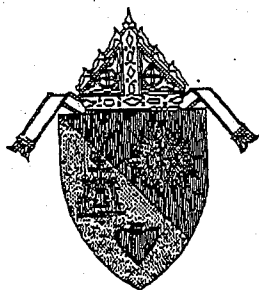

We have been informed a few days ago, by the Diocese of San Diego, of the death of William Savord. Many of you remember him from the days before the Diocese of San Bernardino was separated from the Diocese of San Diego. Bill was killed in a tragic accident, hit by a semi-truck while riding a bicycle. Funeral and burial services will take place in Michigan, where he was born.

Bill is remembered with affection by his ordination classmates of March 19, 1957 and by the parishioners of the parish in Rancho Bernardo, where he was the founding pastor thirty years ago. Born on June 15, 1929, Bill was 75 years old at the time of his death. Please remember him in your prayers.

Fr. Chester Kopeck has been in the hospital for about a week now, with minor complications from an angiogram. He appears to be doing well now and is in his normal good, and loquacious, spirits. The other day when I left his room in St. Bernardine's Hospital, he shouted after me, "Tell the whole gang I said 'hello'!" And so, gang, here's Chester's HELLO! He most likely will be released today. I know he'd appreciate a remembrance in your prayers.

I'll be out of the office for the next couple of weeks, for a meeting of Vicars for Clergy in Chicago and for some vacation in Michigan. A reminder: Please be sure to send in your registration for the October 5-8 Priests Convocation, with the theme of *Cultivating Unity in the Presbyterate*.

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

OF

REV. WILLIAM R. SAVORD, a Roman Catholic Priest

I, WILLIAM R. SAVORD, a resident of Imperial County, California, a Roman Catholic priest of the diocese of San Diego, now assigned to St. Joseph's Church, Holtville, California, declare that this is my Will.

FIRST: I revoke all Wills and Codicils that I have previously made.

SECOND: My next of kin are my parents WILLIAM and MARCELLA SAVORD of Faithorn, Michigan, my brothers, WILFRED and LAWRENCE SAVORD, and my sisters, JEANNETTE SKUJA, ANNA MAE ZAHN, ROSE ANNE NELSEN and EDNA PICKL.

THIRD: I direct that my funeral be conducted in the Roman Catholic Church to which I shall be assigned, or last assigned, at the time of my demise. I desire that my remains be buried in the ground in said parish and that the total expense shall not exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), casket preferably to be of gray, Spanish octagon type, cost not to exceed Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00); funeral expense to include also a stipend of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for the main concelebrant and Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) each for the other six (6) concelebrants and Ten Dollars (\$10.00) each for the minor ministers.

FOURTH: I direct my executor to pay my just debts, illness and burial expenses as soon after my death as practicable.

FIFTH: I bequeath to the parish of the church to which I am assigned, or last assigned at the time of my death, incumbent after my death, the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for fifty (50) masses to be offered for the repose of my soul.

SIXTH: All of my personal apparel (clothes, jewelry, except watch) I give and bequeath to The Propagation of the Faith of San Diego to give to the

SEVENTH: All of my books, I give and bequeath to the Seminary Library, Alcala Park, San Diego, California.

EIGHTH: I give and bequeath my chalice to The Society for The Propagation of the Faith of San Diego for perpetual membership in my name.

NINTH: My watch I give and bequeath to my only God-child, JOHN SKUJA, JR., son of JEANETTE and JOHN SKUJA, SR.

TENTH: I give and bequeath any stock and bonds and monies in savings and commercial accounts which I may possess at the time of my demise to the Roman Catholic Bishop of the diocese of San Diego, a corporation sole to be held in Trust and the net income to be given and administered for the benefit of seminarians by way of school tuition. It being my wish, intent and request that the recipient seminarian(s) shall pray for the repose of my soul.

ELEVENTH: I give and bequeath the rest and residue of my estate to the Roman Catholic Bishop of the diocese of San Diego, a corporation sole, to be held in Trust and the net income to be given and administered for the benefit of seminarians by way of school tuition. It being my wish, intent and request that the recipient seminarian(s) shall pray for the repose of my soul.

TWELFTH: I deliberately disinherit my next of kin and blood relatives.

THIRTEENTH: If any person claiming to be an heir and not mentioned or provided in this Will claims to be such heir, then in such event, I give to such claimant the sum of One Dollar (\$1,00) and no more.

FOURTEENTH: As executor of this Will I nominate my friend, Reverend LLOYD BOURGOIS of the diocese of San Diego, to serve without bond. If for any reason he shall not become executor, then I nominate in his place DONALD MAHONEY, JR. presently a seminarian, to serve without bond.

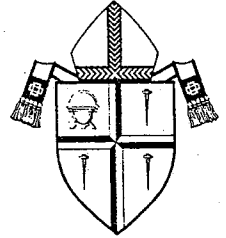

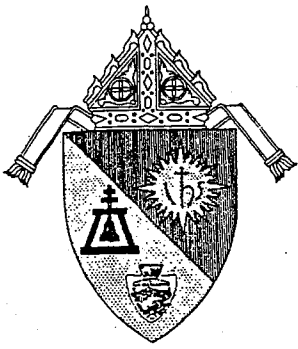

Secondly, as you can see in the declaration of resignation waiver of wages and benefits, that while retirement benefits are covered, any health insurance is not.

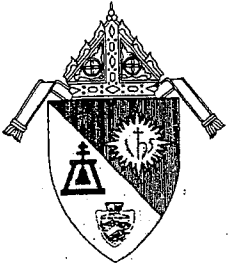

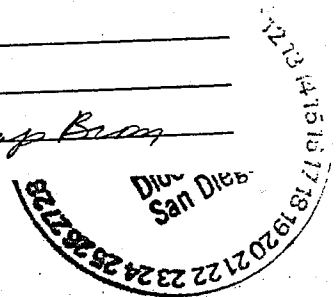

Dear Bill:

After our telephone conversation earlier today, I inquired at the Diocesan Accounting Office to see if you were scheduled to receive a payroll check for the month of April 1990. I was told that Bishop Maher had written you on February 12, 1990, informing you that as of March 31, 1990, "the Diocese will no longer assume responsibility for the extraordinary funding of your retirement." (A copy of that letter is enclosed.)

When Mrs. Guittard asked the Epler Company if your request for disability retirement benefits had been received, Ms. Barry informed her that your request for disability benefits could not be granted because the doctors' letters which you submitted were "too general." The Epler Company cannot authorize payment of disability benefits without receiving two letters stating the specific character and gravity of your disability.

Please note that Bishop Maher suggested that you contact Ms. Barry at the Epler Company if you need any technical advice or assistance in understanding exactly how to proceed. She will no doubt be able to tell you what authorization you should give your doctors in order for them to provide the sort of letters required.

As you know, any priest requesting a disability retirement from the priests pension plan must submit a letter from a competent physician stating the specific character and gravity of the disability. You have failed to comply with that regulation, *instead* submitting to the pension board a letter of such vagueness that the board was unable to act.

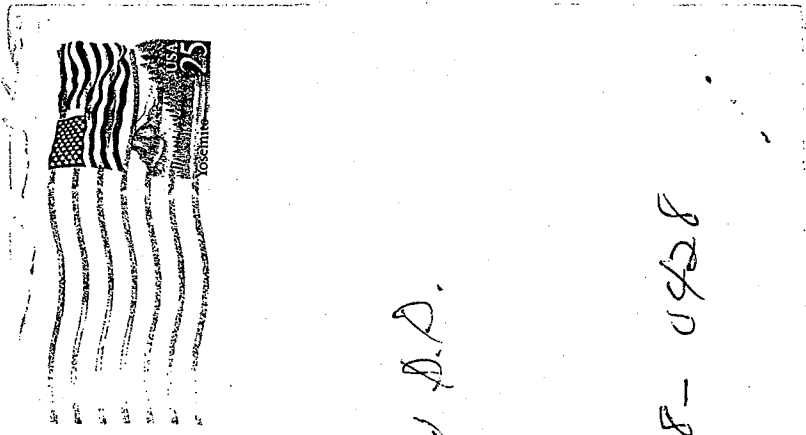

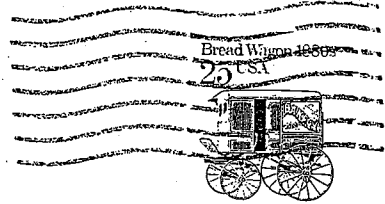

Dear Father Savord:

We have received your letter dated February 3, 1989 in which you requested a disability pension from the Dioceses of San Diego and San Bernardino Pension Plan for Priests. As you are aware, this disability request has been under consideration by the Board of Trustees for the past few months.

As Administrators for the Plan, we want to inform you of the definition of disability as contained in the Plan document, which serves as the prevailing instrument on all matters relating to the Plan:

Section 1.21. "Total and Permanent Disability" means a disability which renders a Priest incapable of meeting the requirements of the duties he had been performing for the Employer Bishop when the Total and Permanent Disability commenced, and which renders him incapable of transfer to other available duties with the Employer Bishop. The Trustees shall have authority to consult with such medical, legal and other services as they may require from time to time in passing upon the disability of any Participant. The Trustees may require a Participant claiming such disability benefits to submit from time to time and at his own expense such proof of disability as may be deemed by them to be necessary to support a claim for such bene-

fit or the continuance thereof. No proof of continued disability shall be required of any Participant after he has attained the age of 65 years.

We want to stress that the Board, in its capacity as fiduciary to the Plan, must follow all Plan provisions in a totally non-arbitrary and non-discriminatory manner.

The Board has received and reviewed the medical opinions as submitted by your two physicians; the Board has determined, upon reviewing these opinions alone, that a total and permanent disability does not appear to exist. Therefore, a disability benefit cannot be paid to you at the present time based upon those medical opinions as submitted. Unless you are returned to lay status by your Employer Bishop, your pension will be deferred to age 65; should you be returned to lay status, you will be eligible to receive a refund of your contributions immediately. At the present time, your personal contributions total \$_____.

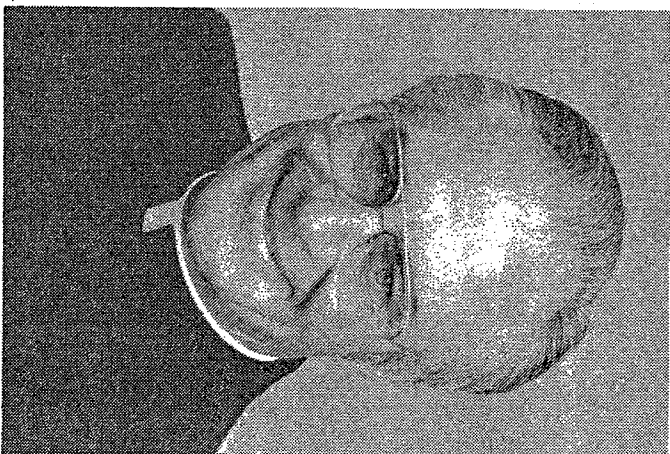

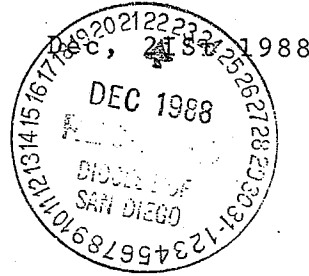

retired priests in your prayer of the faithful.

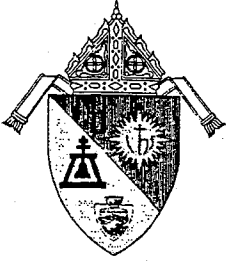

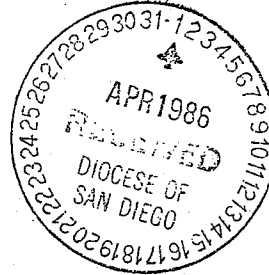
"I have found the people of Our Lady of the Desert to be warm and friendly", said Father Savord. "I am excited and feel blessed by God to be a part of this growing community".

