they will also have to present reasonable identification. If you want ChoicePoint to disclose to or discuss your information with this third party, you may be required to provide a written statement granting ChoicePoint permission to do so.
2. By certified mail, if you make a written request (and provide proper identification) to have your file sent to a specified addressee.
3. By telephone, if you have previously made a written request and provided proper identification.

ChoicePoint has trained personnel to explain any information that is furnished to you and to explain any information that is coded.

## CODE OF ETHICAL STANDARDS FOR CHURCH MINISTERS

### Diocese of San Diego

#### Preamble

This Code of Ethics is based on the fact that Church ministers must always uphold Christian values and conduct as promoted by the Gospel and taught by the Church. It does not presume to provide the answer to all the ethical questions facing Church ministers nor is it intended to supersede canon or civil law. Its purpose, rather, is to establish a set of general ethical standards for Church ministers. These standards will help to delineate boundaries for appropriate behavior in ministry.

The term "Church minister" is used to indicate all those who represent the Church by virtue of office or designated position. This Code will be used in their formation for ministry, and in holding them accountable to live within the ethical standards it sets.

Responsibility for adherence to this Code of Ethical Standards rests with the Church ministers themselves. Violations will be dealt with by the appropriate employing or appointing authority through action that may, if necessary, lead to exclusion from ministry.

The conduct of Church ministers, both public and private, has the potential to inspire and motivate people, or to scandalize them and weaken their faith. Church ministers must always keep this in mind.

#### General Principles

Five key principles underlie the ethical stance of this Code: ecclesial commitment, integrity, respect for others, personal well-being and ministerial competence.

##### Ecclesial Commitment

Church ministers should know Christ and seek to make him known. They should be familiar with the scriptures and be able to apply them to day-to-day situations. Church ministers must have a deep commitment to the Church as evidenced by adherence to Church teaching, loyalty to tradition, attentiveness to present demands, and readiness to take on future challenges. This commitment looks beyond the boundaries of parish faith communities to embrace the wider Church, diocesan and universal.

##### Integrity

Church ministers are expected to be persons of integrity who conduct themselves in a manner that is open, honest and above board. This requires that they be conscientious in their ministry and morally upright in their personal lives.

### Respect for Others

Church ministers must respect the rights, dignity and worth of everyone regardless of their degree of participation in the faith community, cultural background or economic status. They should strive to be sensitive to issues of aging, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, physical and mental disabilities, and language, since these all affect how the message of the Gospel is accepted and lived out.

### Personal Well-Being

Church ministers are expected to give proper attention to their own human, spiritual and intellectual well-being.

Church ministers should show appropriate regard for their own physical, mental and emotional health, and should promote the personal well-being of one another as well. They should determine healthy limits in their work environment and live within these limits as much as possible. They should make use of allotted time for vacation and days away from the work environment.

Church ministers should maintain an active prayer life and properly address their own spiritual needs in order to nurture their faith and minister effectively to others.

They should strive to grow in their knowledge of the faith and faith-related issues, both on their own initiative and by participating in opportunities available to them.

### Ministerial Competence

Church ministers should develop and maintain a high level of competence in their particular ministries by participating in the ongoing formation required of them. They shall not attempt to provide services in those areas in which they lack competence.

## Ethical Standards

### Christian Behavior and Environment

The lives of Church ministers must be marked by Christian virtue. In both their personal life and ministry, they must strive to create environments in which all are treated with dignity, charity and respect. Church ministers are to live the virtue of chastity according to their Christian state of life whether single, married or celibate.

Church ministers, moreover, must not betray the trust of the faith community by any kind of misconduct whatsoever, including, but not limited to, harassment, exploitation and abuse. In particular, sexual misconduct by Church ministers, especially in the context of a ministerial relationship, is never acceptable. A ministerial relationship is created whenever a person in his or her capacity as a Church minister interacts with another person.

Church ministers are obligated to know and to abide by existing law and diocesan policies as these apply to all forms of misconduct. Those who work with youth on a regular basis are required to participate in safe environment training programs which address child abuse, including sexual abuse, and cover prevention, identification, response and reporting.

#### Administration

Church ministers in administrative positions should:

- Treat employees and volunteers according to the demands of justice and with charity, fully embracing the social teaching of the Church.
- Make decisions consistent with civil and canon law.
- Never use their position to exercise unreasonable or inappropriate power and authority.
- Exercise responsible stewardship with Church resources.
- Observe diocesan policies and guidelines for ministry and fiscal management.

