

# Requiem Mass Is Said in Utica For Father Clark

Services for the Rev. Henry Clark, 56, who died last Thursday in Albuquerque, N. M., were conducted yesterday at St. Agnes Church in Utica. Burial was in the church cemetery.

Father Clark served in several Syracuse churches before assuming duties in Utica and New Mexico. At his death, he was assistant pastor of St. Ann's Church in Santa Fe, N. M.

A solemn Pontifical requiem Mass was celebrated by Most Rev. Walter A. Foley, D. D., bishop of Syracuse. Other officers of the Mass were archpriest, the Rev. Msgr. Luke V.