I am writing this letter in hopes that you will reconsider your recent decision regarding the transfer of Father Bill Savord. Being close to Father Bill and the office staff I was made privy to the circumstances which led you to your decision. Knowing the other individuals involved, I can say without hesitation that any accusations made against Father Bill are completely false.

I realize that the verity of the accusations was not the basis for your decision. It is my understanding that when a problem of this nature arises the solution is to transfer the individual involved. I cannot begin to express how it feels to know that the leaders of our church community deal with problems in such an injudicious and irresponsible way.

If this incident is made public the Church's name might suffer. But how can we justify protecting the Church's name if we must sacrafice its ideals? We can not.

Father Bill has given so much of himself to our community. He is highly respected and much loved by the members of our parish. Bill Savord has indeed become the "father" of our church community. He is always there when we need him. He provides for us. He organized the construction of our new church building thus providing us with a beautiful place to worship. Father Bill is a member of our family. And in any family, if one of the

members has a problem the solution is definitely not to send that member away. The best thing to do would be to take the time to work out a solution that would be fair and acceptable to all. Sending Father Bill to another parish would not change the personal feelings of any of the involved parties for the better.

Father Bill means so very much to all of us. Our community would suffer greatly without him. It would be wrong to transfer Father Bill because of this incident. And two wrongs do not a right make. I have been informed of the impending transfer of our beloved Father William Savord from San Rafael Parish.

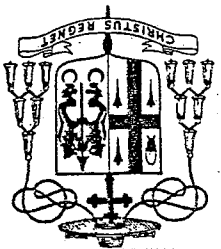

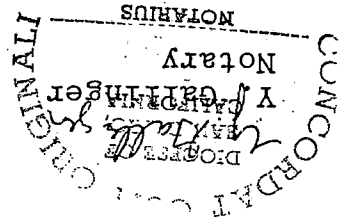

Dear Father Savord:

I wish to quote from your letter to your parishioners of the San Rafael family of December 1982. It reads thusly: "It is healthy for us to be in debt. The Bishop gets 16% of our Sunday gifts, plus a Stewardship assessment (minimum 4,000) which will go up drastically as we pay off our debt. There are many other bills we receive from the diocese too numerous to mention here. But I think you do get the picture. To be out of debt is not a good thing for a parish."

Your statement is a public scandal, showing publicly your disloyalty to your own Bishop, the one that you have pledged to reverence and obey. In a public manner you try to degrade him in the minds of your people, besides showing your own disloyalty. You are to be the Bishop's representative among the people, but you act as a hireling.

The scandal is also because of your disloyalty to the Diocese, to the Church, the local Church, in your unwillingness to share your responsibility for the upbuilding of Christ's Church among the people. This scandal is not only your disloyalty to the Bishop and disloyalty to the Church, but it is disloyalty to the other priests, to the presbyteral family. Such a mentality is so selfish it is not becoming a priest. It is so provincial it is not even becoming a Christian.

To undermine the work of the Church, to undermine the person of the Bishop in the minds of the people, is indeed the worst type of scandal. This demands not only retraction but a public apology, in writing, as was the former.

It is difficult to understand how you could possibly make such a statement after my own personal generosity to you and to San Rafael's community in establishing the parish, buying the property, building the church, carrying the debt and building the rectory. And then for you to turn on your own Bishop and be this disloyal is so unpriestly and unChristian. I am sure that people like

_____ and others, if they knew this, would certainly never support you, as would most of your parishioners.

To have your associate pastor sign such a document is such a terrible influence on a young priest. You do not deserve to have such a fine priest and to treat him in a manner that is injurious to his priesthood.

I wish to discuss this matter with you at length and determine what should be done to rectify such public scandal.

To the pillars of our San Rafael family;

Father Larry Johnson, Luz Wohlrab, Elizabeth Mc Cotter, and myself wish you a Christmas filled with the love of God and PEACE! As we close the year of 1982, may we reflect the light of the world in the New Year of 1983. May we be instruments of peace and justice.

According to the parish survey regarding the proposed new parish center, there were only a few no's with over 95% in favor. We are looking down the road hoping to begin construction 3 years from now. We do need to pay off our present debt (21 months hopefully) and have on hand 1/2 of the cost of the new hall (1/2 million), or 250,000.

In order to do this, we will have to continue to have the annual Stewardship Building Fund drive in February. In the past 300 families have made pledges or increased their donations on Sunday. We pray that we can increase that number to 350 families. We need your total support this February. We could have a capital fund drive in February 1984, to pay off the debt and to obtain 1/2 of the cost of the new parish center by Feb. 1986. So construction could forseably begin in 1986. We need to get on the diocesan calendar of building projects as we will need to borrow 225,000. which is not a big debt for a parish this size. It is healthy for us to be in debt. The Bishop gets 16% of our Sunday gifts, plus a Stewardship assessment (minimum 4,000.) which will go up drastically as we pay off our debt. There are many other bills we receive from the diocese too numerous to mention here. But I think you do get the picture. To be out of debt is not a good thing for a parish.

We the priests owe you a great debt of gratitude for your generous support in your Sunday gifts, your building fund payments and for all your involvement in the parish e.g. ushers= ministers of hospitality, choir, organists, cantors, coffee and donuts on Sundays, engaged encounter, marriage encounter, baptism instructions, hot meals, communion to the sick, ministers of the Eucharist, ministers of the Word, christmas decorations, flowers, parish council, newcomers welcome, youth advisers, catechists and helpers, collection counters, ladies guild, liturgy members, ministry to the divorced, separated, single, altar servers, those who clean the church, mission circle, publicity, religious resource person etc. To everyone thanks a million! Mil gracias! We have one of the finest parish communities in the country. As we thank you for all that you are, we wish to thank God our Father, who has made this parish possible. We hope to continue to serve you in the best way we can. We encourage ideas on how we can better serve you.

Please find on the reverse side a drawing (preliminary) of our new parish center, the plot view and the elevation. The trellis at the entrance and the statues of San Rafael and young Tobias, should be completed before Easter. The ladies guild and Mr & Mrs. James Colachis are the patrons of this project. 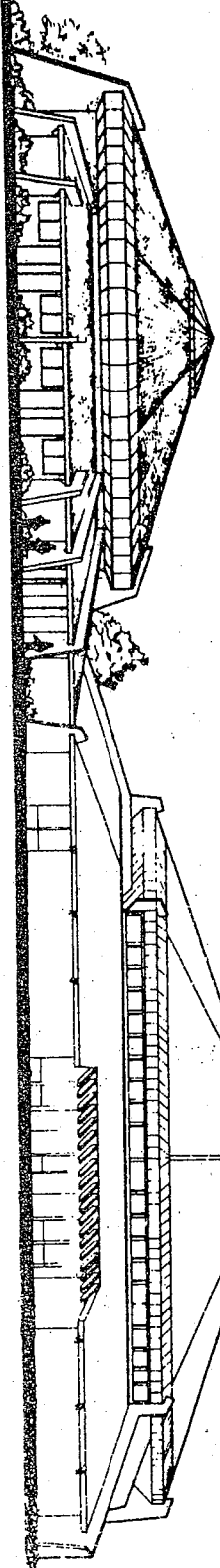

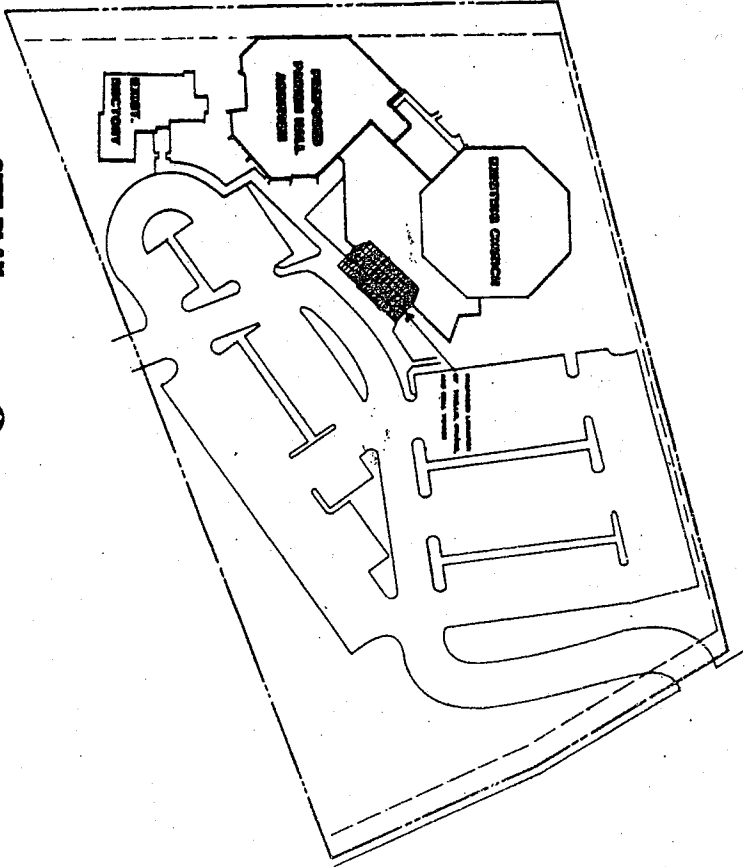


Epiphany

ELEVATION

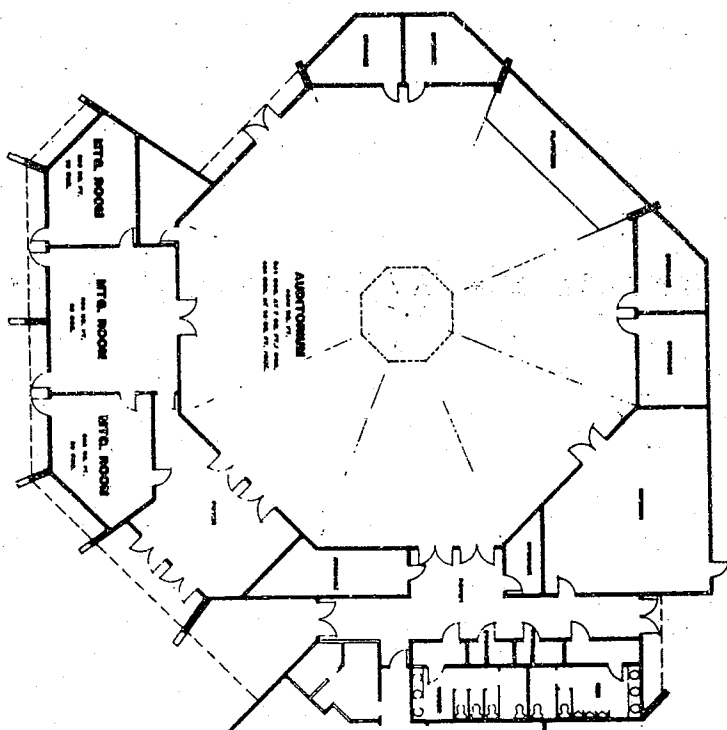


SITE PLAN



"I . . . firmly hold and accept each and every definition of the unerring teaching of the Church, with all she has maintained and declared, but especially those points of doctrine which expressly combat the errors of our time. In the first place I profess my belief that God, the beginning and end of all, can be certainly known and therefore proved to exist by the natural light of reason from the things that are made, that is, from the visible works of the creation as a cause from its effects. Next I recognize and acknowledge the external arguments of revelation, that is, divine facts, especially miracles and prophecies, as most certain signs of the divine origin of the Christian religion, and I hold that these are altogether suited to the understanding of every age and of all men, also of our times. Thirdly, I likewise hold with firm faith that the Church, the guardian and exponent of the revealed Word, was proximately and directly founded by the true and historic Christ Himself, while He dwelt amongst us, and that she was also built upon Peter, the Prince of the Apostolic Hierarchy, and upon his successors to the end of time. Fourthly, I sincerely accept the teaching of faith as transmitted down to us from the Apostles through the orthodox Fathers in the same sense and even in the same wording; and, therefore, I wholly reject the heretical notions of the evolution of dogmas, which pass from one sense to another alien to that which the Church held from the start; and I likewise condemn every error whereby is substituted for the divine deposit, entrusted by Christ to His Spouse and by Her to be faithfully guarded, a philosophic system or the creation of a human consciousness, gradually refined by the striving of men and finally to be perfected hereafter by indefinite progress. Fifthly, I hold for certain and sincerely profess that Faith is not a blind religious sense making its way out of the hidden regions of the sub-liminal consciousness, morally tinged by the influence of heart and will, but is a true assent of the intellect to truth received from without by hearing, an assent whereby we believe to be true, because of the authority of the all-true God, whatever by the personal God, our Creator and Lord, has been spoken, testified and revealed.