#### Conduct in Counseling

In providing counseling, including spiritual direction, Church ministers should:

- Function within the limits of their competence and refer counselees to other professionals when appropriate.
- Respect legitimate expectancies for confidentiality.
- Make sure there will be no negative consequences before entering into a counseling relationship with someone with whom they have a pre-existing relationship.
- Respect appropriate boundaries, never engaging in sexual intimacies and avoiding any physical contact that could be misconstrued.
- Conduct sessions in appropriate settings and never use electronic means to record them without explicit permission from the counselee.
- Maintain a log of the times and places of counseling sessions for each person being counseled.

#### Ministry with Minors

In ministry with minors Church ministers should:

- Maintain open, trustworthy relationships that are marked by personal and professional integrity.



- Avoid exclusive relationships with minors and be cautious of minors desiring such a relationship.
- Avoid any physical contact that can be misconstrued by either minors or adults.
- Never provide minors with alcohol or illegal drugs or with any sexually explicit material.
- Never offer minors overnight accommodations in rectories or other personal residences unless additional adult supervision is present.
- Be aware of their own and others' vulnerability and, whenever possible, use a team approach to ministry.

#### Confidentiality

Church ministers must respect the confidentiality of information which they have acquired in the course of counseling, spiritual direction or other ministerial encounters. Without prejudice to the seal of Confession, they should:

- Discuss the nature of confidentiality and its limitations at the outset of a ministerial relationship with assurance that confidentiality will be respected.  
  
For example, in beginning what is clearly a counseling relationship, the Church minister should inform a counselee that confidentiality is limited when there is clear and imminent danger to the counselee or to others.
- Disclose confidential information only for compelling professional reasons or as required by law.
- Exercise great care to limit the content of shared information when disclosure is necessary.
- Safeguard the confidentiality of information maintained in notes and files or by electronic means.

#### Conflicts of Interest

Church ministers should avoid situations that might present a conflict of interest since the existence, or even the appearance, of a conflict of interest can call integrity into question. They should:

- Disclose to proper authorities all relevant factors that could create or be seen as a conflict of interest.
- Be open and honest with all parties concerned when a conflict of interest arises.
- Refuse gifts and testamentary bequests of money or property which should be received for the benefit of the Church.

## POLICY ON SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

### Introduction

Sexual misconduct is contrary to the principles and values which we hold as Catholics. Therefore, beyond any provisions of law, sexual misconduct by personnel of the Diocese of San Diego is totally inappropriate and unacceptable.

All personnel of the diocese shall comply with applicable laws as well as the policies of the diocese regarding incidents of actual or suspected sexual misconduct.

### Definitions

Sexual misconduct is here defined as any sexual conduct which is civilly unlawful, e.g., sexual abuse, sexual exploitation, and sexual harassment.

The word diocesan is meant to include all entities operating under the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego, a corporation sole, e.g., the diocese, parishes and schools.

Diocesan personnel means all those whose source of compensation is a diocesan entity, and those whose volunteer services are formally accepted by a diocesan entity.

### Reporting Requirements

California State Law, Article 2.5 of the Penal Code, provides reporting requirements for child abuse whether sexual abuse, physical non-accidental injury, or neglect. Diocesan personnel must comply with those legal requirements.

In addition, diocesan personnel who have actual knowledge, or reasonable cause to suspect, that a child or an adult has been subject to sexual misconduct by diocesan personnel, must make an immediate report to the office of the chancellor. This policy is not to be construed in such a way that it would violate the priest/penitent relationship of the Sacrament of Penance.

### Investigation and Response

Each reported incident will be investigated with a high level of confidentiality, as well as concern and care for alleged victims, alleged perpetrators, and others affected.

If there is reason to believe that the report may be true, pending the outcome of the internal and any external investigation, the alleged perpetrator, if compensated by the diocese, will be placed on administrative leave; if a volunteer, services to the diocese will be suspended. At the same time

there will be immediate outreach to alleged victims and others affected.

Personnel of the diocese who admit to, do not contest, or are found guilty of sexual misconduct shall be subject to appropriate administrative or disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment and/or ministerial duties.

#### **Communication**

Within the confines of respect for privacy, authorized diocesan representatives will deal as openly as possible with members of the community involved. Any media contact or inquiries will be addressed only by the bishop or his delegate.

#### **False Accusation**

In the case of false accusations or unsubstantiated claims, both civil and canon law provide penalties for defamation of character in which individuals become victims of calumny and detraction.

#### **Applicability**

This policy applies to all diocesan personnel.

#### **Forms**

Refer to appendices 1 and 2 for forms which can be used in appropriate circumstances.

