Departure Ceremony Set

PASSAIC — A departure ceremony will be held Sept. 13 at Mt. Carmel Church here for Rev. Eugene J. Catanzaro, O.S.F.S., who will leave Sept. 18 for missionary work in Brazil.

Father Catanzaro is a graduate of Pope Pius High School and entered the Congregation of the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales in 1946. He completed his theological studies at Catholic University and was ordained in June, 1954, at Washington, D.C.

Father Catanzaro's assignments have been at Salesian High School, Detroit; DeSales High School, Lockport, N.Y. Judge Memorial High School, Salt Lake City, Utah, and Salesianum High School, Wilmington, Del.

During the past few summers, Father Catanzaro has been studying for his doctoral degree in political science at Notre Dame, Pennsylvania University and Fordham. He received a special grant for studies at John Carroll University in 1956 and was awarded a fellowship for special studies in journalism at Fordham in 1962.

Father Catanzaro is now studying Portugese, the language of Brazil, at Columbia University.