Sententiam praeterea illorum reiicio qui tenent, doctori disciplinae historicae theologicae tradendae, aut iis de rebus scribenti seponendam prius esse opinionem ante conceptam sive de supernaturali origine Catholicae traditionis, sive de promissa divinitus ope ad perennem conservationem uniuscuiusque revelati veri; deinde scripta Patrum singulorum interpretanda solis scientiae principiiis, sacra qualibet auctoritate seclusa, eaque iudicii libertate, qua profana quaevis monumenta solent investigari. In universum denique me alienissimum ab errore profiteor, quo *modernistae* tenent in sacra traditione nihil inesse divini; aut, quod longe deterrius, pantheistico sensu illud admittunt; ita ut nihil iam restet nisi nudum factum et simplex, communibus historiae factis aequandum; hominum nempe sua industria, sollertia, ingenio scholam a Christo eiusque Apostolis inchoatam per subsequentes aetates continuantium. Proinde fidem Patrum firmissime retineo et ad extremum vitae spiritum retinebo, de charismate *veritatis certo*, quod est, fuit eritque semper in *episcopatus ab Apostolis successione*; non ut id

"I further, with all due reverence, submit and with my whole mind adhere to all the condemnations, declarations, and ordinances contained in the Encyclical letter *Pascendi* and in the Decree *Lamentabili*, particularly regarding what is called the history of Dogma.

"I also reject the error of those who aver that the Faith proposed by the Church may be in conflict with history, and that Catholic dogmas in the sense in which they are now understood cannot be harmonized with the more truthful "origins" of Christianity. Moreover, I condemn and reject the opinion which declares that a Christian man of better culture can assume a dual personality, one as a believer and another as an historian, as if it were permissible for the historian to hold fast what his faith as a believer contradicts, or to lay down premises from which there follows the falsity or the uncertainty of dogmas, provided only that these are not directly denied. Likewise I reject that method of estimating and interpreting Holy Writ, which, setting aside the Church's tradition and the analogy of Faith and the rules of the Apostolic See, adopts the rationalists' principles and with equal arbitrariness and rashness considers criticism of the text the one only supreme rule. Furthermore, I reject the opinion of those who hold that a teacher of the science of Historical Theology or the writer on the subject must first put aside the notions previously conceived about the supernatural origin of Catholic tradition or about the divine aid promised for the perpetual preservation of each revealed truth; then, that the writings of individual Fathers must be interpreted solely by the data of science, without any reference to sacred authority, and with that freedom of judgment wherewith every profane record is usually examined.

"Finally and in general, I declare myself to be far removed from the error of the modernists who hold that in sacred tradition there is nothing inherently divine; or who—far worse still—admit it in a pantheistic sense; so that thus there would remain only a bare simple fact equal to the ordinary facts of history, viz., that the school started by Christ and His Apostles finds, in the ages that follow, men to carry it on by their energy, their skill, and their genius. Wherefore most firmly do I retain and to my last breath will I retain the Faith of the Fathers of the Church concerning the sure endowment of truth, which

is, has been, and ever will be in the succession of the Episcopate from the Apostles; not in such a way that what seems best and most fitting according to the refinement of each age may be held, but that the absolute and unchangeable truth preached from the beginning by the Apostles may never in any different wise be believed, never in any different wise be understood.

All this I promise that I will faithfully, entirely and sincerely keep and inviolably guard, and from this never in teaching or howsoever by word or writing in the least depart. So I promise, so I swear, so help me God and these His holy gospels.

San Rafael Parish of Rancho Bernardo respectfully requests the approval to begin building a Parish Community Center in January 1985.

The original parish master plan, submitted to the diocese in 1977, called for a church and community center. However, due to the small number of families, less than 200 at that time, it was decided to build the church first.

We now have over 700 families. Based on the past response, we are 18 months away from paying off the church debt. The Parish Council conducted a general survey in November 1982 of the needs for a Parish Community Center. The support was overwhelmingly favorable, (e.g. 95% said yes). Based on this response the Parish Council Team unanimously approved the Parish Community Center at the January 11, 1983 meeting.

The reasons we need this new Parish Community Center are as follows:

- a) It has become more difficult to know each other as our families have increased from 200 to over 700.
- b) Individual groups within the parish, such as our San Rafael Women's Guild, have over 100 members that have no one place to meet. Also our Youth Group has no place to conduct their activities.
- c) Parish social activities such as receptions, dinners and dances are difficult to have due to the lack of space.

It is understood that one half of the money required to complete the Parish Community Center must be on hand upon beginning construction. It is our intent to raise this money by January 1985. This will be accomplished through additional projected families and a special fund drive. Our initial estimate to complete this project is \$500,000.00, leaving a required \$250,000.00. We are therefore requesting approval for a loan for the remaining \$250,000.00 in January 1985.

The original artist conception of the Community Center is attached. This is a preliminary plan and is provided for your information at this time.

Rancho Bernardo has grown significantly and is expected to continue to grow. By 1985, we expect to have 1,000 families in San Rafael Parish. The need for a community center in two years will be essential to strengthen our Christian Community.

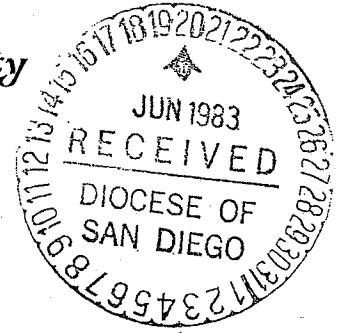

Your Excellency,

On behalf of the people of God of San Rafael Parish we would like to thank you for the care and love you have shown us as our Shepherd. In 1974 you called us together as a parish under your leadership. Five years later in 1979 you graciously provided us with the necessary resources to build our church. We are very grateful for your generosity and hope that our rapid repayment of our debt will help the church of San Diego in all its needs. We have tried to offer as a sign of our loyalty a very considerable annual contribution made without fail toward the retirement of our debt, and happily, our debt will be retired in 1984 as the enclosed schedule shows.

Most respectfully, we petition Your Excellency, to re-examine the conclusions drawn by the Building Committee regarding our planned Parish Center. In our letter of 15 January 1983 to Monsignor I. B. Eagen we expressed our desperate need for a meeting place, a need which we feel most acutely, now that the Renew program is becoming so much a part of our future, and as that letter indicates, we anticipate that with your blessing we could retire our debt by August 1984 and raise 50% of the necessary building funds by January 1985.

Since that letter we have continued to raise funds toward the parish debt while awaiting a reply. The letter from Mr. B. Crane of 21 April 1983 suggests that there might be a misunderstanding of our payment record, and that this misunderstanding caused the building commission to postpone assignment of a date for our new hall. We most seriously hope that an examination of the attached schedules will clarify any misunderstanding regarding our ability to repay our current debt and to contract a new one. Father Bill Savord has asked that we give you some information of the projected costs for the above referenced project. These costs will be based on two recent projects in which our company has been involved for the Diocese, Holy Trinity Parish Hall and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Multi-Purpose Building.

Holy Trinity Parish Hall, which we have just completed, is a conventional parish hall consisting of classrooms, meeting rooms, kitchen and bathroom facilities. Our Lady of Mt. Carmel is a multi-use building which will serve the dual functions of a conventional parish hall, as well as serving as a sanctuary. This dual function increases the cost per square foot as can be seen in the following figures:

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel	13,500	826,776	\$62

It is important to note that our original bid on Our Lady of Mt. Carmel was \$981,419 (\$73/sq. ft.), but after working with the architect we were able to cut almost \$155,000 out of the price without changing the character or structural integrity of the building. As we would be working with the architect in the preliminary design phase of the San Rafael Parish Hall, we would be able to maximize construction dollars.

The proposed design for the San Rafael Parish Hall is conventional wood frame and stucco with a tile roof, similar in appearance to the existing Church. Grading and site improvements would be minimal as these items were planned for during the construction

of the Church. Utility stub-ups for the future parish hall were also run at that time. The proposed structure will be located in a greenbelt area and will not impact existing parking. Nor should any additional parking requirements be necessary.

Based on the above considerations, we feel that a budget of \$54/square foot for 9,096, or \$491,184 would be adequate at today's costs. Allowing for an 8% per year increase in costs, a target price of \$573,000 for construction in 1985 is realistic.

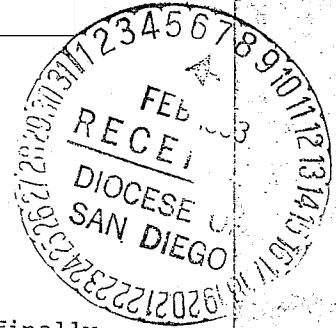

I was a member of San Rafael Parish from 1978-1981 and finally left with a tremendous feeling of emptiness and frustration. I went to one Mass at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel church in Rancho Penasquitos and was so moved by the love and warmth I felt there, that I never returned to San Rafael.

During the three years that I was in your parish, I had numerous contacts with you including First Communion and Reconciliation classes for my daughter Monica, greeting you each Sunday at church, touring your rectory at the Open House, calling you one evening for your help and consolation in the death of a close friend only to have you recommend that I "read my Bible about resurrection" and never offer to come and talk with me... and through all these contacts, you still had no idea who I was personally.

You're forever asking people to give their "time, talent and treasure" to the church. Well, I do all three now at Mt. Carmel because I want to, as I feel a part of a loving family. I'm in the choir, have been on various committees, attended numerous Adult Education classes and all that sort of thing and feel a real commitment to that parish... and I get so much back from the people as well as our wonderful pastor, Fr. Bob Pinta. He makes a real and genuine effort to welcome new parishioners into his flock and that's what makes the

difference.

Yesterday, your parishioner _____ called to tell me that she has pneumonia and has been confined to her house since January 20. She also mentioned that neither you nor your assistant nor any Eucharistic minister has been to see her and brought her communion. The Guild members as well as the Choir all know she is ill, so what has happened to the communication in your parish? Does your interest lie solely in ministering to the wealthy who can contribute to your building funds? Perhaps if you spent less time bombarding people's mailboxes with requests for more and more money, and spent more time ministering to their needs, you would find that money coming in to your coffers on its own.

It is true that _____ has very little in the way of "treasure" but she tries to make that up through her time and talent that she devotes to the church and its activities. My feeling is that she is hurt over the lack of spiritual ministering from San Rafael.

I hope and pray that you will not disregard this letter, but instead, use it as constructive criticism to re-establish your and your parish's priorities.