## Responding to Sexual Abuse

The Diocese of San Diego is committed to deal effectively with allegations of sexual abuse by a policy which requires:

- Offering immediate pastoral care to persons who claim to have been victims of sexual abuse.
- Reporting allegations of sexual abuse to public authorities and cooperating with their investigation.
- Promoting transparency and openness, within the confines of respect for the rights and the reputation of the individuals involved.
- Removing offenders from ministry when it is admitted or established that a criminal offense of sexual abuse has occurred, all in accord with Church law.
- Reaching out with pastoral concern and care to victims of sexual abuse and their families to foster healing and reconciliation with them.

## Reporting Allegations of Sexual Misconduct

The Diocese of San Diego treats all allegations of sexual misconduct seriously and deals with them in a prompt, confidential and thorough manner.

- Every person has the right to have appropriate boundaries respected.
- Every person has the right to challenge any comment or behavior that is perceived to be sexually oriented.

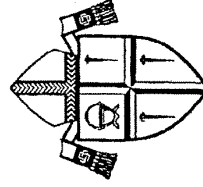

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



In ministry with God's people we must strive to create worship, educational and work environments where we all treat each other with dignity, charity and respect.

Our obligation to minister in healthy and holy relationships flows from the mission given to us by Jesus, in whose name we serve.

## Sexual Misconduct in a Ministerial Relationship

A MINISTERIAL RELATIONSHIP is created whenever a person in his or her capacity as a Church official or leader interacts with another person. This applies to:

- clergy (bishops, priests, deacons)
- members of religious communities (priests, brothers, sisters)
- all lay Church ministers (employees and volunteers)
- spiritual directors and counselors
- school personnel
- seminary personnel
- coaches and camp leaders.

SEXUAL MISCONDUCT is a general term that includes, but is not limited to, sexual harassment, sexual exploitation and sexual abuse.

- Sexual harassment is sexualized language or conduct found to be unwelcome and offensive.
- Sexual exploitation is sexual conduct which violates a trust-relationship.
- Sexual abuse is sexual conduct between an adult and a minor or a "vulnerable adult" as defined by law.

## Preventing Sexual Misconduct

The Diocese of San Diego requires Church ministers to abide by its policies prohibiting sexual misconduct. The diocese also makes clear the procedures for dealing with incidents of sexual misconduct.

It is always the responsibility of Church ministers to respect and maintain the appropriate emotional and relational boundaries of those they serve or with whom they work. When Church ministers violate a ministerial relationship by any form of sexual misconduct they are taking advantage of the vulnerability of those who are seeking their ministry.

All candidates for the priesthood and permanent diaconate undergo a thorough psychological assessment before being accepted. Priests and deacons comply with requirements for fingerprinting.

School personnel and religious education instructors are screened for the ability to work safely with children. They are offered instruction on appropriate professional conduct with students and are provided information to help recognize and deal with issues of child sexual abuse.

The Diocese of San Diego is committed, in collaboration with parents, educators and community leaders, to maintain a safe environment for children and young people.

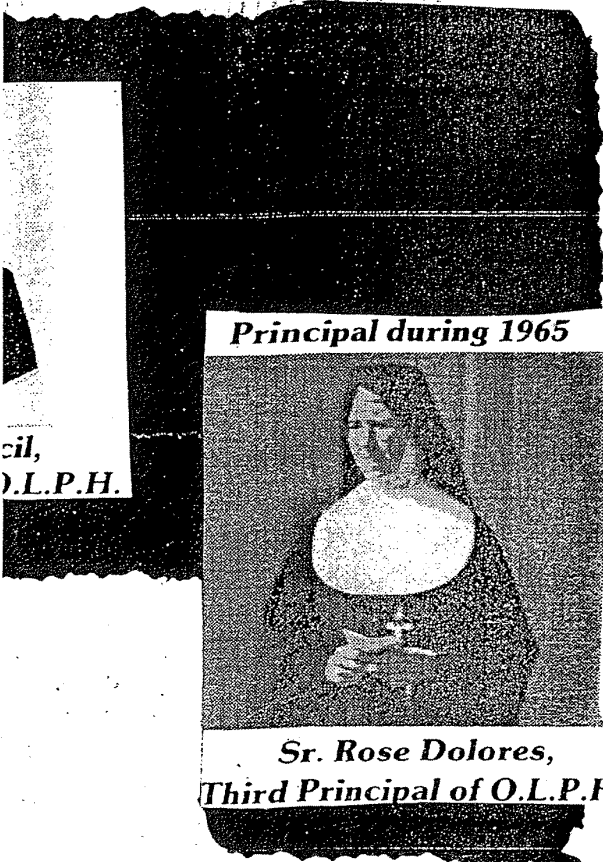

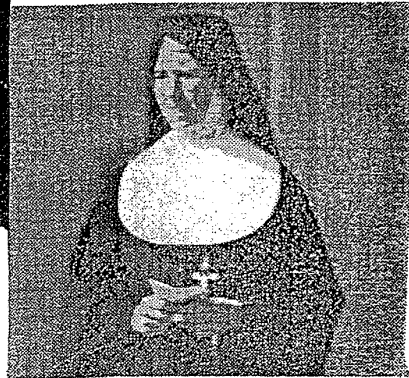

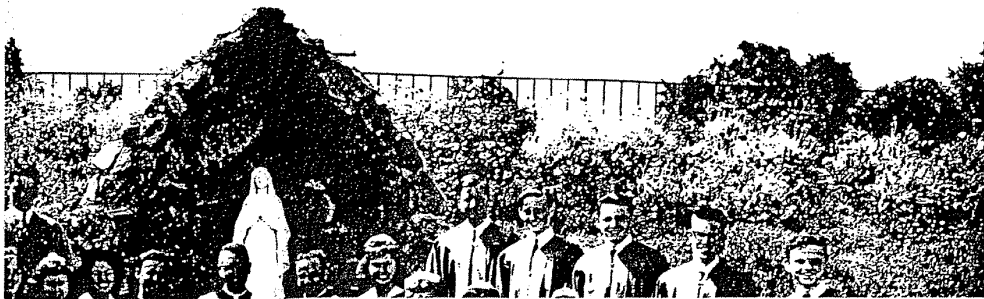

## POLICY ON SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

### Introduction

Sexual misconduct is contrary to the principles and values which we hold as Catholics. Therefore, beyond any provisions of law, sexual misconduct by personnel of the Diocese of San Diego is totally inappropriate and unacceptable.

All personnel of the diocese shall comply with applicable laws as well as the policies of the diocese regarding incidents of actual or suspected sexual misconduct.

### Definitions

Sexual misconduct is here defined as any sexual conduct which is civilly unlawful, e.g., sexual abuse, sexual exploitation, and sexual harassment.

The word diocesan is meant to include all entities operating under the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego, a corporation sole, e.g., the diocese, parishes and schools.

Diocesan personnel means all those whose source of compensation is a diocesan entity, and those whose volunteer services are formally accepted by a diocesan entity.

### Reporting Requirements

California State Law, Article 2.5 of the Penal Code, provides reporting requirements for child abuse whether sexual abuse, physical non-accidental injury, or neglect. Diocesan personnel must comply with those legal requirements.

In addition, diocesan personnel who have actual knowledge, or reasonable cause to suspect, that a child or an adult has been subject to sexual misconduct by diocesan personnel, must make an immediate report to the office of the chancellor. This policy is not to be construed in such a way that it would violate the priest/penitent relationship of the Sacrament of Penance.

### Investigation and Response

Each reported incident will be investigated with a high level of confidentiality, as well as concern and care for alleged victims, alleged perpetrators, and others affected.

If there is reason to believe that the report may be true, pending the outcome of the internal and any external investigation, the alleged perpetrator, if compensated by the diocese, will be placed

on administrative leave; if a volunteer, services to the diocese will be suspended. At the same time there will be immediate outreach to alleged victims and others affected.

Personnel of the diocese who admit to, do not contest, or are found guilty of sexual misconduct shall be subject to appropriate administrative or disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment and/or ministerial duties.

#### Communication

Within the confines of respect for privacy, authorized diocesan representatives will deal as openly as possible with members of the community involved. Any media contact or inquiries will be addressed only by the bishop or his delegate.

#### False Accusation

In the case of false accusations or unsubstantiated claims, both civil and canon law provide penalties for defamation of character in which individuals become victims of calumny and detraction.

#### Applicability

This policy applies to all diocesan personnel.

**CERTIFICATION OF AWARENESS OF CHILD ABUSE REPORTING LAW (P.C. 11166)  
COMPENSATED PROFESSIONAL STAFF FORM**

**Definitions:** The following are reportable conditions:

- Physical abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Child exploitation, child pornography and child prostitution
- Neglect
- Extreme corporal punishment resulting in injury
- Willful cruelty or unjustifiable punishment

**Who Reports:** The following individuals are legally mandated reporters:

Child care custodians ("...certified pupil personnel employee of any public or private school; and administrators and employees of public or private youth centers, youth recreation programs, and youth organizations who have been trained in the duties imposed by this article...")