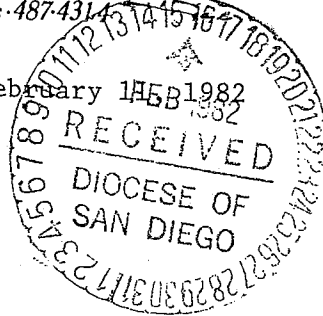

The total concept of Stewardship involves also time and talent. Our people should be educated during the year to offer their time and talent in the various parish ministries. Each parish has determined the best way to solicit this vast source of lay involvement for personal and community growth. Perhaps the program of "Renew" will bring even a greater commitment from everyone in the diocese.

"God's generosity to you frees you to be generous with others" clearly inspires us to encourage our people to practice good Stewardship. The key to the success of our annual appeal is you as the chief Steward of your parish community. I ask you to put forth your best effort to continue to preach the Gospel of Stewardship. The gift of giving is a vital and valid spiritual gift. The need to instruct our people to understand that we need each other's help in order to know how to love God. We need each other's help in order to know how to love our neighbor.

My greatest consolation is the devoted and loyal spirit of our priests. I am grateful to you and the splendid efforts you put forth in fulfilling your pastoral ministry. I ask your continued personal support and encouragement of our Stewardship Program. The success of Stewardship '82 will be in direct proportion to the vitality and involvement of the pastor and his associates in promoting Christian Stewardship.

Dear Bishop Maher:

In asking _____ for the present amount of the parish debt, it was suggested that I present you with the heavy burden of interest the parish would have to carry the first year, e.g., 6% of \$734,000.00 equalling \$44,040.00 which comes to \$3,670.00 per month with nothing on the principal.

San Rafael has had a good financial record. In the past two years we have paid over \$300,000.00 on the principal, thanks to you for the favor of charging no interest. San Rafael is growing and continues to increase carrying its financial responsibility. So if you could be patient for one more year, I would like to put my neck on the line and guarantee you that we will make every effort possible to bring the debt down to \$500,000.00 by July 1, 1982. We could do that if we were blessed with paying no interest this one more year.

If some interest is absolutely necessary, maybe a lower rate of interest, e.g. 2%, would be helpful to the diocese and less burdensome to us at \$14,680.00 per year, or \$1,223.33 per month. I feel that it would be in the best interest of the parish to get the debt down to \$500,000.00 where it would be easier to pay the interest, rather than extending the parish debt for many more years.

Our parishioners have been most receptive and generous to our building fund. They have sacrificed themselves in order to reduce our debt, because you have given us the loan interest free up to now. They have given to all the needs presented to them, whether local, from the diocese, national or worldwide. So it is in their name I make this plea. I do think they are deserving.

Our San Rafael Parish is just about 6 1/2 years old. The first Mass was on July 28th, 1974. The initial drive for pledges to build our new Church was in August, 1977. 200 brave families pledged \$420,000.00, averaging \$2,000.00 per family. This put us on the map. Some representatives of the parish and I went to see the Bishop and asked if he would excuse us from the rule of having half of the money before we could build our new church. He graciously agreed to our request on the basis of our building fund drive. At the same time we were dispensed from Stewardship for three years. Stewardship is the annual drive the Bishop puts on to help support our schools, the poor, seminarians, retired priests, etc.

After searching three years, the present site was chosen from Avco Community Developers who would not settle for less than \$284,000.00 for 3.9 acres. On Mothers' Day and Pentecost of 1978 the Bishop came here to break ground for the new church. We began construction of the Church in February of 1979. The dedication was on February 17, 1980.

We had a promise from the architect that the new church could be built for no more than \$700,000.00, but when the bids were opened they all were over 1 million dollars. So we negotiated with the 2nd low bidder and eliminated and changed many materials so that the bid came in at \$850,000.00. But after the fire marshal got through with the plans and changes were made the final cost came to 1 million dollars.

While the church was under construction we began building the new rectory. The bid came in at \$120,000.00 (cost). It was built for \$112,000.00 because a parishioner was the general contractor and built it at cost. So if you were to add up the cost of the land and grading, utility costs, city fees, the rectory and the Church, the total package would come close to \$1,426,000.00. Now we have 400 families from the parish and others who have paid off \$646,000.00. The Bishop has agreed to but the old rectory for \$110,000.00 and thus reduce our debt to \$780,000.00.

I am trying to give you the big picture so you can better see and understand the great faith we have here in the parish of San Rafael. Today we have over 700 families who claim they belong. Less than 300 support the church regularly.

Our Lord used many images and parables to explain covenant, commitment, belonging, etc., e.g., the chaff and wheat, sheep and goats, he who does not gather, scatters, he who is not with me is against me. So every christian must decide to be for Christ or not to belong in his company. That brings me to ask you, where do you stand? Where is your commitment? According to what we have, we have little record of your time, your talent or your treasure for the year 1980. We plan to divide people into active and inactive. Since the cost of everything is rising, the cost of envelopes, labor, printing the Messenger, etc. is now almost \$50.00 per family. So I am giving you another chance to be active in our San Rafael parish community. The date is FEBRUARY 11th. If we have not heard from you on or before that date, you give us no choice but to put you on our inactive list with no rights and privileges. The list of inactive and active families will be published.

This is the time to stand up and be counted. Become a part of our community, be involved in some way, give of your time, talent and treasure. There is nothing more I would like, than to have you as an active member, living out your baptismal commitment, to serve God in your neighbor.

MINUTES - SAN RAFAEL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING - SEPTEMBER 8, 1980

The San Rafael Parish Council Meeting of September 8, 1980 was opened with a prayer by President Kevin Smith. Members in attendance: Frank Fusco, Ron Dixon, Ron Lorenz, Sue Boudreaux, Bud Vedder, Kevin Smith, Marie Wilson, Jerry Young, Ken Finn and Youth Representative Doreen Konapacki. Fr. Bill and Jess Vance were attending a Liturgy Meeting. Fr. Mike Zuffoletto and 7 parishioners were also present.

Kevin Smith announced that the order of business would be reversed for this meeting and introduced Lissa Thornburgh, who wished to present a Parishioner Statement. Lissa said that the main purpose in coming was to inform the Council that some parishioners have felt cause to leave San Rafael because they don't see an active participation by the Parish Council by and for anything that is done within the realm of the Parish. There is extreme frustration. They see a lot of activities that should be delegated to the Parish Council - not delegated to it. They feel the Parish Council should have authority; that it is an integral part of the San Rafael Christian Community. To have an active decision-making participation by the Parish Council would assist greatly in relieving the Pastor of this Parish to do his duties - to visit the sick, attend convert classes, make Parish calls, but, mostly, to relieve him to spend time with his parishioners who have problems. They know Fr. Bill is extremely busy but feel if the Parish Council was delegated in some way to alleviate some of these pressures, it would release him to do what he needs to do and it would also allow the Parish Council to do what they were elected to do by the Parish. Both Thornburghs, among others, feel very strongly and hope that through this meeting tonight, the point could be made that we need Fr. Bill, but we also need an active Parish Council - one which is able to make decisions, enforce the decisions and to go out and find people within the community to help with tasks that they have been delegated to do.

Kevin Smith asked Lissa if she saw a lack of programs. Lissa replied that she doesn't see a lot of activities that the Parish could get involved in but indicated a desire for social programs and particularly some type of Catholic action for the poor. Lissa mentioned that St. Michael's Parish, for example, supports a Mexican Mission in Tecate and has a food drive. The parishioners physically take food and clothing down and spend time with the people. Ken Finn remarked that a dynamic Parish is only as dynamic as its people. He said that St. James Parish in Solana Beach supports a full orphanage. Last year they built almost \$50,000 worth of work. Professional people from the Parish gave time and services. There are some very active Parishes who have taken on Sister Parishes - not necessarily Mexican. Rosalie Abrahams said that we are a wealthy Parish and that she felt ashamed that we did nothing for charity. She asked where the money from the envelopes of Bread for the Poor went and said she would like to know what the role of the Council is. Bud Vedder asked where the Council had failed to give Lissa a decision. Frank Fusco mentioned that George Thornburgh had offered (at a Parish Council meeting last year) to build a Sick Loan Closet on Parish property at his own expense. The Council felt that it should be located there. Fr. Bill refused to allow anything to be stored on Parish property. Bud Vedder asked Lissa what decisions she was looking for. Lissa replied that a number of Parish decisions in the last two or three years have been made unilaterally without an assistance or discussion. She knows the Council has only been in existence for one year but she feels it should be used. As an example, she noted the problems the Youth Group had with the "Parking Lot" sale. They were not permitted to store anything on Church property prior to the sale nor were they allowed to use the library tables. The Youth had to borrow tables

from Grace Community Church to use at a sale from which the proceeds went to San Rafael. This was confirmed by the Youth Representative. Lissa said that perhaps the Council could resolve this next time. Frank Fusco noted that his son had presented a petition from RB Continuing Education asking to use the library for one hour on one day per week. While the Council was considering it, a letter was sent from the office saying "no", that our library was usually used by the Parish. He noted that he had checked over the last few weeks and the library was consistently vacant in the afternoon. Sue Boudreaux said that a bone of contention seemed to exist because of a facility versus people program* split. The council has been told that it will be 10-12 years before "people programs" can be considered as the buildings must be paid for first. She noted that there are diverse opinions among parishioners and that parishioners as a whole have to feel that this is their Parish, their community - and that a community gets together and decides, e.g., there is X amount of money and various ways to spend it. How?

Kevin Smith said that there is an undercurrent in the Parish Council and also in the Parish that we are, perhaps, not emphasizing the things we ought to emphasize as a community. He then brought up the following points.

- 1) This Parish Council has tried to represent the people and assist in many areas but has been unable to do so;
- 2) Vatican II established Parish Councils to have more participation by lay people and to open up the decision-making process;
- 3) We represent parishioners and theoretically participate in decision-making but we do not want to usurp the power of the leader;
- 4) Most Parish Councils in this Diocese do not work well, for varied reasons. At the forefront is lack of training and understanding on the part of both Councils and Pastors;
- 5) When Parish Councils work they work exceedingly well;
- 6) The Council has attempted to get some budget program responsibilities but has been repulsed. The financial representative to the Council resigned this summer as he wasn't allowed to carry out the duties given him in the Constitution'
- 7) Last year, at the request of the CCD Staff, the Council appointed a committee to study the feasibility of hiring a Director of Religious Education (DRE). The Council, on their recommendation, voted to hire a DRE. It was then told that a DRE could not be considered because of a lack of funds. While this may very well be true, the Council was not brought into the process of deciding that a DRE could or could not be funded, why or how;
- 8) There is much confusion about the role of Parish Councils. Whether their role is an an advising or decision-making body is irrelevant because either way, it will help you decide either through input or vote;
- 9) This Council has great difficulty doing anything because it has not been given delegated authority in any functional area;
- 10) A 5 page letter was sent to Fr. Bill describing the things we would like to do as a Parish Council.

Kevin asked Fr. Mike if he had any success formulas to share with us as we are open to help from all areas. Fr. Mike said that Parish Councils are still in

* People Programs: Youth, Peace & Justice, Senior Services, Social, Adult Education, etc.

a limbo area with Rome after 10+ years but that he felt Councils are vital. He said that Pastors, especially those without assistants, could not make all of the decisions in a Parish because there are only so many hours in a day and also because it is hard for one person to have expertise in all areas. Personalities enter into the process. Pastors are in a delicate position - they have to balance the wishes of parishioners (these may differ), answer to the Bishop and maintain the physical plant. Fr. Mike suggested that, using our Constitution as a basis, we have a day of goal planning, sit down with Fr. Bill and find out what his ideas are. He said that the Bishop has said Parish Councils are consultative but that the Pastor could delegate authority to the Parish Council in some substantive areas. He was told that the Council has tried to do this but is still at square one.