- Health practitioners
- Commercial film or photographic print processors in specified instances
- Child Protective Agencies

**When to Report:** A telephone report must be made immediately when the reporter observes a child in his/her professional capacity or within the scope of his/her employment and has knowledge of, or has reasonable suspicion that the child has been abused. A written report, on a standard form, must be sent within 36 hours after the telephone report has been made.

**To Whom Do You Report:** In San Diego County, reports should be called in to the Child Protective Services Hotline. In San Diego county, call (619) 560-2191. In Imperial Valley, call (800) 344-6000. Commercial film or photographic processors report only to law enforcement.

**Individual Responsibility:** Any individual who is named in the reporting law must report abuse. If the individual confers with a superior and a decision is made that the superior file the report, one report is sufficient. However if the superior disagrees, the individual with the original suspicion must report.

**Anonymous Reporting:** Mandated reporters are required to give their names. Non-mandated reporters may report anonymously. Child protective agencies are required to keep the mandated reporter's name confidential, unless a court orders the information disclosed.

**Immunity:** Any legally mandated reporter has immunity when making a report. In the event a civil suit is filed against the reporter, reimbursement for fees incurred in the suit will occur up to \$50,000. No individual can be dismissed, disciplined or harassed for making a report of suspected child abuse.

**Liability:** Legally mandated reporters can be criminally liable for failing to report suspected abuse. The penalty for this misdemeanor is up to six months in county jail, a fine of not more than \$1,000 or both. Mandated reporters can also be civilly liable for failure to report.

**Notification Regarding Abuse:** You are not legally required to notify the parents that you are making a report; however, it is often beneficial to let the parents know you are reporting for benefit of a future relationship.

I understand that I am a legally mandated reporter. I have received and reviewed the above summary of reporting requirements under Penal Code §11166 as well as a copy of diocesan policies regarding the reporting of child abuse. I understand the law and policies and am willing to comply with the requirements of my position.

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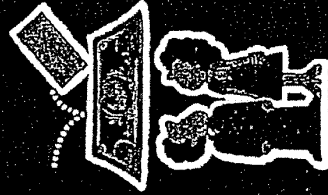

By the way Michael says he is interested in being a priest. We just have to pray that if it is God's will, he will be able to go to the seminary and become one.

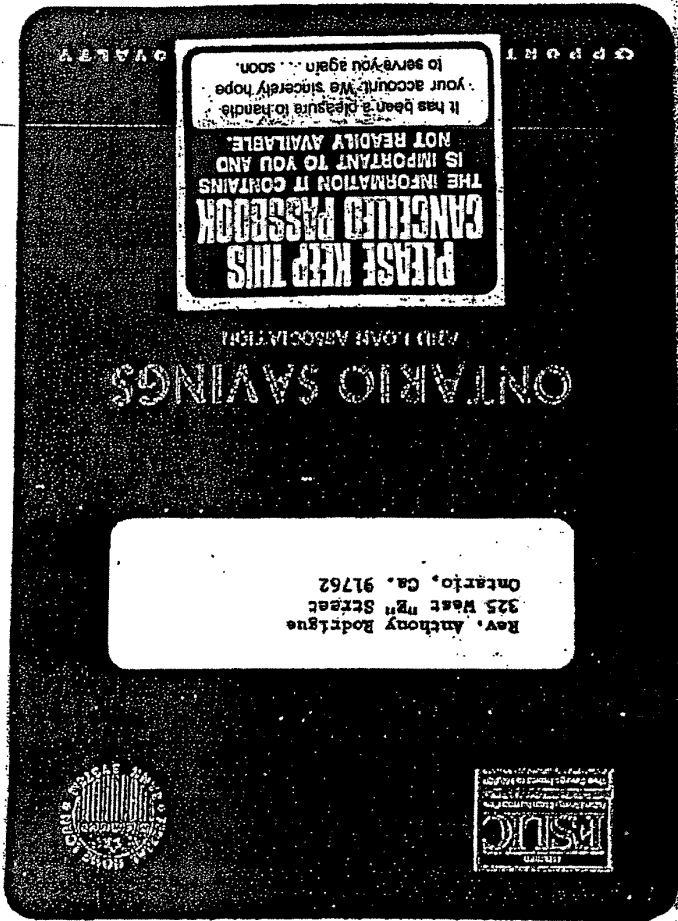
Wanda asked me to ask you, would you be able to have Michael visit you for a week or so in June or July? He wants to fly over there.



INCARDINATION IN THE DIOCESE OF SAN BERNARDINO

- A. Non-incardinated priests are eligible to request incardination in the Diocese after serving a minimum of three years in the Diocese.
- B. Although there may be exceptions in particular circumstances, a priest seeking incardination will be expected to have served in at least two different local assignments in the Diocese.
- C. The Personnel Board and/or its delegate shall be responsible for making a recommendation to the Bishop regarding the acceptance or non-acceptance of a priest's request for incardination. Such recommendations will be based on:
  - (1) a letter of permission from the petitioner's ordinary or religious superior stating permission for the petitioner to seek incardination into the Diocese, and attesting that the petitioner is a priest in good standing in the diocese or congregation
  - (2) a resume written by the petitioner including:
    - (a) a personal history, date and place of birth, upbringing, schools attended and degrees received, significant illness, special talents or skills in the ministry, any physical and/or emotional problems, if any.
    - (b) A certificate of health from a doctor or doctors appointed by the Diocese
    - (c) Ministerial history - when and where ordained, assignments held, reasons for transfers, etc
    - (d) Reasons for requesting incardination in the Diocese
    - (e) Reasons for leaving former diocese or congregation
    - (f) Types of assignments for which he feels suited
    - (g) Types of assignments for which he feels unsuited

- (h) Certification of having joined Social Security and enrolled in the priest's pension fund. Or, absolute certification of being cared for in another plan other than the two cited in the last sentence. A priest upon coming into the Diocese of San Bernardino is to submit a signed letter stating that he is a member of social security and wishes to join the pension plan.
- (3) Letters of Recommendation
- (a) A letter from each of the pastors or superiors of the institutions in which the petitioner has served in the Diocese, evaluating the priestliness and ministerial skills of the petitioner, and indicating the writer's willingness to be associated with the petitioner in the ministry.
- (b) Letters from at least three other priests of the Diocese evaluating the priestliness and ministerial skills of the petitioner, and indicating the writer's willingness to be associated with the petitioner in the ministry
- (4) Final decision on the request for incardination is the responsibility of the Bishop in consultation with the Consultors
- (5) At the end of five years of service in the Diocese, any priest from another Diocese, or any exclaustated religious intending to seek incardination in the Diocese must apply for incardination. If incardination is refused, the priest will either return to his own Diocese or religious community, or if permitted by the Bishop to continue working in the Diocese of San Bernardino he must have the proper authorization of his own Bishop or religious superiors.
- (6) In the case of a negative decision on his request for incardination, the non-incardinated priest has the option of requesting a hearing before the Bishop and/or his delegate or the Personnel Board.
- (7) After three years service, a non-incardinated priest is to ask for an evaluation.

I. Temporary Faculties

1. The Episcopal Vicar of the area is the one who grants faculties to priests who will be in the Diocese for a period less than two months.
2. The Episcopal Vicar will forward to the Pastoral Office, c/o Co-Chancellor for Pastoral Affairs, a notice stating he has granted faculties to a priest. In it the Episcopal Vicar will state:
  - A. Name of the priest.
  - B. What faculties have been granted.
  - C. What Diocese or Religious Order the priest belongs.
  - D. The reason why the priest is in the Diocese.

II. Long-Term Faculties

1. Request for Long-term faculties, defined as for a period of more than two months, must be obtained from the Pastoral Office.
2. Request for Long-term faculties must contain information listed in paragraph I. (2) above.

I. Preamble

- a. The priestly ministry in the Diocese of San Bernardino is, and has been enhanced by the service of many non-incardinated priests who have associated themselves with the priests of the Diocese in the service of the people. As a more comprehensive personnel policy governing the service of Diocesan priests emerges, it is important that it also reflect the service provided by priests who are not incardinated into the Diocese or assigned to a service in the Diocese by their religious superiors with the approval of the Bishop. It is the purpose of the following to provide a policy whereby such service may be utilized to the best advantage of the people ministered to and the priests desiring to provide such ministry.
- b. Definition of Terms - For the purpose of this policy statement, non-incardinated priests are considered to be:
  - (1) Clergy incardinated in other Dioceses who wish to serve in the Diocese of San Bernardino.
  - (2) Religious clergy other than those regularly assigned by their own religious superiors to a parish or apostolate staffed by their religious community with the approval of the church, and who wish to serve in the Diocese of San Bernardino.

II. For the purpose of this policy statement, service in the Diocese of San Bernardino is construed to mean the fact or intention of receiving an official assignment in the Diocese. It does not refer to those priests who serve temporarily in a substitute capacity, e.g., supplying for summer vacation or short sabbatical leaves. Ordinarily, such temporary services should not extend beyond two months.

III. Acceptance and Assignment of Non-Incardinated Priests

1. Full authority and competency for acceptance, assignment and continuation of service of non-incardinated clergy pertains to the Bishop of San Bernardino and to those persons or committees with whom he chooses to share the responsibility for this work.