Ken Finn told the Council of a small Church in the area consisting of about 460 tithing families with a yearly budget of \$1,375,000. Their Sunday attendance is 1,500 plus. Their yearly budget for busses alone is \$48,000. The Spirit is flowing through and people are giving support because the Church offers so much to its people (90% are involved in activities there); it is the center of their everyday as well as their spiritual life. If you involve people, they will support you.

Dave Keeney noted that the Synod of the Diocese of San Diego supported the establishment of Parish Councils. He asked if there had been implementation at the Diocesan level to put out guidelines for Parish Councils. Kevin said that while policies are established by the Bishop, they are apparently flexible. He said he had contacted the Diocesan Office for Parish Councils to see if they could help the Council and Fr. Bill find a way to work together. He found that there was concern about why Parish Councils don't work, but few solutions.

Sue Smith said that the Church does not use its people, that active parishioners get frustrated when they are not allowed to act in substantive areas and eventually pour themselves into activities outside of the Church. Kevin Smith said that that goes back to the question of whether or not we will ever be treated as adults and be brought into decision-making.

Fr. Mike asked the Council to consider what it could do to do an effective job in our Parish and get delegated authority. Ron Lorenz said that our problems right here specifically are: 1) an absent Pastor - Fr. Bill refuses to attend Parish Council Board meetings and has attended four general meetings in a year. He came for the last 20 minutes of four others and did not attend any part of two. He will not meet with us as a group. 2) Programs we support are shot down - the reason given is lack of money but we are never brought into the process of ascertaining that. We have asked for a financial statement but have not received one. We feel we are spinning our wheels. Fr. Bill gives us no direction or input as to programs to consider.

Fr. Mike said that Fr. Bill feels threatened by the Council and is unsure of its role. Ron Lorenz said that the best way to surmount that was to communicate. Fr. Mike suggested we use the 3 months while Fr. Bill is gone to try to solve some of our problems. He and Ken Finn suggested we try small programs. Sue Boudreaux asked that the Council use this time to act on her recommendation at the September 1979 meeting - conduct a survey among the parishioners to see what they want for and within the Parish.

Rosalie Abrahams asked why a Council member had not accompanied Fr. Bill when he went to the Bishop to ask for an extension of our interest-free loan. Bud Vedder noted he had gone with Fr. Bill and ten others to see the Bishop at the time the Parish was being formulated. He said that their being along probably had no effect on the Bishop's decision. He feels the Bishop makes decisions based on the formulations of his own people. Kevin said even so, if finances were a problem, the Council would like to know about it. Frank Fusco commented that the last he had heard, the debt was \$900,000. He said that we should have known the cost and projected numbers of parishioners before building began. Bud Vedder said that although the debt is an overhanging problem, this does not mean we should rule out charitable or other programs, but not on the grand scale we may like. Kevin Smith then brought up his letter and discussion with Father, who said we did have to rule out everything but debt reduction. He told members he had delivered a letter to Fr. Bill (copies were passed to the members) that dealt with the mechanics of management, asked for some delegated responsibility, said it is beneficial to bring people into decision-making and listed ideas for setting goals and priorities. It asked whether Fr. Bill saw the Council as decision-making or advisory. It stated that for a body to be legitimate, it has to have a purpose. Fr. Bill met with Kevin and told him that he has no intention of letting the Parish Council do anything even though Kevin feels members of the Council have proven themselves. Fr. Bill said that he takes exception to the Council setting goals, etc. That nothing is affordable but the Parish debt and that Kevin is to do nothing. He also sent Kevin a letter. Kevin said that he, along with most members, had run for the Council to make a contribution.

Ron Lorenz said he had not run for President of the Parish Council again as he felt a new President would perhaps mean a new beginning with Fr. Bill. He noted that the spirit in the Parish will go downhill if people are asked to come to Mass and pay off a pledge, period.

Ushers - need head usher. Frank Fusco offered suggestion. Jess said that Fr. Bill told the Liturgy Committee that the Bishop had extended our interest-free loan. Marie Wilson noted that Fr. Bill should have given this news to the Parish Council as it fits in with their purpose rather than liturgy.

Ken Finn said that he could obtain three films by Fr. John Powell on Parenting if we could show them on Sept. 30, Oct. 7 and Oct. 14. The cost is nothing. A love offering could be collected. He said that the Dobson series ran without a hitch, involved many people and having the youth present added a wonderful dimension. He particularly thanked Sue Smith for the time and effort she spent on the program. He then told us that the Indian Reservation in Rincon is running the Dobson series, are extremely poor and have asked us to donate what we have collected above expenses to pay for their rental. The Dobson series cost \$507.00 (\$445 to people; \$425 film and shipping; \$20 printing; \$62 discussion sheets). Collections \$632.63. Money left over \$125.63. Book money has not been settled - we get 10%. There will be close to \$200 over cost. Ron Lorenz moved we give \$200 to the Rincon Indian Reservation. Ron Dixon seconded. The motion was unanimously passed. Ron Lorenz moved that we show the Powell films on a pass the hat basis, provide free coffee and punch, leftover sums be left unspecified. Sue Boudreaux seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Bud Vedder asked if we should pay Fr. Bill for using the Church to show the films. Kevin said he felt we paid for use in our Sunday envelopes. Sue Smith said that one of the purposes of the films was to bring the community together. Bud Vedder asked if those who do not attend should support it. Jess Vance said that anyone having a wedding in Church will have to pay \$75.00. Sue Boudreaux asked that we table the issue and place it on the agenda for the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:20 P.M.

In my recent letter concerning the extension of no interest, it is for the fiscal year as stated. You definitely will be in a position to take on your full responsibilities of paying interest at that time.

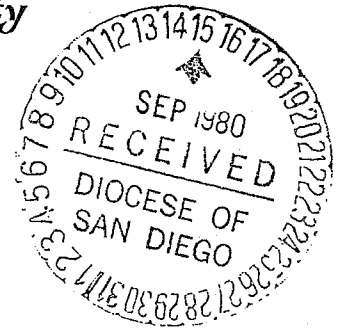

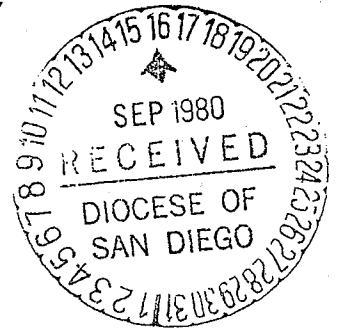

Dear Bishop Maher:

This is in reference to your letter of September 9, 1980. Having had two sleepless nights, I thought it necessary to write to you.

I came away from your office on Monday, September 8th, pleased that you had granted the request of no interest on the parish debt for another year. I had in mind your letter of October 10, 1979 which said, "I am relieving the Parish of San Rafael of its interest for a one-year period." I believed this relief would extend through October 1981, not June 30, 1981.

I cannot see our way clear to have our debt under \$800,000 by June 30, 1980. With \$2,000 from the Sunday collection each month and \$7,000 from pledges monthly, we can reduce the debt only \$81,000 by that time. If you charged 6% interest, we would only be able to pay the interest and practically nothing on the principal. I did not agree to pay the interest. I did say that we would be in a better financial condition.

I believe according to the records that San Rafael has not been found lacking in meeting its obligation. If the Diocese had bought land ten years earlier, we would not have had to begin with such a heavy debt for land. In six years we have paid off over half a million dollars. For 650 families I think this is a great accomplishment. So I believe you have nothing to fear. We will meet our financial obligations if given a little more time to bring the debt down. I also remember the Bishop telling me when we were working on the plans for the new church that he would not charge the parish interest until we had the debt reduced to \$500,000. Things do change but I think the spirit should remain.


Every effort will be made to reduce our debt as soon as possible. I beg you to give us until October 1981 before charging the parish interest. Otherwise the parish cannot pay a substantial amount on our indebtedness. I feel I am between a rock and a hard place. This is an uncomfortable feeling, and I am sure you did not have this in mind.

I would like you to look at the January calendar and schedule a time for us to meet, not in your office or home, but casually,

and speak as brother to brother. I need to say some things to you and receive some responses. Choose any day or time and I will be there. If I do not receive a definite time and date in January, I will have to accept the idea that you are not open to such an exchange with your brother priest. I hate to be so blunt and forceful, but I do want you know that I am serious.

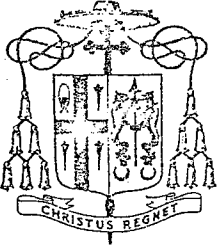

I would like two minutes of your time, to consider a little problem we have in our parish. During the past year we have reduced our parish debt by over \$100,000, paid our monthly assessment, etc. It would be to the advantage of the diocese and to you, Bishop, if you would extend your gracious generosity of no interest on our debt for another year. In that time, with God's help, we hope to be in a better position. If we are able to sell the old rectory and realize at least \$115,000 and continue to pay \$100,000 on the principal, by this time next year our debt should be under \$800,000. Our present debt is just over one million and five thousand dollars.

The parish continues to grow. August, which is a time we receive more families, we have grown by 40 families. Each Spring we continue to press for more new pledges for our church to reduce the debt. I am convinced that with understanding and a little time, we will be able to handle the interest and the principal without a problem. So I ask that you be patient with us, just a while longer. We will pay thee in full.

As you requested, I contacted Father Savord on this matter. Unfortunately, Father Savord is on vacation and will not return until July 24th. Therefore, I am unable to ascertain his opinion on this matter. However, since Miss Chino informs us that Father Savord suggested she write to you, I think it is safe to assume he supports her request.

I telephoned _____, and talked with her. She seemed "put-off" by my asking the requisite questions. As is true in so many of the cases, she had been given bad information. She presumed that her simple request would be honored because it was "her" wedding.

Miss Chino gave me the following information:

- 1) It was her spontaneous idea to seek this permission;
- 2) She shares in the Roman Catholic belief on Transubstantiation;
- 3) Since the wedding will take place in the Catholic Church, it would be morally impossible for her to seek the sacrament from her own Lutheran Minister;
- 4) There is no danger of scandal because both her Catholic and Lutheran friends affirm her desire to receive Holy Communion. Furthermore, the groom's parents, who are practicing Catholics, also affirm her desire.

Canonically, it seems the requirements have been met for the granting of this privilege. However, since _____ is unable to accept the Catholic faith in its totality, I would remind her of the unique and extraordinary nature of this privilege and caution her against any possible abuse in the future.


Please be informed of our latest preliminary cost analysis, which has been based on the data gathered and plans agreed to at our last meeting of 13 February 1978.

These costs, when added, total \$754,112.40 as the cost of the project and thus shows an increase of the \$700,000.00 budget limit to be \$54,112.40.

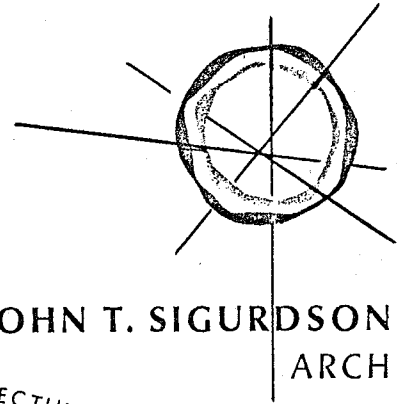

You suggested at a brief meeting with you in your office on October 21st, that I write the results of our meeting with the Bishop to the Building Committee.