2. The personnel board of the Diocese and/or its delegates shall be responsible for:
  - a) Receiving all requests for assignment and placement from non-incardinated priests.
  - b) Interviewing priests requesting to serve in the Diocese.
  - c) Making recommendations to the Bishop concerning the assignment and evaluation of all non-incardinated priests.

IV. Documentation Required:

1. Letter of permission from the priest's ordinary or religious superior clearly stating that the priest is in good standing in his Diocese or congregation and that he now has permission to work in the Diocese.
2. A resume written by the priest seeking service in the Diocese to include:
  - a. Personal history, date and place of birth, upbringing, schools attended and degrees received, significant illnesses, special talents or skills in ministry, physical and emotional health at the present moment.
  - b. Ministerial history - where and when ordained, number and type of assignments held, reasons for transfer.
  - c. Reasons for requesting to serve in the Diocese.
  - d. Types of assignment for which he feels suited.
  - e. Types of assignments for which he feels unsuited.
3. Letters of Recommendation from the petitioner's ordinary or major religious superior containing a statement concerning his physical and emotional health as well as a statement of the petitioners prior service.

V. Criteria for assignment of Non-Incardinated Priests

1. In the assignment of non-incardinated priests, the personnel board, in its recommendation to the Bishop will follow the same criteria for procedures employed in the assignment of incardinated priests.
2. The service of non-incardinated priests shall be reviewed annually.
3. Non-incardinated priests who are not assigned by the Bishop must have their residency in the rectory approved by the Bishop after a period of two months. The residence is subject to an annual review.

All priests of the Diocese of San Bernardino shall be enrolled in the United States Social Security Plan. Those who have not joined are asked to do so. Those who sometime ago waived their right to join Social Security, should request a setting aside of waiver. Those who waived their right to Social Security have until early February 1979 to join.

Priests are asked to join Social Security not only for some retirement benefits, but mainly for the medical benefits that can be obtained after the age of 65. Our Diocesan Health Insurance Plan presumes that a priest will be covered by Social Security after age 65. The Diocese is not covered and cannot assume the high costs of major medical expenses for priests over age 65 who did not join Social Security.

All priests of the Diocese are to be members of the Diocesan Retirement Plan. Each priest shall contribute \$150 per year, and the parish or institution to which the priest is assigned \$191. The Diocese shall contribute additional monies for each priest in the Retirement Plan to the Pension Fund. These are monies collected (2%) which is part of the parish annual assessment. The projected total amount for each priest for 1979, due to the pension plan is \$948. (Priest \$150 - Parish \$191 - Diocese \$607)

A priest coming to the Diocese of San Bernardino and seeking incardination must be eligible to be a member of the retirement plan. If not, a priest will not be incardinated unless he can give proof of adequate retirement monies from previous assignments or other sources.

The Diocese of San Bernardino provides a health insurance plan for priests. Each parish or institution shall pay \$200 per year for each priest on the health insurance plan. The Diocese of San Bernardino shall subsidize the additional premiums and the portion of self insurance.

There is a \$100 deduction each year. The health insurance plan covers the next \$900 of expenses. For medical expenses between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the priest pays 20% of the actual cost. All bills for medical expenses over \$5,000 and under \$100,000 are covered 100% by insurance companies. For the exact items covered by the health insurance companies, please consult their brochures. These may be obtained through the Diocesan Office. Any priest not being able to pay the 20% of medical costs between \$1,000 and \$5,000 should contact the Diocesan office for a loan of such monies.

Religious priests serving in the Diocese of San Bernardino or priests not incardinated can be included on the Diocesan Health Insurance plan if they have a full time assignment from the Diocese of San Bernardino and have a medical report of good health from a physician designated by the Diocese.

All priests are to be on Social Security so they can avail themselves of Social Security Benefits after age 65.

Each priest of the Diocese of San Bernardino is to have a Last Will and Testament on file at the Diocesan Pastoral Center. It is recommended that the Will be drawn up by an attorney, as many Holographic Wills can be rendered invalid or contested, because of irregularities. A priest in sending his Last Will and Testament to the Diocesan Office, should send it in a sealed envelope so marked as "Last Will and Testament" with name and date. If you presently have a Will on file with the Diocese, please make a note that you would wish to have the old Last Will and Testament returned to you.

The Last Will and Testaments of all priests presently in the new Diocese of San Bernardino, are presently on file at the Diocesan Pastoral Center in San Bernardino.