The architect, Mr. John Sigurdson and his associate, Mr. Rod Higgins and myself met with Bishop Leo T. Maher on October 21, 1977. I gave the report of the success of our building fund drive; \$452,000. in pledges over a 3 year period, 5 years for the larger gifts. We hope to have another \$100,000 pledged within the year. Mr. John Sigurdson showed the Bishop the preliminary plans the community of San Rafael is hoping to build, which included, the parish center, (hall) and the church. The Bishop stated that building both facilities at this time would be too big a financial burden on the parish and on the pastor at this time. He suggested we build the church first and perhaps use it as a parish center until one can be built. He continued that the church should seat at least 750, for Rancho Bernardo is projected to be a community of 40,000. He urged us to get started as soon as possible as building costs are continuing to rise daily.

The architect and his associate and myself meet with Father Dennis Krause on November 1st to consider the appointments, the feeling of community, people around the altar, and the type of architecture that might best suit our worship. We were all pleased with Father Dennis Krause's explanation and feel we learned alot.

Dear Father Savord:

I have composed several letters to you since we were first advised of our inclusion in your parish. None seemed to say exactly what I intended. I have considered commenting on the bad faith and dishonesty with which this entire affair has been handled. It is sufficient to say that if one can't believe one's clergy and their bishop, there are few we can trust.

My current concern is the tone of your recent letters. I have lost count of the number of epistles we have received from you, but not one has been free of a plea for money.

I have spent most of my working years working for the Church so I do understand the need for money. I have never sympathized with those that say the Church is only interested in money. I am now beginning to understand their feelings.

Never have I felt so angry as I do at the tone of your letters and each gets worse. Now we are told for two consecutive weeks that you don't really care if we come to your church, just send the money.

I will have to work out for myself just what I feel are my moral obligations to your parish. I see many things within the Church much more deserving. However, when and if I feel I have some obligation to St. Rafael Parish it can never be the same type of obligation I have previously made to my parish. Until now I have always felt that I came first and my wallet a distant second. How things have changed.

You speak of community, Father. On what is it built? Trust, love and understanding or fancy rhetoric and not so veiled threats. I feel, my brother, that never again will I see a more perfect example of the moneychangers in the temple. I pray that God deals with you gently for the great harm you are doing to His Church.

On Monday, June 10, 1974, at 1:00 P. M., the following priests met in accordance with your instructions to establish parish boundaries for the new parish created out of Rancho Penasquitos and Rancho San Bernardo West. The group was composed of the Rev. Jeremiah Murphy, pastor of St. Mary's Church, Escondido; the Rev. Michael Coughlan, pastor of St. Michael's Church, Poway; the Rev. William A. Kraft, pastor of the Church of the Good Shepherd, Mira Mesa; the Rev. William Savord, the newly appointed pastor for Penasquitos; the Rev. John Rhatigan, the representative of the Diocesan building committee, and myself as your Vicar.

At the outset of the meeting, Father Kraft asked to make an opening statement, the summation of which is as follows: "I have not asked the Bishop or Chancery for establishment of this new parish, nor do I feel that it is needed." None of the other priests had any desire to make a statement on the matter. Following are the boundaries that were agreed upon by all members:

The East boundary will be Highway 15, otherwise known as Escondido Freeway; the North boundary line will be the southern bank of Lake Hodges; the West boundary will begin at Lake Hodges and go south along Black Mountain Road to where Black Mountain Road joins Carmel Valley and into Carmel Valley to where the proposed new freeway from Highway 5 to Highway 15 joins Carmel Valley and Black Mountain Road; the said proposed new freeway to constitute the Southern boundary and the boundary line between Rancho Penasquitos and Mira Mesa.

The financial report of July 74 published by the Southern Cross states that over \$100,000. was set aside for new parishes. We of San Rafael wish to apply for the amount of \$100,000. without interest.

We also need a letter from you sanctioning our asking pastors of parishes with funds on deposit in the chancery, to transfer monies to San Rafael's account. Or would the Bishop be so kind as to contact the pastors himself?

We have contacted the following pastors who are willing to help San Rafael get started: They would like official approval;

Holy Rosary, Msgr. John Bland-	would give \$10,000.
St. Francis de Sales, Msgr. Peter Lynch	20,000.
St. Joseph's Barstow, Fr. Wm. Hart	?
Mary Star of the Sea, Msgr. Gilfillan	?
Star of the Sea Msgr. Bill Clavin	?
St. Mary's Fr. Jerry Murphy	?

We have asked Father Michael Coughlan for \$40,000 with no response, the same goes for Sacred Heart in Redlands.

Having discussed property with the men of this parish, all agree we need financial help from the diocese. Property is now valued at \$40,000 per acre. San Rafael needs the start that was given to St. Anthony's in Upland, \$100,000. and the land paid for. These people have helped to build both Good Shepherd and St. Michael parishes and feel in justice they have a right to ask for help.

San Rafael is a 2 community parish 4 miles apart. Penasquitos has a 60% renters with government subsidized housing. Westwood is an integral part of Rancho Bernardo. All the people are upset over the division. They will not go to Penasquitos for the 9:30 or 11:00 o'clock Masses. Penasquitos will not come to Westwood for Mass at 8:00 a.m. Westwood people still go to St. Michael's because it is more convenient. Some of the people of Penasquitos go to Good Shepherd or Miramar base chapel. So both communities are vastly different.

As far as property is concerned we have contacted MR. James Kerr, president of the board of Avco, by phone and by letter with no result. We have made inquiries of the Teamsters through Charles Rizzo of Penasquitos with the same result.

We are serving the people of God with 4 weekend Masses, with confessions available before each Mass. We have about 600 for Sunday Mass. We have a daily Mass at 8 a.m. at the rectory with an average attendance of 15. We have CCD classes in both communities with 185 grade school, 45 for high school and 41 in St. Michael's School. WE have had 5 baptisms and 1 funeral. WE are encouraging neighborhood (block) parties. We have plans for a parish get-together.

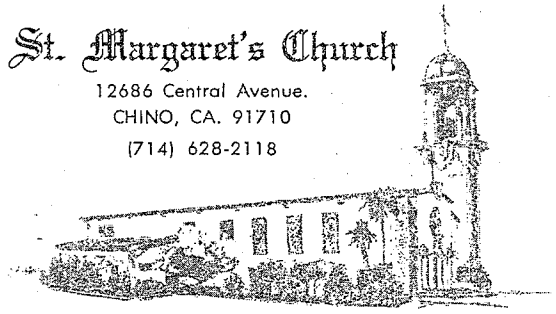

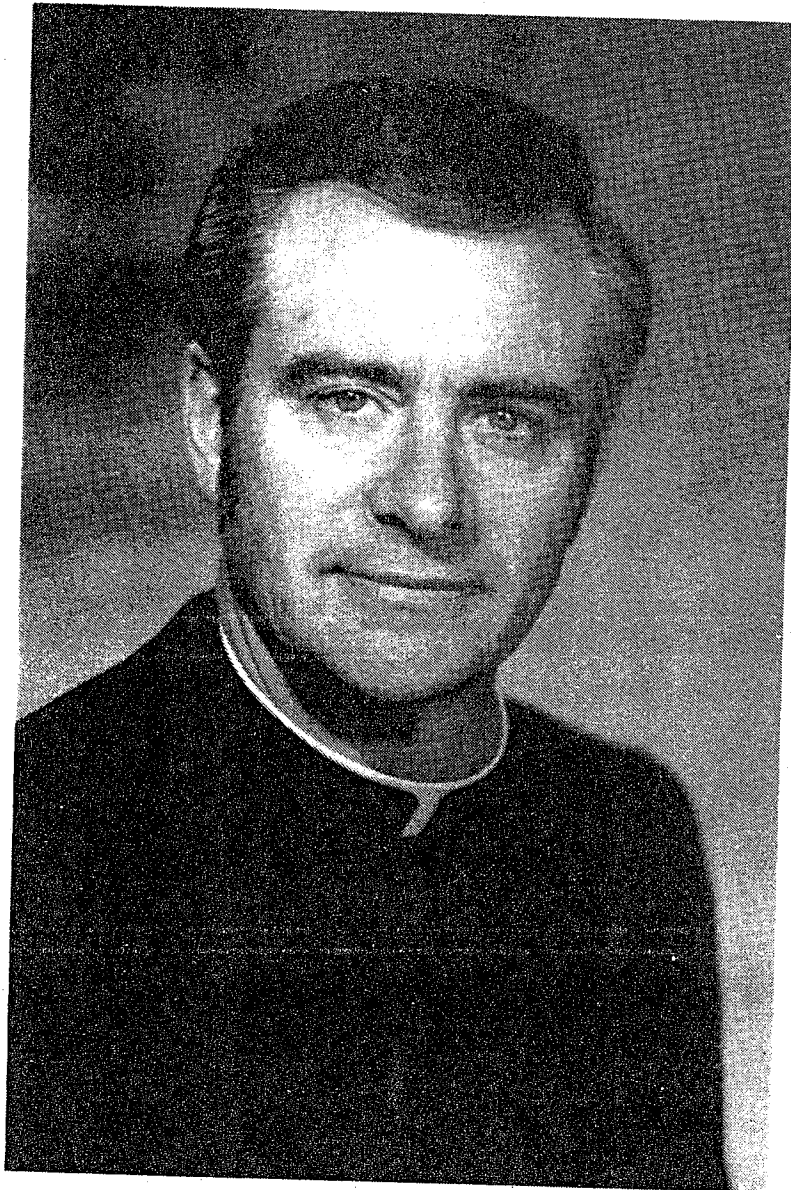



We are indebted to these communities and their pastors, especially those priests God has called to their rest: John Bland and John Baer.

The pledge fund drive took place under the leadership of General Howard Schiltz (retired) and Mr. Ted O'Connor. They had many workers who collected \$420,000 in pledges from 200 families. This gave us the sign I needed to go ahead with our building plans. The land finally cleared Escrow January, 1978.

Ground breaking took place on Pentecost Sunday, and Mothers Day, May 4, 1978. There was much wind in the place. I'm sure the Holy Spirit was with us. Construction had to wait until February, 1979. Mr. Charles Noble, Jr. was General Contractor and Mr. John Sigurdson, Architect.

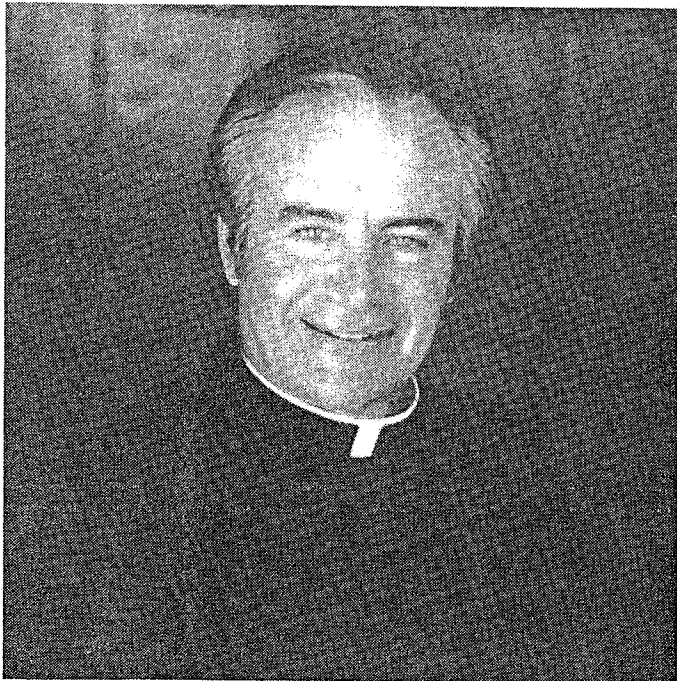

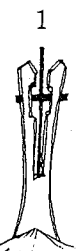

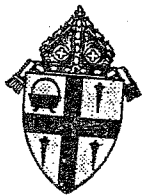

Dear Bill,

I would appreciate it if the personnel board would review at your next meeting the diocesan policy of suspending a priest's salary while he is hospitalized due to physical or mental illness. I feel this policy is very counterproductive to the rapid recovery of a priest who needs support and encouragement during a time of illness. Many times he can interpret it as a punitive measure. Most of our lay employees accumulate sick leave with pay and I think the same should be accorded to our priests.

The second area I ask that you discuss is an active board of arbitration for priests who feel that they have been removed from their assignment without a proper hearing. There may be good reasons for reassigning a priest, but I feel it is not good for the morale of the priests if they fear that they can be removed at any time without due process.

Thank you very much for your kind attention to these matters.

The Building Committee of the Diocese of San Diego held its regular meeting at 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, January 9, 1979 in the Conference Room of the Diocesan Office, San Diego, California.

OPENING OF MEETING

Rev. Msgr. I. Brent Eagen presided at the meeting with Suzanne Dinan acting as Secretary.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was introduced by Msgr. Galindo to approve the Minutes as mailed. The motion was seconded by Msgr. Young and unanimously passed.

SAN RAFAEL, RANCHO BERNARDO - PRESENTATION BY REV. WILLIAM SAVORD.

Msgr. Eagen advised the Committee that the bids for the new Church at San Rafael which were opened on December 5, 1978 had all been over \$1 million. The project had been estimated to be around \$750,000. After the bid opening, Father Savord and the architect, Mr. Sigurdson, had met with the low bidder, C. E. Larson, and he agreed to try to cut back in order to reduce the cost back to the \$750,000 - \$800,000 figure. Mr. Larson was only able to reduce the cost \$80,000. The bids were cancelled and Bishop Maher granted permission for Father Savord and Mr. Sigurdson to attempt to negotiate with another bidder in an effort to bring the construction cost in line with the \$800,000 estimate.

Father Savord and Mr. Sigurdson presented the Committee with a proposal from Charles D. Noble, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, which could reduce the cost of construction in the neighborhood of the original estimate. This proposal was reviewed by the Committee and it was their recommendation that the deletion of the performance bond not be considered as it is essential to both the Diocese and San Rafael Parish. The revised proposal amounts to \$853,745, plus \$57,000 for laminated beams which was not included in the original bid, but have been on order since November because of a 90-day delivery period, for a total construction cost of \$910,745. This figure does not include

ST. BRIGID, SAN DIEGO - PRESENTATION BY REV. LLOYD BOURGEOIS.

Father Bourgeois, together with his architect, Joseph Dameron, presented to the Committee preliminary plans for a new parish center to be constructed on the site of the old convent and rental property at St. Brigid's. A new parish center would include not only a parish hall, but Sister's Offices and new CCD facilities. Mr. Dameron received an estimate of cost of construction from Charles Noble Construction Company in the sum of \$726,878. The proposed center would have an area of 13,800 square feet, including attic storage space, and the hall would have a 450 person seating capacity. Parking does not present a problem as no off-street parking was required when the church was built and this center would be considered an extension of the church. Should parking become a problem in the future, there is space available for 97 parking spaces. The length of time for construction was estimated to be between five and six months.

Following discussion, a sub-committee was appointed composed of Father Healy, Father Lechner and Father Kraft, to review the plans in greater detail and report their findings to the Committee at its next meeting.

ST. RICHARD, BORREGO SPRINGS - LETTERS FROM REV. LAWRENCE GATT AND JOHN B. COGAN.

The Committee reviewed the letters of Father Gatt and Mr. Cogan, copies of which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. The letters requested direction from the Committee regarding the possibility of the sale of approximately 22 acres of unimproved land which was donated to the diocese for the benefit of St. Richard's during the summer of 1978. Following discussion, a motion was introduced by Father Kraft and seconded by Father Lechner to direct Mr. Crane to investigate the possibility of the diocese purchasing this land from St. Richard's and was subsequently carried.

ST. ELIZABETH SETON, CARLSBAD - LETTER FROM REV. FREDERICK FLOREK.

The Committee reviewed Father Florek's letter of February 12, 1979, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference. In that letter, Father Florek requests permission of the Building Committee to purchase a 2,000 square foot condominium for \$112,000. A motion was introduced by Father Kraft and seconded by Father McLaughlin to grant permission to purchase the condominium. The motion was subsequently carried, subject to further investigation by Mr. Crane regarding the possibilities of construction of a house similar to that proposed by Father Savord for Rancho Bernardo, Supra.

SAN RAFAEL, RANCHO BERNARDO - PRESENTATION BY REV. WILLIAM SAVORD.

Father Savord, together with Tony Garczynski, Contractor, presented to the Committee preliminary plans for a proposed rectory to be built at San Rafael. Site preparation would be relatively low cost as the area has previously been graded. The estimated cost of the rectory is \$120,000. The existing rectory could be sold for nearly the same amount. Mr. Garczynski stated that he was willing to build the rectory at his cost. The area of the proposed rectory is 3,500 square feet. The estimated cost includes air conditioning, painting and floor tile. The cost would not include carpets or drapery. The design of the proposed rectory would complement that of the new church.

It is understood that one half of the money required to complete the Parish Community Center must be on hand upon beginning construction. It is our intent to raise this money by January 1985. This will be accomplished through additional projected families and a special fund drive. Our initial estimate to complete this project is \$500,000.00, leaving a required \$250,000.00. We are therefore requesting approval for a loan for the remaining \$250,000.00 in January 1985.

The original artist conception of the Community Center is attached. This is a preliminary plan and is provided for your information at this time.

Rancho Bernardo has grown significantly and is expected to continue to grow. By 1985, we expect to have 1,000 families in San Rafael Parish. The need for a community center in two years will be essential to strengthen our Christian Community.

We respectfully submit this request for your consideration and approval.

of the Church. Utility stub-ups for the future parish hall were also run at that time. The proposed structure will be located in a greenbelt area and will not impact existing parking. Nor should any additional parking requirements be necessary.

Based on the above considerations, we feel that a budget of \$54/square foot for 9,096, or \$491,184 would be adequate at today's costs. Allowing for an 8% per year increase in costs, a target price of \$573,000 for construction in 1985 is realistic.

Dear Bishop Maher:

I have examined and tested Father William Savord over the past several weeks and now feel that I can write to you regarding his personality and his experience which occurred with a family in his former parish of San Rafael. Father Savord promptly contacted my office after you had made your request for him to see me, and although we had some difficulty in finding a time for us to meet, we did so and then promptly set up an evaluation and testing program.

I am pleased to tell you that Father Savord has been most cooperative and willing although initially he was uncomfortable and understandably upset about the need for such an examination. His response to the family problem and to your request was well within normal range and my examination of him has proven equally normal.

Father Savord unwittingly was caught up in a very troubled family that had very serious problems. As the pastor of his community, he made every reasonable attempt to be helpful and provide normal pastoral care to this very troubled family. It is clear from his report that all three members of that family have significant psychopathology and that he was manipulated in a way which has caused serious personal distress to himself and caused embarrassment and concern for yourself. I am thoroughly convinced that Father Savord has behaved properly and with pastoral concern for all three members of that family but should have recognized the serious nature of this family's difficulties and referred them for appropriate therapy. Father Savord reports that he had made significant efforts to get the father to seek professional help but the father did not comply with his wishes.

My examination of Father Savord consisted of several interviews which went into his childhood, adolescence, seminary training and early adulthood up to the present so that I could understand him as an individual and as a priest here in the San Diego Diocese. To corroborate my clinical findings I administered the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory test to him and had my colleague Richard W. Lewak explain the findings to Father Savord. His findings did indeed substantiate my own clinical findings.

Father Savord's ministry has been basically clear and straight forward. He has been a pastor here in the San Diego Diocese for twenty years and has won the love and affection of his parishoners and colleagues. He is seen by them

as a competent person and a caring priest.

To be accused of being sexually involved with a younger man and to be publicly humiliated and hounded as he was by the father of this young man was a particularly painful and humiliating experience for Father Savord. His character is such that he makes strenuous efforts to achieve respect. This characteristic is obviously well suited for a priest and the lay person wants to respect a person in such a position. His ways of dealing with colleagues and parishoners tends to make him a bit aloof and he may appear to be a bit distant or uncaring. But because of his inner need to have respect and appear in a positive light, his natural tendency is to behave appropriately and with great caution in any area that might cause him trouble.

His testing was well within normal limits. There is no evidence of any character disorder, neurosis, psychosis or organic brain syndrome.

He is obviously someone of bright intelligence and he shows no evidence of any deterioration in his mental abilities. Specifically, there is no indication for Alzheimer's disease.

Father Savord's way of dealing with strong feelings tends to lead him to over control his feelings which often times leads to problems with alcohol or drugs. Fortunately this has never been a problem for Father Savord and he shows no signs or symptoms of drug or alcohol abuse.

I would encourage Father Savord to make use of his support group in dealing with the natural feelings that develop in a person who leads a life without intimacy. The natural need for all individuals is to have close, warm supportive relationships which are helpful when in times of need. Father Savord has been very careful in his relationships with women and other parishoners so that he does not have the kind of emotional and psychological support that he may need when in crisis. His relationships with his parishoners and fellow priests are normal but are not the kind of relationships that one can depend on when in significant need. The concept of support groups would be particularly appropriate for Father Savord and I've encouraged him to develop the kind of warm, close supportive relationships within the group that would meet those needs should they occur.

In summary I have found no significant psychopathology in Father Savord. I believe that he was a victim of a very disturbed family, particularly the father, and had not been aware of the serious nature of that individual's problems. I feel that your continued trust and faith in Father Savord is justified and I predict that you will have no cause to regret this confidence.

If Father Savord should have further need for psychiatric services, I've suggested that he contact me. Thank you for your confidence in referring Father Savord to me.

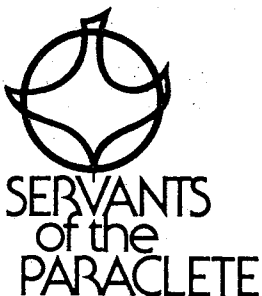

Reason for Referral:

Bill is a 59 year old man who is a priest with the Diocese of San Diego, CA. For the past six years, however, he has been working in the San Bernardino Diocese, and he is referred to Guadalupe Center for evaluation by the Bishop of San Bernardino Diocese. This referral follows allegations by a boy who is now 17 that Bill had sexually molested him when he was about 11 years old. This apparently came out when the boy was undergoing psychiatric hospitalization and care. Bill admits to this involvement and says it took place during a week when he had taken the boy with him on a vacation. He says that he apologized to the boy in writing and made him read the apology out loud. He has kept up contact with the boy and his family through letters and visits since that time but says that no further sexual involvement has taken place. He has also established a trust fund for the boy and says he puts away money every month.

These incidents took place just as Bill was moving from the Diocese of San Diego (the boy is from that Diocese). The move had been precipitated by another sexual encounter. In this case he had made sexual advances to a 23 year old man. The young man was still living at home and told his parents who immediately reported it to the Bishop. The father threatened Bill and he eventually he was forced to leave the Diocese. He states that he had a psychiatric evaluation at the time and that he saw a priest-psychologist for a period of time with whom he was able to talk about both incidents. He now sees these incidents as an attempt on his part to gain intimacy, closeness and love and says he now recognizes how inappropriate and dangerous that was. He also says that he did not realize the seriousness of what he was doing at the time. He reports no other sexual involvements either before or after these two.