We draw your attention to the new title that should be used in the Last Will and Testament if you are making any gifts or bequests to the Diocese. The proper legal title is The Roman Catholic Bishop of San Bernardino, Corporation Sole, The Most Reverend Phillip F. Straling, Incumbent. Priests who were part of the San Diego Diocese, and having left properties or other bequests to the Diocese of San Diego, should change their Last Will and Testament, life insurance policies, and any other documents which might have left properties to the old Diocese.

Some priests in order to help pay their seminary tuition in years past, have made out life insurance policies payable to the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Diego. We would remind you to change the beneficiary of these policies.

Priests are also asked to run a note in their Sunday Bulletins for several weeks reminding the laity of their parish of the change of name for gifts or bequests that have been left to the Diocese or the parish. They should be reminded that the legal title by which gifts can be accepted is the Roman Catholic Bishop of San Bernardino, a Corporation Sole, The Most Reverend Phillip F. Straling, Incumbent. If the properties are to be left for the benefit of the parish, the legal Diocesan title should be used, then noting that they request the Diocese to use the gifts or bequests for a particular parish or institution. Gifts or bequests made solely in the name of the Church or institution are not considered legal entities capable of receiving gifts and could possibly be challenged and lost to the Church or institution.

PREAMBLE

1. Priests are taken from among men and appointed for men in all things which pertain to God, in order to offer gifts and sacrifices for sin. (Heb.5:1) Priests "have as their primary duties the proclamation of the gospel of God to all" (Vat.II Decree on the Ministry and Life of Priests C.11.) Diocesan priests are ordained to collaborate with their bishop in carrying on the mission of the Church.  
(CF. Const on the Church, Numbers 13 and 28)
2. From the above it follows that:
  - a. In serving the needs of God's people, the priest should experience a reasonable sense of personal fulfillment both in the use of his talents, and in the priestly associations he encounters in his assignments. Every priest should be free to express his desire for positions he feels he is best suited to fill and to seek assignments which includes priests with whom he can work effectively and comfortably. To the extent that it is possible, personal fulfillment can and should be a part of priestly service to God's people.
  - b. Personal fulfillment of the priests can never be at the expense of the well being of the Christian Community. The common good of God's people must always be the framework within the personal fulfillment of the priest. "The Son of Man has come not to be served but to serve." (Mark 10:45). Hence, the needs of the Church must take precedence over the desire of the individual priest, as priest and bishop together serve the people of God.

THE PERSONNEL BOARD

The Bishop is solely responsible for all priests in the Diocese. After hearing the recommendation of the personnel board, he will personally make the assignments of priests. The existence of the personnel board indicates efficiency in the discharge of this responsibility.

Every priest has the right to approach the bishop or the personnel board concerning his assignment. The board is bound to secrecy and each priest's right to privacy will be scrupulously observed.

1. Functions of the Personnel Board
  - a. To assist the bishop in the assignment of the clergy and personnel in the service of the Diocese.
  - b. In the fulfillment of this task of assisting that bishop, the board will:
    1. Develop and utilize every possible means to know the

priests of the Diocese, to determine their interest, their strengths and weaknesses, and areas of competence, so that they would be fulfilled as persons and the work of the church be furthered.

2. Conduct consultations before recommending to the Bishop specific assignments.
  3. Gather data continually on priest personnel, needs of the Diocese and the more effective placement of clergy personnel.
  4. Encourage priests to make full use of their personal talents, to continually up-date their pastoral knowledge through study and other progress.
  5. To develop and propose, and after approval, to evaluate periodically personnel procedures that will be helpful to the priests of the Diocese.
  6. To initiate and sponsor new ministries while furthering the established ones.
2. Make Up of the Personnel Board
- a. The personnel board shall consist of 7 elected priests plus the 2 ex officio members, the Chancellor for Pastoral Affairs, the Chancellor for Hispanic Affairs.
  - b. The term is for 3 years with eligibility to be elected for a second 3 year term. No man can serve more than two consecutive terms.  
(for the first term, members will serve two, three and four year terms as determined by casting of lots. This will allow new members to be added on an annual basis.)
  - c. The personnel board is designed so as to represent different categories of Diocese priests
    1. One priest from each deanery.
    2. One priest who is an associate pastor.  
(a priest who has been ordained from 1 to 12 years, is not a pastor or in special works.)
    3. One priest in special works.
  - d. The chairman of the personnel board is selected among the 7 elected members. The personnel board will meet monthly. A quorum consists of 4 members. The Bishop has the right to be at any or all meetings as he so desires.
  - e. Priests may approach the personnel board as a group or deal with any individual member of the board.
  - f. The personnel board is bound to confidentiality concerning any information that affects the personal life or reputation of the priest.