Social History: Bill was born in Michigan, the second oldest of seven children. His mother was only 16 when she had her first child and there were problems between the parents including physical abuse by the father of the mother who would frequently abandon the family after such incidents. They were finally separated when Bill was about 7 or 8 and the children spent time in an orphanage because the father could not care for them. They were quite poor and Bill's father worked for WPA and as a lumber jack. Bill went to the minor seminary with the help of his pastor

even though his father was opposed to it. He did not reveal his family situation until first theology when he was asked directly about it. He says he enjoyed high school but was almost kicked out for "particular friendships." After first theology he was told he should not return to the seminary but was not given the reasons. The Bishop of the neighboring Diocese, who was a friend of Bill's pastor, helped him to find out the reasons and to counter them. According to Bill, these reasons included the fact that his sister was institutionalized and that his mother had been in a mental institution. He got letters to the effect that his sister was not institutionalized for moral problems and that his mother was not insane. This Bishop also helped him to find another Bishop that would take him, and it is at this point that Bill moved to the Diocese of San Diego.

Bill says that he has enjoyed his life as a Priest and that he feels he has done a good job. He feels his strengths are in terms of getting things done, getting projects moving and completed and also in liturgy, while his weaknesses, according to his report, are in terms of being diplomatic or dealing with people who disagree with him. He also feels he can become a "workaholic." He enjoys golf, has a group of friends with whom he socializes and has belonged to priest support groups. He lists many interests, particularly in the arts and feels that he is ready to retire and get away from the tensions and frustrations of full-time ministry. He states that if he retires he would seek part-time work either in ministry, or in some other form, to supplement his retirement.

Interview impressions: Bill is cooperative with the interview and testing procedures, but seems to resent having to be put through all of this. My impression is that he tends to minimize the problem he is facing and the seriousness of what he has done. He does not seem to be experiencing much anxiety or discomfort and seems to be able to put unpleasantness aside. He is not the kind of person who suffers a great deal and is not oriented toward identifying with the suffering of others. He has difficulty identifying his feelings or empathetically identifying those of others when asked. He does not seem to be worried that charges will be brought against him, but he has consulted a lawyer.

Results of Testing:

On the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator, Bill does not commit himself to any clear preference in terms of introversion vs. extraversion or in terms of the type of perception he favors, sensation or intuition. He is, however highly oriented toward judging and ordering the world rather than seeing it and understanding it as it exists, and he tends to do this judging on the basis of thinking as opposed to feeling. He would tend to be highly individualistic, somewhat rigid in his views and would tend to drive others and himself. In addition he would tend to be logical, critical, decisive, determined and often stubborn. He would tend to be good at reorganization and executive types of work. Feeling would be a poorly developed function and, as a

result, he would tend to ignore the views and feelings of others, especially those who did not agree with him. He would also not be oriented toward his own feelings and would tend not to know what he needed or how he felt about things. The fact that it does not appear that he has a well-developed auxiliary function suggests that he may have great difficulty seeing and considering pitfalls and problems as they are about to occur. He would have difficulty criticizing his own ideas or taking criticism or direction from others. He would tend to keep his own vision intact and be unaffected by the views or input of those around him.

The MMPI validity scales indicate that Bill produced a valid profile with a tendency to minimize problems. He shows a moderate defensiveness against showing psychological weakness and a tendency to lack self-criticism. He has a good self-image and a strong sense of self. He feels capable of handling his life and he is free of disabling anxiety and depression. There is, however, an indication of underlying chronic, intense anger and resentment of which he may or may not be aware. His profile is one which is clearly associated with brief periods of acting out, often in a sexual manner, followed by periods of remorse and guilt. This tends to be a repeating pattern which is very difficult to break and which is not particularly responsive to psychotherapy.

The Rorschach, again, suggests a generally defensive psychological stance. It suggests a difficulty in sharing on a feeling level and a tendency to be quite out of touch with feelings both in himself and others. He shows a good intellectual level of ability and good creativity, but a limited self-criticism and self-examination. As was suggested on the MBTI, Bill seems to not let the limitations or circumstances of the outer world modify or limit his vision. This would, of course, tend to lead to judgment problems on some levels if taken to an extreme.

The Edwards Personal Preference Schedule also suggests that Bill is not related well to his own feelings and needs. He produces a somewhat ambivalent profile which is typical of someone who either is not sure of how they feel about things or is trying to appear socially acceptable in terms of their feelings. His very highest need is the need to observe, analyze and understand others, to predict their behavior, actions and feelings. He also shows a very high need for order as might be expected given the results of the MBTI. Bill also shows a moderately high need for affiliation, which means that he tends to like to have a wide circle of acquaintances with whom he does things and that he would like participating in friendly groups, doing things with others rather than alone. He also is reporting a moderate sense of guilt and embarrassment as well as a moderately high need to gain succorance for himself.

Summary of Testing:

None of the testing indicates the presence of serious underlying psychopathology, disabling anxiety or major depressive processes. Bill is moderately defensive in testing and tends to

have difficulty admitting to psychological weaknesses. He appears to lack insight into the feeling aspect of his life and into the origins and consequences of his behavior. He is logical, decisive and single-minded and would tend to drive hard to reach a goal. He has a weakness in terms of ability to perceive the cues in the world around him that would indicate a need to modify his own direction, plans or goals. As a result he might tend not to see trouble that was about to happen. Finally, his testing does suggest that he is, psychologically, still in a pattern which could lead him into occasional acting out and that the internal mechanisms which might protect him against this are not present. He is not a good candidate for insight-oriented psychotherapy.

Recommendations:

Based on the above results, I am recommending that Bill seek an early retirement from active ministry. If it is necessary for him to earn extra money, I would recommend that he seek part-time work in administrative or executive positions rather than in any form of pastoral or sacramental ministry. I do not see any potential benefits from extended therapeutic programs or insight-oriented psychotherapy. Practical counseling regarding job-finding skills might be helpful for him.

Bill has a very high score in the category called Inquiring. High scorers on this scale appear to be "searchers" with a strongly intellectual orientation. They read widely in philosophy and are probably perceived by others as bright and competent. Their investigative bent and their appreciation for the complexities of a given question, however, make it difficult for them to commit themselves wholeheartedly to one side or another of an issue. The question of faith, therefore, is a very real one for many, probably because it inevitably involves a commitment of belief without compelling evidence.

The issue of commitment, which entails trusting something or someone greater than themselves causes tension in other areas as well. They are concerned about the future - who will take care of them in their retirement and whether or not they will have enough money. Although they function well in most capacities, they miss feeling intensely involved and excited about life. They probably feel lonely and wonder if they have chosen the right path in life.

These concerns sometimes coalesce into anger directed at God. They may feel betrayed or let down by God or misdirected by others, and thus even less likely to entrust themselves to someone else.

The spiritual challenge for high scorers focuses on commitment - the movement away from observation and information gathering to decision making and action. This involves both the risk of being wrong and of trusting in another. Their anger and frustration over their present situation can serve as a positive force providing the energy and drive for future growth.

Bill scores high on the category called Incarnational. People with a high placement on this scale tend to rely on their own feelings and awarenesses as guides to spirituality. In practice they favor an "incarnational" approach and place a high value on the body, the senses and physical exercise, which they consider integral to spiritual development.

Feelings enter into their spirituality as well. They usually derive great satisfaction from leading or participating in liturgies and services and often find this an uplifting emotional experience.

Darker emotions such as sorrow, repentance, anger or anxiety are notably absent and kept hidden. This raises the question of whether or not high scorers have generally resolved the major spiritual and personal issues in their lives or are merely enjoying a respite from them. There remains the possibility that they are not willing to admit their tension and dissatisfaction to others or themselves.

Their spiritual challenge is to integrate spirituality and to heed the promptings of their own nature and of grace - often manifested by feelings of discontent and dissatisfaction - which will lead them toward further spiritual development.

Finally, Bill scores high in the category called Relational Aridity. People who place high on this scale express considerable personal unhappiness. They are concerned about their level of self-esteem and do not seem to be receiving the kind of affirmation they need, either from friends and associates or from their work. Their mistrust of others makes it difficult to get close to enough people to receive validation and, as a result, they probably often feel lonely. They may doubt their own judgment and be fearful of both mental and physical illness. They also doubt their ability to have an impact on others, which reinforces their loneliness.

High scorers could benefit from a supportive environment provided by friends and associates rather than living and working in isolation. Their spiritual task is to break their isolation and take the risk of sharing with others their hopes as well as their fears and resentments.

Dear Bishop Maher:

I have examined and tested Father William Savord over the past several weeks and now feel that I can write to you regarding his personality and his experience which occurred with a family in his former parish of San Rafael. Father Savord promptly contacted my office after you had made your request for him to see me, and although we had some difficulty in finding a time for us to meet, we did so and then promptly set up an evaluation and testing program.

I am pleased to tell you that Father Savord has been most cooperative and willing although initially he was uncomfortable and understandably upset about the need for such an examination. His response to the family problem and to your request was well within normal range and my examination of him has proven equally normal.

Father Savord unwittingly was caught up in a very troubled family that had very serious problems. As the pastor of his community, he made every reasonable attempt to be helpful and provide normal pastoral care to this very troubled family. It is clear from his report that all three members of that family have significant psychopathology and that he was manipulated in a way which has caused serious personal distress to himself and caused embarrassment and concern for yourself. I am thoroughly convinced that Father Savord has behaved properly and with pastoral concern for all three members of that family but should have recognized the serious nature of this family's difficulties and referred them for appropriate therapy. Father Savord reports that he had made significant efforts to get the father to seek professional help but the father did not comply with his wishes.

My examination of Father Savord consisted of several interviews which went into his childhood, adolescence, seminary training and early adulthood up to the present so that I could understand him as an individual and as a priest here in the San Diego Diocese. To corroborate my clinical findings I administered the Minnesota Multiphasic Personality Inventory test to him and had my colleague Richard W. Lewak explain the findings to Father Savord. His findings did indeed substantiate my own clinical findings.

SAVORD-RCBSD 0170

Father Savord's ministry has been basically clear and straight forward. He has been a pastor here in the San Diego Diocese for twenty years and has won the love and affection of his parishoners and colleagues. He is seen by them

as a competent person and a caring priest.

To be accused of being sexually involved with a younger man and to be publicly humiliated and hounded as he was by the father of this young man was a particularly painful and humiliating experience for Father Savord. His character is such that he makes strenuous efforts to achieve respect. This characteristic is obviously well suited for a priest and the lay person wants to respect a person in such a position. His ways of dealing with colleagues and parishioners tends to make him a bit aloof and he may appear to be a bit distant or uncaring. But because of his inner need to have respect and appear in a positive light, his natural tendency is to behave appropriately and with great caution in any area that might cause him trouble.

His testing was well within normal limits. There is no evidence of any character disorder, neurosis, psychosis or organic brain syndrome.

He is obviously someone of bright intelligence and he shows no evidence of any deterioration in his mental abilities. Specifically, there is no indication for Alzheimer's disease.

Father Savord's way of dealing with strong feelings tends to lead him to over control his feelings which often times leads to problems with alcohol or drugs. Fortunately this has never been a problem for Father Savord and he shows no signs or symptoms of drug or alcohol abuse.

I would encourage Father Savord to make use of his support group in dealing with the natural feelings that develop in a person who leads a life without intimacy. The natural need for all individuals is to have close, warm supportive relationships which are helpful when in times of need. Father Savord has been very careful in his relationships with women and other parishioners so that he does not have the kind of emotional and psychological support that he may need when in crisis. His relationships with his parishioners and fellow priests are normal but are not the kind of relationships that one can depend on when in significant need. The concept of support groups would be particularly appropriate for Father Savord and I've encouraged him to develop the kind of warm, close supportive relationships within the group that would meet those needs should they occur.

In summary I have found no significant psychopathology in Father Savord. I believe that he was a victim of a very disturbed family, particularly the father, and had not been aware of the serious nature of that individual's problems. I feel that your continued trust and faith in Father Savord is justified and I predict that you will have no cause to regret this confidence.

If Father Savord should have further need for psychiatric services, I've suggested that he contact me. Thank you for your confidence in referring Father Savord to me.
